23	The legislative rule filed in the State Register on the
24	twenty-eighth day of August, two thousand twelve, authorized under

the authority of section five-a, article nine, chapter sixty-a, of this code, modified by the Board of Medicine to meet the objections of the Legislative Rule-Making Review Committee and refiled in the State Register on the sixth day of December, two thousand twelve, relating to the Board of Medicine (practitioner requirements for accessing the West Virginia controlled substances monitoring program data base, <u>11 CSR 10</u>), is authorized.
