L 5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
L 6	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
L 7	by adding thereto a new section, designated §19-20-26, to read as
L 8	follows:
L 9	ARTICLE 20. DOGS AND CATS.
20	§19-20-26. Honoring fallen K-9s in the service of state or local
21	government agencies.
22	(a) This section shall be known as "Haas' Law" and is intended

- 1 to honor law-enforcement canines and other canines in the service
- 2 of state or local governmental agencies, and to help provide
- 3 closure to grieving law-enforcement officers or other governmental
- 4 employees who have served as handlers for these dogs.
- 5 (b) Any canine working for, or retired from, a state or local
- 6 law-enforcement agency or other governmental agency shall be
- 7 memorialized by that agency upon its death if the law-enforcement
- 8 officer or other agency employee who acted as the canine's handler
- 9 so requests. The tribute shall include:
- 10 (1) A memorial service, which may be a small informal service
- 11 within the law-enforcement agency or other governmental agency
- 12 where the canine served, or it may be open to the public, at the
- 13 discretion of that agency;
- 14 (2) A plaque and flag to be presented to the canine's most
- 15 recent handler as a memorial to the canine for its distinguished
- 16 service;
- 17 (3) A picture of the canine and its most recent handler to be
- 18 placed, for an appropriate period of time, on a "wall of honor" at
- 19 the law-enforcement agency or other agency which is dedicated for
- 20 pictures of canines and their handlers; and
- 21 (4) An obituary posted in the local newspaper in honor of the
- 22 fallen canine.
- 23 (c) The Superintendent of State Police or other appropriate

- 1 director of a state agency which utilizes canines in its service,
- 2 a county commission or a municipal government may set aside funding
- 3 to provide for canine memorial services for those law-enforcement
- 4 agencies or other governmental agencies under their direction.
- 5 Such funding may be dedicated from moneys realized from the seizure
- 6 of contraband by law-enforcement agencies or as otherwise
- 7 determined by the state agency, county commission or municipal
- 8 government.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create "Haas' Law" to honor fallen law-enforcement canines and other canines in service of state and local government agencies, and to honor their handlers.
