16	by adding thereto a new article, designated §6-13A-1, to read as

18	ARTICLE 13A. JOB RETENTION FOR CERTAIN DISABLED VETERANS.
19	§6-13A-1. Jobs to be held for certain disabled veterans seeking or
20	receiving treatment for service-connected injury.
21	(a) A disabled veteran who has been employed in any position
22	in any agency as defined in section four, article one, chapter
23	five-f of this code or any other political subdivision of this
24	state and who has suffered an injury causing a compensable service-
25	connected disability while on active duty, as established by any

1 proper veterans' bureau or department of the federal government, 2 shall have his or her position retained while the veteran is 3 seeking or receiving treatment for the injury. 4 (b) To receive the benefit provided in subsection (a) of this 5 section, separation from active duty must have been under honorable 6 conditions. This includes honorable and general discharges. 7 Active duty for training in the military reserve and National Guard 8 programs is not considered active duty for purposes of this 9 section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide retention of certain jobs for certain veterans seeking or receiving treatment for the injury or injuries which led to the veteran's service-connected disability.
