



- 1 (1) Standards and requirements for licenses, permits,  
2 certificates and registrations;
- 3 (2) Procedures for examinations and reexaminations: Provided,  
4 That examinations for cosmetologists shall be given in a language  
5 that the testing vendor offers;
- 6 (3) Requirements for third parties to prepare and/or  
7 administer examinations and reexaminations;
- 8 (4) Educational and experience requirements;
- 9 (5) The passing grade on the examinations;
- 10 (6) Standards for approval of courses and curriculum;
- 11 (7) Procedures for the issuance and renewal of licenses,  
12 permits, certificates and registrations;
- 13 (8) A fee schedule;
- 14 (9) Continuing education requirements for professional

- 19 (11) Designating the regions for investigators/inspectors;

5       (b) All of the board's rules in effect on July 1, 2009, shall  
6 remain in effect until they are amended or repealed, and references  
7 to provisions of former enactments of this article are interpreted  
8 to mean provisions of this article.

9       (c) The board is authorized to file an emergency rule for the  
10 implementation of its fee schedule in 2009.
