



1 convicted felons who have, or might have, access to financial,  
2 medical or other confidential information relating to patients or  
3 clients of that employer.

4 (b) A person, as that term is defined by section two, article  
5 one-a of this chapter, who is a convicted felon is prohibited from  
6 holding employment in a position that gives, or might give, him or  
7 her access to financial, medical or other confidential information  
8 relating to patients or clients of his or her employer.

9 (c) The Commissioner of Labor is authorized to propose rules  
10 for legislative approval in accordance with article three, chapter  
11 twenty-nine-a of this code necessary to effectuate this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to prohibit convicted felons from holding employment positions that provide them with access to medical, financial or other confidential information of clients or patients of the employer. The bill authorizes rule-making.

This article is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
