10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$20-2-64$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to importation and release of
12	certain aquatic species; revising the stocking permit
13	requirements for the release of aquatic species into state
14	waters; and criminal penalties.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §20-2-64 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 2. WILDLIFE RESOURCES.
19	§20-2-64. Regulating release of fish, water animals and other
20	aquatic organisms; stocking permit.
21	(a) It is unlawful for any person to release any fish, water
22	animal or other aquatic organism, alive or dead, or any part, nest

1 or egg thereof, into the waters of this state except as authorized 2 by a stocking permit issued by the director or as otherwise 3 provided in this section.

4 (b) It is unlawful, and no stocking permit may be issued, for 5 any person to possess, sell, offer for sale, import, bring or cause 6 to be brought or imported into this state or released into the 7 waters of this state, any live bighead carp (*Hypophthalmichthys* 8 nobilis), silver carp (*Hypophthalmichthys molitrix*), black carp 9 (*Mylopharyngodon piceus*), largescale silver carp 10 (*Hypophthalmichthys harmandi*), diploid white amur (*Ctenopharyngodon* 11 *idella*) or snakehead (*Channa spp.*), gametes or eggs of the same, or 12 any hybrids of these species.

13 (c) Exceptions. -

(1) The species listed in subsection (b) may be possessed or imported by a person solely for scientific research if the possession or importation is not in violation of federal law and the person submits prior written notice to the director setting forth his or her name, residence, profession and educational or scientific affiliation, the species and the geographic location of the importation or possession.

(2) Fish, water animals and other aquatic organisms lawfully 22 taken from the waters of this state may be released into the waters 23 from which they were taken, if the release occurs proximate in time

1 to the lawful taking.

2 (3) Native or established species of fish may be released into3 privately owned ponds.

4 (d) *Stocking permit.* - The director may issue a stocking 5 permit to release fish, water animals or other aquatic organisms 6 into the waters of this state. The form and requirements of the 7 permit application shall be established by the director and shall 8 include a disease free certification.

9 (e) Any person convicted of a violation of this section is 10 guilty of a misdemeanor punishable under section nine, article 11 seven of this chapter.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to revise stocking permit requirements for the release of aquatic species into state waters.
