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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $$60-8-3$$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to licenses fees and general
12	restrictions on the sale of wines; and on limited occasions,
13	providing that a wine retailer may be licensed as a retail
14	dealer in nonintoxicating beer for the limited purpose of
15	selling nonintoxicating beer at the same festival or fair if
16	the sale of nonintoxicating beer is allowed by the festival or
17	fair.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That $$60-8-3$$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
20	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
21	ARTICLE 8. SALE OF WINES.
22	§60-8-3. Licenses; fees; general restrictions.
23	(a) No person may engage in business in the capacity of a

1 winery, farm winery, supplier, distributor, retailer, private wine
2 bed and breakfast, private wine restaurant, private wine spa or
3 wine specialty shop without first obtaining a license from the
4 commissioner, nor shall may a person continue to engage in any such
5 activity after his or her license has expired, been suspended or
6 revoked. No person may be licensed simultaneously as a distributor
7 and a retailer. No person, except for a winery or farm winery, may
8 be licensed simultaneously as a supplier and a retailer. No person
9 may be licensed simultaneously as a supplier and a private wine bed
10 and breakfast, private wine restaurant or a private wine spa. No
11 person may be licensed simultaneously as a distributor and a
12 private wine bed and breakfast, a private wine restaurant or a
13 private wine spa. No person may be licensed simultaneously as a
14 retailer and a private wine bed and breakfast, a private wine
15 restaurant or a private wine spa.

- 16 (b) The commissioner shall collect an annual fee for licenses
 17 issued under this article, as follows:
- 18 (1) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a supplier's 19 license;
- (2) Twenty-five hundred dollars per year for a distributor's license and each separate warehouse or other facility from which a distributor sells, transfers or delivers wine shall be separately licensed and there shall be collected with respect to each such location the annual license fee of \$2,500 as herein provided;

- 1 (3) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a retailer's 2 license;
- 3 (4) Two hundred fifty dollars per year for a wine specialty
 4 shop license, in addition to any other licensing fees paid by a
 5 winery or retailer holding such a license, except for the amount of
 6 the license fee and the restriction to sales of winery or farm
 7 winery wines, a winery or farm winery acting as a wine specialty
 8 shop retailer is subject to all other provisions of this article
 9 which are applicable to a wine specialty shop retailer as defined
 10 in section two of this article;
- 11 (5) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a wine tasting 12 license:
- 13 (6) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a private wine bed 14 and breakfast license, and each separate bed and breakfast from 15 which a licensee sells wine shall be separately licensed and there 16 shall be collected with respect to each such location the annual 17 license fee of \$150 as herein provided;
- 18 (7) Two hundred fifty dollars per year for a private wine 19 restaurant license, and each separate restaurant from which a 20 licensee sells wine shall be separately licensed and there shall be 21 collected with respect to each such location the annual license fee 22 of \$250 as herein provided;
- 23 (8) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a private wine spa 24 license and each separate private wine spa from which a licensee

- 1 sells wine shall be separately licensed and there shall be
- 2 collected with respect to each such location the annual license fee
- 3 of \$150 as herein provided;
- 4 (9) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a wine sampling
- 5 license issued for a wine specialty shop under subsection (n) of
- 6 this section;
- 7 (10) No fee shall be charged for a special one-day license
- 8 under subsection (p) of this section or for a heritage fair and
- 9 festival license under subsection (q) of this section; and
- 10 (11) One hundred fifty dollars per year for a direct shipper's
- 11 license for a licensee who sells and ships only wine and \$250 per
- 12 for a direct shipper's license who ships and sells wine,
- 13 nonfortified dessert wine, port, sherry or Madeira wines.
- 14 (12) Three hundred dollars per year for a multicapacity winery
- 15 or farm winery license which shall enable the holder to operate as
- 16 a retailer, wine specialty shop, supplier and direct shipper
- 17 without obtaining an individual license for each capacity.
- 18 (c) The license period shall begin on July 1, of each year and
- 19 end on June 30 of the following year and if granted for a less
- 20 period, the same shall be computed semiannually in proportion to
- 21 the remainder of the fiscal year.
- 22 (d) No retailer may be licensed as a private club as provided
- 23 by article seven of this chapter, except as provided by subsection
- 24 (k) of this section.

- (e) No retailer may be licensed as a Class A retail dealer in 2 nonintoxicating beer as provided by article sixteen, chapter eleven 3 of this code: *Provided*, That a delicatessen, a caterer or party 4 supply store which is a grocery store as defined in section two of 5 this article and which is licensed as a Class A retail dealer in 6 nonintoxicating beer may be a retailer under this article: 7 *Provided*, *however*, That any delicatessen, caterer or party supply 8 store licensed in both such capacities must maintain average 9 monthly sales exclusive of sales of wine and nonintoxicating beer 10 which exceed the average monthly sales of nonintoxicating beer: 11 *Provided further*, *That* a retailer may be licensed as a retail 2 dealer in nonintoxicating beer for the limited purpose as provided 3 by subsection (h) of this section.
- (f) A wine specialty shop under this article may also hold a wine tasting license authorizing such the retailer to serve complimentary samples of wine in moderate quantities for tasting. Such wine specialty shop shall organize a wine taster's club, which has at least fifty duly elected or approved dues-paying members in good standing. Such club shall meet on the wine specialty shop's premises not more than one time per week and shall either meet at a time when the premises are closed to the general public, or shall meet in a separate segregated facility on the premises to which the general public is not admitted. Attendance at tastings shall be limited to duly elected or approved dues-paying members and their

1 guests.

- 2 (g) A retailer who has more than one place of retail business 3 shall obtain a license for each separate retail establishment. A 4 retailer's license may be issued only to the proprietor or owner of 5 a bona fide grocery store or wine specialty shop.
- (h) The commissioner may issue a special license for the 7 retail sale of wine at any festival or fair which is endorsed or 8 sponsored by the governing body of a municipality or a county 9 commission. Such special license shall be issued for a term of no 10 longer than ten consecutive individual days in a calendar year and 11 the fee therefor shall be \$250 regardless of the term of the 12 license unless the applicant is the manufacturer of said wine on a 13 winery or a farm winery as defined in section five-a, article one 14 of this chapter, in which event the fee shall be \$50 if the event 15 is held on the premises of the winery or farm winery: Provided, 16 That the special license shall also allow the license holder to 17 sell nonintoxicating beer at the same festival or fair if the sale 18 of nonintoxicating beer is allowed by the festival or fair. 19 application for such the license shall contain such information as 20 the commissioner may reasonably require and shall be submitted to 21 the commissioner at least thirty days prior to the first day when 22 wine is to be sold at $\frac{\text{such}}{\text{the}}$ festival or fair. A winery or a 23 farm winery licensed under this subsection may exhibit, conduct 24 tastings, not to exceed a reasonable serving, and may sell wine

1 only for consumption off the premises of such the festival or fair. 2 A special license issued other than to a winery or a farm winery 3 may be issued to a "wine club" as defined herein below. 4 festival or fair committee or the governing body shall designate a 5 person to organize a club under a name which includes the name of 6 the festival or fair and the words "wine club". The license shall 7 be issued in the name of the wine club. A licensee may not 8 commence the sale of wine as provided in this subsection until the 9 wine club has at least fifty dues-paying members who have been 10 enrolled and to whom membership cards have been 11 Thereafter, new members may be enrolled and issued membership cards 12 at any time during the period for which the license is issued. A 13 wine club licensed under the provisions of this subsection may sell 14 wine only to its members, and in portions not to exceed eight 15 ounces per serving. Such sales shall take place on premises or in 16 an area cordoned or segregated so as to be closed to the general 17 public, and the general public shall not be admitted to such the 18 premises or area. A wine club licensee under the provisions of 19 this subsection shall be authorized to serve complimentary samples 20 of wine in moderate quantities for tasting. 2.1 A license issued under the provisions of this subsection and

the licensee holding such the license shall be subject to all other provisions of this article and the rules and orders of the commissioner relating to such the special license: Provided, That

1 the commissioner may by rule, regulation or order provide for 2 certain waivers or exceptions with respect to such the provisions, 3 rules, regulations or orders as the circumstances of each such 4 festival or fair may require, including, without limitation, the 5 right to revoke or suspend any license issued pursuant to this 6 section prior to any notice or hearing notwithstanding the 7 provisions of section twenty-seven and twenty-eight of this 8 article: Provided, however, That under no circumstances shall the 9 provisions of subsection (c) or (d), section twenty of this article 10 be waived nor shall any exception be granted with respect thereto.

A license issued under the provisions of this subsection and the licensee holding such the license shall may not be subject to the provisions of subsection (g) of this section.

(i) (A) The commissioner may issue a special license for the retail sale of wine in a professional baseball stadium. A license to sell wine granted pursuant to this subsection entitles the licensee to sell and serve wine, for consumption in a professional saseball stadium. For the purpose of this subsection, professional baseball stadium means a facility constructed primarily for the use of a major or minor league baseball franchisee affiliated with the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, Inc., or its successor, and used as a major or minor league baseball park. Any special license issued pursuant to this subsection shall be for a term beginning on the date of

1 issuance and ending on the next following June 30, and its fee is 2 \$250 regardless of the length of the term of the license. The 3 application for the special license shall contain information as 4 the commissioner may reasonably require and must be submitted to 5 the commissioner at least thirty days prior to the first day when 6 wine is to be sold at the professional baseball stadium. The 7 special license may be issued in the name of the baseball 8 franchisee or the name of the primary food and beverage vendor 9 under contract with the baseball franchisee. These sales must take 10 place within the confines of the professional baseball stadium, 11 provided that the exterior of the area where wine sales may occur 12 are surrounded by a fence or other barrier prohibiting entry except 13 upon the franchisee's express permission, and under the conditions 14 and restrictions established by the franchisee, so that the wine 15 sales area is closed to free and unrestricted entry by the general 16 public.

(B) A license issued under this subsection and the licensee
18 holding the license is subject to all other provisions of this
19 article and the rules and orders of the commissioner relating to
20 the special license: *Provided*, That the commissioner may by rule or
21 order grant certain waivers or exceptions to those rules or orders
22 as the circumstances of each such professional baseball stadium may
23 require, including, without limitation, the right to revoke or
24 suspend any license issued pursuant to this section prior to any

- 1 notice or hearing notwithstanding sections twenty-seven and 2 twenty-eight of this article: *Provided, however,* That under no 3 circumstances may subsection (c) or (d), section twenty of this
- 4 article be waived nor shall any exception be granted concerning
- 5 those subsections.
- 6 (C) The commissioner has the authority to propose rules for 7 legislative approval in accordance with article three, chapter 8 twenty-nine-a of this code to implement this subsection.
- (j) A license to sell wine granted to a private wine bed and 10 breakfast, private wine restaurant, private wine spa or a private 11 club under the provisions of this article entitles the operator to 12 sell and serve wine, for consumption on the premises of the 13 licensee, when such the sale accompanies the serving of food or a 14 meal to its members and their quests in accordance with the 15 provisions of this article: Provided, That a licensed private wine 16 bed and breakfast, private wine restaurant, private wine spa or a 17 private club may permit a person over twenty-one years of age to 18 purchase wine, consume wine and recork or reseal, using a tamper 19 resistant cork or seal, up to two separate bottles of unconsumed 20 wine in conjunction with serving of food or a meal to its members 21 and their guests in accordance with the provisions of this article 22 and in accordance with regulations promulgated by the commissioner 23 for the purpose of consumption of said wine off premises: 24 Provided, however, That for this article, food or a meal provided

- 1 by the private licensee means that the total food purchase,
 2 excluding beverage purchases, taxes, gratuity or other fees is at
 3 least \$15: Provided further, That a licensed private wine
 4 restaurant or a private club may offer for sale for consumption off
 5 the premises, sealed bottles of wine to its customers provided that
 6 no more than one bottle is sold per each person over twenty-one
 7 years of age, as verified by the private wine restaurant or private
 8 club, for consumption off the premises. Such licensees are
 9 authorized to keep and maintain on their premises a supply of wine
 10 in such quantities as may be appropriate for the conduct of
 11 operations thereof. Any sale of wine so made shall be subject to
 12 all restrictions set forth in section twenty of this article. A
 13 private wine restaurant may also be licensed as a Class A retail
 14 dealer in nonintoxicating beer as provided by article sixteen,
 15 chapter eleven of this code.
- (k) With respect to subsections (h), (i), (j), (o) and (p) of this section, the commissioner shall promulgate legislative rules in accordance with the provisions of chapter twenty-nine-a of this code with regard to the form of the applications, the suitability of both the applicant and location of the licensed premises and such other legislative rules deemed determined necessary to carry the provisions of such the subsections into effect.
- 23 (1) The commissioner shall promulgate legislative rules in 24 accordance with the provisions of chapter twenty-nine-a of this

- 1 code to allow restaurants to serve wine with meals, and to sell
- 2 wine by the bottle for off-premises consumption as provided in
- 3 subsection (j) of this section. Each restaurant so licensed shall
- 4 be charged an additional \$100 per year fee.
- 5 (m) The commissioner shall establish guidelines to permit 6 wines to be sold in all stores licensed for retail sales.
- 7 (n) Wineries and farm wineries may advertise off premises as 8 provided in section seven, article twenty-two, chapter seventeen of 9 this code.
- 10 (o) A wine specialty shop under this article may also hold a 11 wine sampling license authorizing the wine specialty shop to 12 conduct special wine sampling events at a licensed wine specialty 13 shop location during regular hours of business. The wine specialty 14 shop may serve up to three complimentary samples of wine, 15 consisting of no more than one ounce each, to any one consumer in 16 one day. Persons serving the complimentary samples must be 17 twenty-one years of age and an authorized representative of the 18 licensed wine specialty shop, winery, farm winery or of a distributor or registered supplier. 19 representative 20 Distributor and supplier representatives attending wine sampling 21 events must be registered with the commissioner. No licensee, 22 employee or representative may furnish, give or serve complimentary 23 samples of wine to any person less than twenty-one years of age or 24 to a person who is physically incapacitated due to the consumption

- of alcoholic liquor or the use of drugs. The wine specialty shop shall notify and secure permission from the commissioner for all wine sampling events one month prior to the event. Wine sampling events may not exceed six hours per calendar day. Licensees must purchase all wines used during these events from a licensed farm winery or a licensed distributor.
- qp) The commissioner may issue special one-day licenses to duly organized, nonprofit corporations and associations allowing the sale and serving of wine when raising money for athletic, charitable, educational or religious purposes. The license application shall contain information as the commissioner may reasonably require and shall be submitted to the commissioner at least thirty days prior to the event. Wines used during these events may be donated by or purchased from a licensed retailer, a distributor or a farm winery. Under no circumstances may the provision of subsection (c), section twenty of this article be waived nor may any exception be granted with respect thereto.
- (q) The commissioner may issue special licenses to heritage fairs and festivals allowing the sale, serving and sampling of wine from a licensed farm winery. The license application shall contain information required by the commissioner and shall be submitted to the commissioner at least thirty days prior to the event. Wines used during these events may be donated by or purchased from a licensed farm winery. Under no circumstances may the provision of

- 1 subsection (c), section twenty of this article be waived nor may
- 2 any exception be granted with respect thereto. The commissioner
- 3 shall propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with
- 4 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the
- 5 provisions of this subsection.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that a wine retailer may be licensed as a retail dealer in nonintoxicating beer for the limited purpose of selling nonintoxicating beer at the same festival or fair if the sale of nonintoxicating beer is allowed by the festival or fair.
