B. 2759 2 3 (By Delegates Staggers, Perry, Phillips, L., Phillips, R., Tomblin, Stowers, Eldridge, Moye, 4 Poling, M., Marcum and White) 5 6 7 [Introduced February 27, 2013; referred to the 8 Committee on Health and Human Resources then Finance.] 9 10 A BILL to amend and reenact \$16-4C-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 11 1931, as amended, relating to standards for emergency medical 12 service personnel; and providing that no fees be charged to certify or recertify an Emergency Medical Technician - Miner. 13 14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 15 That §16-4C-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, 16 be amended and reenacted to read as follows: 17 ARTICLE 4C. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACT. 18 §16-4C-8. Standards for emergency medical service personnel. 19 (a) Every ambulance operated by an emergency medical service 20 agency shall carry at least two personnel. At least one person 21 shall be certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or first aid 22 and the person in the patient compartment shall be certified as an 23 emergency medical technician-basic at a minimum except that in the 24 case of a specialized multipatient medical transport, only one 25 staff person is required and that person shall be certified, at a

1 minimum, at the level of an emergency medical technician-basic. 2 The requirements of this subsection will remain in effect until 3 revised by the legislative rule to be promulgated pursuant to 4 subsection (b) of this section.

5 (b) On or before May 28, 2010, the commissioner shall submit 6 a proposed legislative rule to the Emergency Medical Services 7 Advisory Council for review, and on or before June 30, 2010, shall 8 file the proposed legislative rule with the office of the Secretary 9 of State, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 10 twenty-nine-a, article three of this code, to establish 11 certification standards for emergency medical vehicle operators and 12 to revise the requirements for emergency medical service personnel. (c) As of the effective date of the legislative rule to be 13 14 promulgated pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, emergency 15 medical service personnel who operate ambulances shall meet the 16 requirements set forth in the legislative rule.

17 (d) Any person desiring emergency medical service personnel 18 certification shall apply to the commissioner using forms and 19 procedures prescribed by the commissioner. Upon receipt of the 20 application, the commissioner shall determine whether the applicant 21 meets the certification requirements and may examine the applicant, 22 if necessary to make that determination.

23 (e) The applicant shall submit to a national criminal 24 background check, the requirement of which is declared to be not

1 against public policy.

2 (1) The applicant shall meet all requirements necessary to 3 accomplish the national criminal background check, including 4 submitting fingerprints, and authorizing the West Virginia Office 5 of Emergency Medical Services, the West Virginia State Police and 6 the Federal Bureau of Investigation to use all records submitted 7 and produced for the purpose of screening the applicant for 8 certification.

9 (2) The results of the national criminal background check may 10 not be released to or by a private entity.

11 (3) The applicant shall submit a fee of \$75 for initial 12 certification and a fee of \$50 for recertification: *Provided*, That 13 <u>no fees may be charged for the certification or recertification of</u> 14 <u>an Emergency Medical Technician - Miner</u>. The fees set forth in this 15 subsection remain in effect until modified by legislative rule.

(f) An application for an original, renewal or temporary medical service personnel certificate or emergency medical services agency license, shall be acted upon by the commissioner and the certificate or license delivered or mailed, or a copy of any order of the commissioner denying any such application delivered or mailed to the applicant, within fifteen days after the date upon which the complete application including test scores and background checks, if applicable, was received by the commissioner.

1 (g) Any person may report to the commissioner or the Director 2 of the Office of Emergency Medical Services information he or she 3 may have that appears to show that a person certified by the 4 commissioner may have violated the provisions of this article or 5 legislative rules promulgated pursuant to this article. A person 6 who is certified by the commissioner, who knows of or observes 7 another person certified by the commissioner violating the 8 provisions of this article or legislative rules promulgated 9 pursuant to this article, has a duty to report the violation to the 10 commissioner or director. Any person who reports or provides 11 information in good faith is immune from civil liability.

(h) The commissioner may issue a temporary emergency medical service personnel certificate to an applicant, with or without examination of the applicant, when he or she finds that issuance to be in the public interest. Unless suspended or revoked, a fetemporary certificate shall be valid initially for a period not revoked in the public twenty days and may not be renewed unless the commissioner finds the renewal to be in the public interest.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish that no fee be charged for the certification or recertification of Emergency Medical Technician - Miner.
