13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That \$18C-3-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 3. HEALTH PROFESSIONALS STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS.
17	§18C-3-3. Health sciences scholarship program Health sciences
18	<pre>service program; establishment; administration;</pre>
19	eligibility.
20	(a) Legislative findings The Legislature finds that there
21	is a critical need for additional practicing health care
22	professionals in West Virginia. Therefore, there is hereby created
23	a health sciences scholarship program <u>health sciences service</u>
24	<pre>program to be administered by the vice chancellor for health</pre>

- 1 sciences. The purpose of this program is to provide an incentive
- 2 for health professional students to complete their training and
- 3 provide primary care in underserved areas of West Virginia.
- 4 (b) Establishment of special account. -- There is hereby
- 5 established continued a special revolving fund account under the
- 6 higher education policy commission in the State Treasury to be
- 7 known as the "Health Sciences Scholarship Fund" that shall be used
- 8 to carry out the purposes of this section. The fund shall consist
- 9 of one or more of the following:
- 10 (1) All unexpended health sciences scholarship funds on
- 11 deposit in the State Treasury on the effective date of this
- 12 section:
- 13 (2) Appropriations as may be provided by the Legislature;
- 14 (3) Repayments, including interest as set by the vice
- 15 chancellor for health sciences, collected from scholarship program
- 16 award recipients who fail to practice or teach in West Virginia
- 17 under the terms of the scholarship program award agreement as set
- 18 forth under this section or the health sciences scholarship program
- 19 previously established by this section; or
- 20 (4) Amounts that may become available from other sources.
- 21 Balances remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year
- 22 shall not expire or revert to the general revenue. All costs
- 23 associated with the administration of this section shall be paid
- 24 from the Health Sciences Scholarship Fund under the direction of

- 1 the vice chancellor for health sciences.
- 2 (c) Eligibility requirements. -- An individual is eligible
- 3 for consideration for a health sciences scholarship health sciences
- 4 <u>service program award</u> if the individual:
- 5 (1) Either:
- 6 (A) Is a fourth-year medical student at the Marshall
- 7 University School of Medicine, West Virginia School of Osteopathic
- 8 Medicine or West Virginia University School of Medicine who has
- 9 been accepted in a primary care internship/residency program in
- 10 West Virginia; or
- 11 (B) Is enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an approved
- 12 education program at a West Virginia institution leading to a
- 13 degree or certification in the field of nurse practitioner, nurse
- 14 midwife, physician assistant, physical therapist, doctoral clinical
- 15 psychologist, licensed independent clinical social worker, or other
- 16 disciplines identified as shortage fields by the vice chancellor
- 17 for health sciences; and
- 18 (2) Signs an agreement to practice for at least two years in
- 19 an underserved area of West Virginia. as determined by the bureau
- 20 for public health. An individual also is eliqible for
- 21 consideration for a health sciences scholarship health sciences
- 22 <u>service program award</u> if the individual is pursuing a master's
- 23 degree in nursing and signs an agreement to teach at least two
- 24 years for a school of nursing located in West Virginia, as may be

- 1 determined by the vice chancellor for health sciences, after
- 2 receiving her or his master's degree. Awarding preference will be
- 3 given to West Virginia residents.
- 4 (d) Scholarship awards <u>Program awards.</u> -- Scholarships
- 5 Program awards shall be in the amount of set by the Higher
- 6 Education Policy Commission of at least \$20,000 for medical
- 7 students and at least \$10,000 for all others and may be awarded by
- 8 the vice chancellor for health sciences, with the advice of an
- 9 advisory panel, from the pool of all applicants with a commitment
- 10 to practice in an underserved area of West Virginia. as determined
- 11 by the bureau for public health. Nothing herein shall be construed
- 12 as granting or guaranteeing any applicant any right to such a
- 13 scholarship program award.
- 14 (e) Repayment provisions. -- A scholarship program award
- 15 recipient who fails to practice in an underserved area of West
- 16 Virginia within six months of the completion of his or her
- 17 training, who fails to complete his or her training or who fails to
- 18 complete the required teaching is in breach of contract and is
- 19 liable for repayment of the total scholarship amount received plus
- 20 interest program award and any accrued interest. The granting or
- 21 renewal of a license to practice in West Virginia or to reciprocal
- 22 licensure in another state based upon licensure in West Virginia
- 23 shall be contingent upon beginning payment and continuing payment
- 24 until complete repayment of the total scholarship amount if the

- 1 recipient fails to practice in an underserved area program award
- 2 <u>and any accrued interest.</u> No license, renewal or reciprocity shall
- 3 be granted to persons whose repayments are in arrears. The
- 4 appropriate regulatory board shall inform all other states where a
- 5 recipient has reciprocated based upon West Virginia licensure of
- 6 any refusal to renew licensure in West Virginia as a result of
- 7 failure to repay the scholarship amount program award. This
- 8 provision shall be explained in bold type in the scholarship
- 9 program award contract. Repayment terms, not inconsistent with
- 10 this section, shall be established by the vice chancellor for
- 11 health sciences pursuant to rules as required under subsection (f)
- 12 of this section.
- 13 (f) Promulgation of rules. -- The Higher Education Policy
- 14 Commission shall promulgate rules pursuant to article three-a,
- 15 chapter twenty nine-a of this code necessary for the implementation
- 16 and administration of this section.
- 17 (g) Definitions. -- For purposes of the repayment provisions
- 18 of this section: the term
- 19 (1) "Training" means the entire degree program or
- 20 certification program for nurse midwives, nurse practitioners,
- 21 physician assistants, physical therapists, doctoral clinical
- 22 psychologists, licensed independent clinical social workers, and
- 23 other disciplines identified as shortage field by the vice
- 24 chancellor. The term also means the completion of a degree program

- 1 and includes completion of an approved residency/internship program
- 2 for students pursuing a degree in medicine or a degree in
- 3 osteopathy.
- 4 (2) "Underserved area" means any primary care health
- 5 professional shortage area located in the state as determined by
- 6 the Bureau for Public Health or any additional health professional
- 7 shortage area determined by the vice chancellor for health
- 8 sciences.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit a physical therapist, doctoral clinical psychologist, or licensed independent clinical social worker to apply for the health sciences service program.
