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LO	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by

22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
23	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
24	by adding thereto a new section, designated §29-3-20; and that said

- 3 ARTICLE 3. FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL ACT.
- 4 §29-3-20. Minimum acceptable fire company staffing levels at full-
- 5 time paid fire departments; dispersals from
- 6 <u>Firefighters Lottery Fund; rules.</u>
- 7 The State Fire Marshal shall propose rules for legislative
- 8 approval in accordance with the provisions of article three,
- 9 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the following:
- 10 (1) Standards for minimum acceptable fire company on-duty
- 11 staffing levels at full-time paid fire departments which will
- 12 provide an adequate number of personnel to safely and adequately
- 13 conduct emergency scene fire suppression and rescue operations,

- 3 §29-22-9b. Firefighters instant lottery scratch-off game.
- 4 (a) Beginning September 1, 2013, the commission shall
- 5 establish an instant lottery scratch-off game designated as the
- 6 Firefighters Benefit Game, which shall be offered by the lottery.
- 7 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section eighteen of this
- 8 article, and subject to the provisions of subsections (c) and (d)

- 12 game created in this section shall clearly state that the profits
- 13 derived from the game are being used to help provide more on-duty
- 14 firefighters in this state.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the State Fire Marshal to propose rules for legislative approval to set standards for minimum acceptable fire company on-duty staffing levels at full-time paid fire departments which will provide an adequate number of personnel to safely and adequately conduct emergency scene fire suppression and rescue operations. A firefighters instant lottery scratch-off game is created, with net profits going to the Firefighters Lottery Fund to provide funding to assist full-time paid fire departments in hiring additional firefighters.

\$29-3-20 and \$29-22-9b are new; therefore, they have been completely underscored.
