2 3 (By Delegates Boggs, Manypenny, Fleischauer, Caputo and Longstreth) 4 5 [Introduced March 25, 2013; referred to the 6 7 Committee on Roads and Transportation then the 8 Judiciary. 1 9 10 A BILL to amend and reenact §24A-5-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 11 1931, as amended, relating to increasing the minimum amounts 12 of insurance necessary for commercial motor carriers in the 1.3 state. 14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 15 That §24A-5-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, 16 be amended and reenacted to read as follows: 17 ARTICLE 5. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION. 18 \$24A-5-5. Further regulatory powers of the commission. 19 (a) The commission shall prescribe rules of practice and 20 procedure including, the method and manner of holding hearings, 21 taking evidence, and entering orders. In the investigation, 22 preparation and hearing of cases, the commission is not bound by 23 the technical rules of pleading and evidence, but may exercise 24 discretion to facilitate its efforts to understand and learn all 25 the facts bearing upon the right and justness of the matters before

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1 it.

- 2 (b) The commission shall employ personnel as may be necessary
  3 to carry out the provisions of this chapter and fix their
  4 respective salaries or compensation. The commission may designate
  5 employees as it deems necessary to take evidence at any hearing
  6 held or required by the provisions of this chapter. These
  7 employees are empowered to administer oaths in all parts of the
  8 state so far as the exercise of this power is properly incidental
  9 to the performance of their duties in accordance with the
  10 provisions of this chapter.
- 11 (c) The commission shall prescribe a schedule of fees to
  12 accompany: (i) Applications for certificates of convenience and
  13 necessity; (ii) applications for permit; and (iii) other filings
  14 and recordings of other papers with the commission. The commission
  15 shall prescribe a schedule of fees to be charged for: (i) The
  16 certification of all records and papers; (ii) the payment of
  17 witnesses; and (iii) other costs necessary and incident to hearings
  18 before it or its employees. Sums collected in accordance with this
  19 subsection, except witness fees, are to be paid into the State
  20 Treasury and credited to the Public Service Commission motor
  21 carrier fund provided for in section six, article six of this
  22 chapter. Witness fees are to be paid to the persons entitled to
  23 them.
- 24 (d) The commission shall establish a system of accounts to be

- 1 kept by motor carriers; or classify motor carriers and establish a
  2 system of accounts for each class. The commission shall prescribe
  3 the manner in which the accounts are to be kept. It may prescribe
  4 the form of accounts, records, and memoranda to be kept by the
  5 motor carriers, including the accounts, records, and memoranda for
  6 the movement of traffic, the receipts and expenditures of money,
  7 and any other forms, records and memoranda which in the judgment of
  8 the commission may be necessary to carry out any of the provisions
  9 of this chapter.
- (e) The commission shall require persons subject to the provisions of this chapter to furnish any information in their possession or obtainable from their accounting or other records, respecting rates, charges, classifications or practices in conducting their business. The commission has the authority to inspect any books, papers or reports. Any statements required by the this subsection are to be under oath when required by the commission. The form of all reports required under this chapter are to be prescribed by the commission.
- (f) The commission as a whole or any of its members or designated employees, shall subpoen witnesses, take testimony and administer oaths to any witness in any proceeding or examination instituted before it or conducted by it with reference to any matter within its jurisdiction. In all hearings or proceedings before the commission or its designated employees, the evidence of

1 witnesses and the production of documentary evidence may be 2 required at any designated place of hearing within the state. Ιn 3 the case of disobedience to a subpoena or other process, the 4 commission or any party to the proceedings before the commission 5 may invoke the aid of any circuit court in the state in requiring 6 the evidence and testimony of witnesses and the production of 7 papers, books, and documents. The court, in the case of a refusal 8 to obey the subpoena issued to any person or to any motor carrier 9 subject to the provisions of this chapter, shall issue an order 10 requiring the person or motor carrier to appear before the 11 commission or its designated employees and produce all requested 12 books and papers and give evidence relating to the matter in 13 question. Any failure to obey the order of the court may be 14 punished by the court as contempt. A claim that testimony or 15 evidence may tend to incriminate the person giving the testimony or 16 evidence does not excuse the person from testifying, but the person 17 may not be prosecuted for any offense concerning which he or she 18 has been compelled to testify.

19 (g) The commission shall require common carriers by motor 20 vehicle and contract carriers by motor vehicle subject to the 21 provisions of this chapter either to procure insurance from a 22 company authorized to write insurance in West Virginia, to qualify 23 as a self-insurer, or to deposit security upon terms and conditions 24 and for limits of liability as the commission shall determine to be

1 necessary for the reasonable protection of the traveling, shipping, 2 and general public against injury, loss, damage or default for 3 which the carrier may be liable. It shall prescribe rules and 4 regulations governing the filing of evidence of insurance and 5 security with the commission. In fixing the amount of the 6 insurance policy or policies, the qualifications as a self-insurer, 7 or the deposit of security, the commission shall give due 8 consideration to the character and amount of traffic, the value of 9 the property transported, the number of persons affected, and the 10 degree of danger involved in any motor carrier operation. 11 commission shall set, at a minimum, the amount of the insurance 12 policies to be at least \$2 million because of bodily injury to or 13 death of one person in any one accident, and, subject to the limit 14 for one person, in the amount of at least \$5 million because of 15 bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one 16 accident, and in the amount of at least \$500,000 because of injury 17 to or destruction of property of others in any one accident, and in 18 the amount of at least \$5.5 million total combined single limit: 19 Provided, That the amount set by the commission for for-hire 20 vehicles, that haul nonhazardous property with a gross vehicle 21 weight of ten thousand or more pounds, shall be at least \$750,000 22 because of injury to or destruction of property of others in any 23 one accident.

(h) The commission shall cooperate with the federal government

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- 1 or any other commission or organized delegated authority to 2 regulate interstate or foreign commerce by motor vehicles to ensure 3 that the transportation of persons and property by motor vehicles 4 in interstate and foreign commerce into and through the State of 5 West Virginia may be regulated and the laws of the United States 6 and the State of West Virginia enforced and administered 7 cooperatively in the public interest.
- 8 (i) The commission shall make agreements on behalf of the
  9 State of West Virginia with any other state or states providing for
  10 reciprocal rights, privileges, and courtesies between the licensees
  11 or holders of certificates and permits of the state or states and
  12 the State of West Virginia. These agreements may include
  13 provisions regarding certificates and permits, fees, assessments,
  14 and uniform vehicle identification cards, and the transportation of
  15 either persons or property into or through the respective state or
  16 states and the State of West Virginia. All existing agreements
  17 between a state or states and the State of West Virginia for
  18 reciprocal rights, privileges, and courtesies may, provided
  19 Constitutional and contractual rights are not violated, be declared
  20 void by the commission, and new agreements negotiated.
- 21 (j) The commission shall promulgate: (i) Safety rules 22 applicable to motor vehicles subject to the provisions of this 23 chapter; (ii) rules governing the qualifications and maximum hours 24 of service of drivers and chauffeurs of common and contract

- 1 carriers by motor vehicle of passengers and property subject to the
- 2 provisions of this chapter; and (iii) any other rules that the
- 3 commission may deem proper to carry out the provisions and intent
- 4 of this chapter.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to raise the minimum amounts of insurance for commercial motor carriers in the state. The bill requires those minimum amounts to be \$2 million for bodily injury to one person, \$5 million for bodily injury to two or two persons, \$500,000 for property damage and a total combined single limit of \$5.5 million.
