24	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	

25 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended

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1 by adding thereto a new article, designated §20-15A-1, , §20-15A-2, 2 §20-15A-3, §20-15A-4, §20-15A-5 and §20-15A-6, all to read as 3 follows:

4 ARTICLE 15A. ATV AND UTV RECREATION ACT.

5 §20-15A-1. Legislative findings.

6 <u>The West Virginia Legislature finds that trail-oriented</u> 7 recreation for off-highway vehicle enthusiasts significantly 8 contributes to the economy of West Virginia and is enjoyed by a 9 large and growing number of residents and nonresidents alike. 10 Since it is recognized that there are inherent risks in the 11 operation of such off-highway vehicles which should be understood 12 by each operator it is the purpose of this article to define the 13 areas of responsibility and affirmative acts to define the risk 14 which the participants expressly assume and for which there can be 15 no recovery.

16 **§20-15A-2.** Definitions.

17 <u>The terms in this article have the following meaning, unless</u> 18 the context clearly requires a different meaning:

19 <u>(1) "All-terrain vehicle" or "ATV" means any motor vehicle as</u> 20 <u>defined in section nine, article one, chapter seventeen-f of this</u> 21 code;

22 (2) "Director" means the Director of the Division of Natural
23 <u>Resources;</u>

24 (3) "Low-pressure tire" means every tire in which twenty

1 pounds per square inch or less of compressed air is designed to 2 support the load;

3 (4) "Utility-terrain vehicle" or "UTV" means any motor vehicle 4 with four or more low-pressure tires designed for off-highway use 5 having bench or bucket seating for each occupant and a steering 6 wheel for control.

7 §20-15A-3. Scope.

This article applies to required equipment, off-highway use 8 9 permits, and the registration of all-terrain vehicles or utility-10 terrain vehicles as defined in section two of this article, on 11 roads and trails on public lands, old timber roads and other 12 limited use roads, including national forests.

13 §20-15A-4. Duties of all-terrain vehicle or utility-terrain 14

vehicle owners; director to propose rules.

Every all-terrain vehicle or utility-terrain vehicle as 15 16 defined in section two of this article, operating upon roads and 17 trails on public lands, old timber roads and other limited use 18 roads and national forests within this state shall be registered as 19 provided in this section:

(a) The owner of all-terrain vehicle or utility-terrain 20 21 vehicle shall file an application for license to ride on roads and 22 trails on public lands, old timber roads and other limited use 23 roads within this state with the director on forms approved by the 24 Division of Natural Resources.

1 (b) The Director of the Division of Natural Resources shall 2 propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with the 3 provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for 4 the implementation of this article, including fees for licenses or 5 permits. The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall propose rules 6 for legislative approval in accordance with the provisions of 7 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code for licensing or 8 registering these vehicles. (b) Fees for licensing of all-terrain 9 vehicles or utility-terrain vehicles generated by this article 10 shall be paid to the Treasurer of the State of West Virginia and 11 one-half shall be credited to the Division of Natural Resources and 12 one-half credited to the Lighthouse Program. 13 §20-15A-5. Duties of licensees. 14 (a) All licensees under this article: 15 (1) Shall comply with any requirements established by law, 16 including those in section one, article one, chapter seventeen-f of this code which defines those acts prohibited by operators of all-17 18 terrain vehicles; 19 (2) Shall comply with the rules established by the Director of 20 the Division of Natural Resources for use on roads and trails on 21 public lands, old timber roads and other limited-use roads,

22 including national forests in this state;

23 (3) Shall expressly assume the risk of and legal
24 responsibility for any injury, loss or damage to person or property

1 which results from participation in operating an all-terrain 2 vehicle or utility-terrain vehicle and caused by any of the 3 following: (A) Variations in terrain, slope or angle of terrain; 4 5 (B) Surface or subsurface conditions including rocks, trees or 6 other forms of forest growth or debris; 7 (C) Collisions with signs, markers, width restrictors, 8 culverts, bridges, pipes, equipment, vehicles or any other objects 9 or fixtures used in trail management, maintenance, construction or 10 development; (D) Collisions with signs, markers, pipes, equipment, vehicles 11 12 or any component thereof used in natural resource maintenance, 13 development or extraction; (b) Each licensee shall have the sole individual 14 15 responsibility for: 16 (1) Knowing the range of his or her own ability to negotiate 17 any slope or trail; (2) Operating the ATV or UTV within the limits of the 18 19 licensee's own ability; (3) Maintaining reasonable control of speed and course at all 20 21 times; 22 (4) Heeding all posted warnings; 23 (5) Operating only on trails designated by the director; and (6) Refraining from acting in a manner which may cause or 24

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1 contribute to the injury of any person.

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2	(c) If while riding an ATV or UTV, any licensee collides with
3	any object or person, the responsibility for the collision shall be
4	solely that of the licensee or licensees involved.
5	(d) After an accident, a licensee may not leave the area where
6	the accident took place without:
7	(1) Leaving personal identification, including his or her name
8	and address;
9	(2) Notifying the proper authorities; and
10	(3) Obtaining assistance when he or she knows or reasonably
11	should know that any other person involved in the accident is in
12	need of medical or other assistance.
13	(e) Where a participant is a lawful passenger, that
14	participant may not distract or perform any act which might
15	interfere with the safe operation of the all-terrain vehicle or
16	utility-terrain vehicle of which he or she is a passenger.
17	(f) Any person under the age of sixteen years shall remain
18	under the direct supervision and within sight of a parent or
19	guardian both of whom must otherwise comply with state or federal
20	laws and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder.
21	(g) A licensee may not make any alterations or tamper with the
22	all-terrain vehicle or utility-terrain vehicle he or she is
23	operating or of which he or she is a passenger in any way which

24 would interfere with the continued safe operation of that machine.

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1 §20-15A-6. Liability of licensees.

2 Any licensee is liable for injury, loss or damage resulting 3 from violations of the duties established in section five of this 4 article where the violation of duty is causally related to the 5 injury, loss or damage suffered.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the "ATV and UTV Recreation Act." It provides legislative findings concerning trail-oriented recreation for off-highway vehicle enthusiasts. It requires off-highway use permits, and the registration of allterrain vehicles or utility-terrain vehicles on roads and trails on public lands, old timber roads and other limited-use roads, including national forests. The bill authorizes the Director of the Division of Natural Resources to propose rules to implement the article. The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles is responsible for licensing of the vehicles. It defines the duties and liabilities of licensees. And, states how fees generated by the article are to be used.

This article is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
