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12 A BILL to amend and reenact article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of
13 West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the
14 Board of Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to
15 practitioner requirements for accessing the West Virginia
16 Controlled Substances Monitoring Program database.

17 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

18 That article 9, chapter 64 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
19 as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

20 **ARTICLE 9. AUTHORIZATION FOR MISCELLANEOUS AGENCIES AND BOARDS TO**
21 **PROMULGATE LEGISLATIVE RULES.**

22 **§64-9-1. Board of Medicine.**

23 The legislative rule filed in the State Register on the
24 twenty-eighth day of August, two thousand twelve, authorized under

1 the authority of section five-a, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of
2 this code, modified by the Board of Medicine to meet the objections
3 of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the
4 State Register on the sixth day of December, two thousand twelve,
5 relating to the Board of Medicine (practitioner requirements for
6 accessing the West Virginia controlled substances monitoring
7 program data base, [11 CSR 10](#)), is authorized.

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9 NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of
10 Medicine to promulgate a legislative rule relating to Practitioner
11 Requirements for Accessing the West Virginia Controlled Substances
12 Monitoring Program Data Base.
