12	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
13	adding thereto a new section, designated \$11-21-12j, relating
14	to creating a West Virginia personal income tax modification
15	reducing federal adjusted gross income for persons who choose
16	to spay or neuter their pets.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
19	by adding thereto a new section, designated $$11-21-12j$, to read as
20	follows:
21	ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL INCOME TAX.
22	§11-21-12j. Additional modification reducing federal adjusted
23	gross income.

- 1 (a) Allowance of modification. -- Subject to the limitations
 2 provided in subsection (b), in addition to amounts authorized to be
 3 subtracted from federal adjusted gross income pursuant to section
 4 twelve of this article, a modification reducing federal adjusted
 5 gross income is authorized in the amount of any amounts paid by the
 6 taxpayer for the spaying and neutering of dogs and cats which are
 7 maintained as pets in the taxpayer's household.
- 8 (b) Limitations.
- 9 (1) The modification provided is allowable only as to sums 10 which have actually been paid.
- 11 (2) The spay or neuter surgical procedure must have been 12 performed by a duly licensed veterinarian on a live cat or dog.
- 13 (3) The amount of modification for each cat or dog which has
 14 been spayed or neutered may not exceed the reasonable cost of the
 15 spay and neuter procedures in the state.
- 16 (4) The modification is limited to no more than three 17 companion animals, dogs and cats, per household in any taxable 18 year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide a West Virginia personal income tax modification reducing federal adjusted gross income for people who have spayed or neutered their dog or cat.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
