10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18A-4-8$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to clarifying the definition of
12	"years of employment" for retirement purposes from a county
13	board of education.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That \$18A-4-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 4. SCHOOL PERSONNEL.
18	§18A-4-8. Employment term and class titles of service personnel;
19	definitions.
20	(a) The purpose of this section is to establish an employment
21	term and class titles for service personnel. The employment term
22	for service personnel may not be less than ten months. A month is

- 1 defined as twenty employment days. The county board may contract
- 2 with all or part of these service personnel for a longer term. The
- 3 beginning and closing dates of the ten-month employment term may
- 4 not exceed forty-three weeks.
- 5 (b) Service personnel employed on a yearly or twelve-month
- 6 basis may be employed by calendar months. Whenever there is a
- 7 change in job assignment during the school year, the minimum pay
- 8 scale and any county supplement are applicable.
- 9 (c) Service personnel employed in the same classification for
- 10 more than the two hundred-day minimum employment term shall be paid
- 11 for additional employment at a daily rate of not less than the
- 12 daily rate paid for the two hundred-day minimum employment term.
- 13 (d) A service person may not be required to report for work
- 14 more than five days per week without his or her agreement, and no
- 15 part of any working day may be accumulated by the employer for
- 16 future work assignments, unless the employee agrees thereto.
- 17 (e) If a service person whose regular work week is scheduled
- 18 from Monday through Friday agrees to perform any work assignments
- 19 on a Saturday or Sunday, the service person shall be paid for at
- 20 least one-half day of work for each day he or she reports for work.
- 21 If the service person works more than three and one-half hours on
- 22 any Saturday or Sunday, he or she shall be paid for at least a full
- 23 day of work for each day.

- 1 (f) A custodian, aide, maintenance, office and school lunch 2 service person required to work a daily work schedule that is 3 interrupted shall be paid additional compensation in accordance 4 with this subsection.
- 5 (1) A maintenance person means a person who holds a 6 classification title other than in a custodial, aide, school lunch, 7 office or transportation category as provided in section one, 8 article one of this chapter.
- 9 (2) A service person's schedule is considered to be
 10 interrupted if he or she does not work a continuous period in one
 11 day. Aides are not regarded as working an interrupted schedule
 12 when engaged exclusively in the duties of transporting students;
- 13 (3) The additional compensation provided for in this 14 subsection:
- 15 (A) Is equal to at least one-eighth of a service person's 16 total salary as provided by the state minimum pay scale and any 17 county pay supplement; and
- 18 (B) Is payable entirely from county board funds.
- 19 (g) When there is a change in classification or when a service 20 person meets the requirements of an advanced classification, his or 21 her salary shall be made to comply with the requirements of this 22 article and any county salary schedule in excess of the minimum 23 requirements of this article, based upon the service person's

- 1 advanced classification and allowable years of employment.
- 2 (h) A service person's contract, as provided in section five,
- 3 article two of this chapter, shall state the appropriate monthly
- 4 salary the employee is to be paid, based on the class title as
- 5 provided in this article and on any county salary schedule in
- 6 excess of the minimum requirements of this article.
- 7 (i) The column heads of the state minimum pay scale and class
- 8 titles, set forth in section eight-a of this article, are defined
- 9 as follows:
- 10 (1) "Pay grade" means the monthly salary applicable to class
- 11 titles of service personnel;
- 12 (2) "Years of employment" means the number of years which an
- 13 employee classified as a service person or a person who has served
- 14 as a member of the board of education has been employed by a county
- 15 board in any position, including serving as a member of the board
- 16 of education, prior to or subsequent to the effective date of this
- 17 section and includes service in the Armed Forces of the United
- 18 States, if the employee was employed at the time of his or her
- 19 induction. For the purpose of section eight-a of this article,
- 20 years of employment is limited to the number of years shown and
- 21 allowed under the state minimum pay scale as set forth in section
- 22 eight-a of this article;
- 23 (3) "Class title" means the name of the position or job held

- 1 by a service person;
- 2 (4) "Accountant I" means a person employed to maintain payroll
- 3 records and reports and perform one or more operations relating to
- 4 a phase of the total payroll;
- 5 (5) "Accountant II" means a person employed to maintain
- 6 accounting records and to be responsible for the accounting process
- 7 associated with billing, budgets, purchasing and related
- 8 operations;
- 9 (6) "Accountant III" means a person employed in the county
- 10 board office to manage and supervise accounts payable, payroll
- 11 procedures, or both;
- 12 (7) "Accounts payable supervisor" means a person employed in
- 13 the county board office who has primary responsibility for the
- 14 accounts payable function and who either has completed twelve
- 15 college hours of accounting courses from an accredited institution
- 16 of higher education or has at least eight years of experience
- 17 performing progressively difficult accounting tasks
- 18 Responsibilities of this class title may include supervision of
- 19 other personnel;
- 20 (8) "Aide I" means a person selected and trained for a
- 21 teacher-aide classification such as monitor aide, clerical aide,
- 22 classroom aide or general aide;
- 23 (9) "Aide II" means a service person referred to in the "Aide

- 1 I" classification who has completed a training program approved by
- 2 the state board, or who holds a high school diploma or has received
- 3 a general educational development certificate. Only a person
- 4 classified in an Aide II class title may be employed as an aide in
- 5 any special education program;
- 6 (10) "Aide III" means a service person referred to in the
- 7 "Aide I" classification who holds a high school diploma or a
- 8 general educational development certificate; and
- 9 (A) Has completed six semester hours of college credit at an
- 10 institution of higher education; or
- 11 (B) Is employed as an aide in a special education program and
- 12 has one year's experience as an aide in special education;
- 13 (11) "Aide IV" means a service person referred to in the "Aide
- 14 I" classification who holds a high school diploma or a general
- 15 educational development certificate; and
- 16 (A) Has completed eighteen hours of state board-approved
- 17 college credit at a regionally accredited institution of higher
- 18 education, or
- 19 (B) Has completed fifteen hours of state board-approved
- 20 college credit at a regionally accredited institution of higher
- 21 education; and has successfully completed an in-service training
- 22 program determined by the state board to be the equivalent of three
- 23 hours of college credit;

- 1 (12) "Audiovisual technician" means a person employed to 2 perform minor maintenance on audiovisual equipment, films, and
- 3 supplies and who fills requests for equipment;
- 4 (13) "Auditor" means a person employed to examine and verify 5 accounts of individual schools and to assist schools and school 6 personnel in maintaining complete and accurate records of their
- 7 accounts;
- 9 students and who meets standards and experience to be determined by 10 the state board. A person who has held or holds an aide title and

(14) "Autism mentor" means a person who works with autistic

- 11 becomes employed as an autism mentor shall hold a
- 12 multiclassification status that includes both aide and autism
- 13 mentor titles, in accordance with section eight-b of this article;
- 14 (15) "Braille or sign language specialist" means a person
- $15\ \mathrm{employed}$ to provide braille and/or sign language assistance to
- 16 students. A service person who has held or holds an aide title and
- 17 becomes employed as a braille or sign language specialist shall
- 18 hold a multiclassification status that includes both aide and
- 19 braille or sign language specialist title, in accordance with
- 20 section eight-b of this article;
- 21 (16) "Bus operator" means a person employed to operate school
- 22 buses and other school transportation vehicles as provided by the
- 23 state board;

- 1 (17) "Buyer" means a person employed to review and write
- 2 specifications, negotiate purchase bids and recommend purchase
- 3 agreements for materials and services that meet predetermined
- 4 specifications at the lowest available costs;
- 5 (18) "Cabinetmaker" means a person employed to construct
- 6 cabinets, tables, bookcases and other furniture;
- 7 (19) "Cafeteria manager" means a person employed to direct the
- 8 operation of a food services program in a school, including
- 9 assigning duties to employees, approving requisitions for supplies
- 10 and repairs, keeping inventories, inspecting areas to maintain high
- 11 standards of sanitation, preparing financial reports and keeping
- 12 records pertinent to food services of a school;
- 13 (20) "Carpenter I" means a person classified as a carpenter's
- 14 helper;
- 15 (21) "Carpenter II" means a person classified as a journeyman
- 16 carpenter;
- 17 (22) "Chief mechanic" means a person employed to be
- 18 responsible for directing activities which ensure that student
- 19 transportation or other county board-owned vehicles are properly
- 20 and safely maintained;
- 21 (23) "Clerk I" means a person employed to perform clerical
- 22 tasks;
- 23 (24) "Clerk II" means a person employed to perform general

- 1 clerical tasks, prepare reports and tabulations and operate office
- 2 machines;
- 3 (25) "Computer operator" means a qualified person employed to
- 4 operate computers;
- 5 (26) "Cook I" means a person employed as a cook's helper;
- 6 (27) "Cook II" means a person employed to interpret menus and
- 7 to prepare and serve meals in a food service program of a school.
- 8 This definition includes a service person who has been employed as
- 9 a "Cook I" for a period of four years;
- 10 (28) "Cook III" means a person employed to prepare and serve
- 11 meals, make reports, prepare requisitions for supplies, order
- 12 equipment and repairs for a food service program of a school
- 13 system;
- 14 (29) "Crew leader" means a person employed to organize the
- 15 work for a crew of maintenance employees to carry out assigned
- 16 projects;
- 17 (30) "Custodian I" means a person employed to keep buildings
- 18 clean and free of refuse;
- 19 (31) "Custodian II" means a person employed as a watchman or
- 20 groundsman;
- 21 (32) "Custodian III" means a person employed to keep buildings
- 22 clean and free of refuse, to operate the heating or cooling systems
- 23 and to make minor repairs;

- 1 (33) "Custodian IV" means a person employed as head
- 2 custodians. In addition to providing services as defined in
- 3 "custodian III," duties may include supervising other custodian
- 4 personnel;
- 5 (34) "Director or coordinator of services" means an employee
- $\boldsymbol{6}$ of a county board who is assigned to direct a department or
- 7 division.
- 8 (A) Nothing in this subdivision prohibits a professional
- 9 person or a professional educator from holding this class title;
- 10 (B) Professional personnel holding this class title may not be
- 11 defined or classified as service personnel unless the professional
- 12 person held a service personnel title under this section prior to
- 13 holding the class title of "director or coordinator of services."
- 14 (C) The director or coordinator of services shall be
- 15 classified either as a professional person or a service person for
- 16 state aid formula funding purposes;
- 17 (D) Funding for the position of director or coordinator of
- 18 services is based upon the employment status of the director or
- 19 coordinator either as a professional person or a service person;
- 20 and
- 21 (E) A person employed under the class title "director or
- 22 coordinator of services" may not be exclusively assigned to perform
- 23 the duties ascribed to any other class title as defined in this

- 1 subsection: Provided, That nothing in this paragraph prohibits a
- 2 person in this position from being multiclassified;
- 3 (35) "Draftsman" means a person employed to plan, design and
- 4 produce detailed architectural/engineering drawings;
- 5 (36) "Electrician I" means a person employed as an apprentice
- 6 electrician helper or one who holds an electrician helper license
- 7 issued by the State Fire Marshal;
- 8 (37) "Electrician II" means a person employed as an
- 9 electrician journeyman or one who holds a journeyman electrician
- 10 license issued by the State Fire Marshal;
- 11 (38) "Electronic technician I" means a person employed at the
- 12 apprentice level to repair and maintain electronic equipment;
- 13 (39) "Electronic technician II" means a person employed at the
- 14 journeyman level to repair and maintain electronic equipment;
- 15 (40) "Executive secretary" means a person employed as
- 16 secretary to the county school superintendent or as a secretary who
- 17 is assigned to a position characterized by significant
- 18 administrative duties;
- 19 (41) "Food services supervisor" means a qualified person who
- 20 is not a professional person or professional educator as defined in
- 21 section one, article one of this chapter. The food services
- 22 supervisor is employed to manage and supervise a county school
- 23 system's food service program. The duties include preparing

- 1 in-service training programs for cooks and food service employees,
- 2 instructing personnel in the areas of quantity cooking with economy
- 3 and efficiency and keeping aggregate records and reports;
- 4 (42) "Foreman" means a skilled person employed to supervise
- 5 personnel who work in the areas of repair and maintenance of school
- 6 property and equipment;
- 7 (43) "General maintenance" means a person employed as a helper
- 8 to skilled maintenance employees and to perform minor repairs to
- 9 equipment and buildings of a county school system;
- 10 (44) "Glazier" means a person employed to replace glass or
- 11 other materials in windows and doors and to do minor carpentry
- 12 tasks;
- 13 (45) "Graphic artist" means a person employed to prepare
- 14 graphic illustrations;
- 15 (46) "Groundsman" means a person employed to perform duties
- 16 that relate to the appearance, repair and general care of school
- 17 grounds in a county school system. Additional assignments may
- 18 include the operation of a small heating plant and routine cleaning
- 19 duties in buildings;
- 20 (47) "Handyman" means a person employed to perform routine
- 21 manual tasks in any operation of the county school system;
- 22 (48) "Heating and air conditioning mechanic I" means a person
- 23 employed at the apprentice level to install, repair and maintain

- 1 heating and air conditioning plants and related electrical
- 2 equipment;
- 3 (49) "Heating and air conditioning mechanic II" means a person
- 4 employed at the journeyman level to install, repair and maintain
- 5 heating and air conditioning plants and related electrical
- 6 equipment;
- 7 (50) "Heavy equipment operator" means a person employed to
- 8 operate heavy equipment;
- 9 (51) "Inventory supervisor" means a person employed to
- 10 supervise or maintain operations in the receipt, storage, inventory
- 11 and issuance of materials and supplies;
- 12 (52) "Key punch operator" means a qualified person employed to
- 13 operate key punch machines or verifying machines;
- 14 (53) "Licensed practical nurse" means a nurse, licensed by the
- 15 West Virginia Board of Examiners for Licensed Practical Nurses,
- 16 employed to work in a public school under the supervision of a
- 17 school nurse;
- 18 (54) "Locksmith" means a person employed to repair and
- 19 maintain locks and safes;
- 20 (55) "Lubrication man" means a person employed to lubricate
- 21 and service gasoline or diesel-powered equipment of a county school
- 22 system;
- 23 (56) "Machinist" means a person employed to perform machinist

- 1 tasks which include the ability to operate a lathe, planer, shaper,
- 2 threading machine and wheel press. A person holding this class
- 3 title also should have the ability to work from blueprints and
- 4 drawings;
- 5 (57) "Mail clerk" means a person employed to receive, sort,
- 6 dispatch, deliver or otherwise handle letters, parcels and other
- 7 mail;
- 8 (58) "Maintenance clerk" means a person employed to maintain
- 9 and control a stocking facility to keep adequate tools and supplies
- 10 on hand for daily withdrawal for all school maintenance crafts;
- 11 (59) "Mason" means a person employed to perform tasks
- 12 connected with brick and block laying and carpentry tasks related
- 13 to these activities;
- 14 (60) "Mechanic" means a person employed to perform skilled
- 15 duties independently in the maintenance and repair of automobiles,
- 16 school buses and other mechanical and mobile equipment to use in a
- 17 county school system;
- 18 (61) "Mechanic assistant" means a person employed as a
- 19 mechanic apprentice and helper;
- 20 (62) "Member of a Board of Education" means a person who has
- 21 been elected and served on a county board of education pursuant to
- 22 the provisions of article five, chapter eighteen of this code;
- (62) (63) "Multiclassification" means a person employed to

- 1 perform tasks that involve the combination of two or more class
- 2 titles in this section. In these instances the minimum salary
- 3 scale shall be the higher pay grade of the class titles involved;
- 4 (63) (64) "Office equipment repairman I" means a person
- 5 employed as an office equipment repairman apprentice or helper;
- 6 (64) (65) "Office equipment repairman II" means a person
- 7 responsible for servicing and repairing all office machines and
- 8 equipment. A person holding this class title is responsible for
- 9 the purchase of parts necessary for the proper operation of a
- 10 program of continuous maintenance and repair;
- 11 (65) (66) "Painter" means a person employed to perform duties
- 12 painting, finishing and decorating wood, metal and concrete
- 13 surfaces of buildings, other structures, equipment, machinery and
- 14 furnishings of a county school system;
- 15 (66) (67) "Paraprofessional" means a person certified pursuant
- 16 to section two-a, article three of this chapter to perform duties
- 17 in a support capacity including, but not limited to, facilitating
- 18 in the instruction and direct or indirect supervision of students
- 19 under the direction of a principal, a teacher or another designated
- 20 professional educator.
- 21 (A) A person employed on the effective date of this section in
- 22 the position of an aide may not be subject to a reduction in force
- 23 or transferred to create a vacancy for the employment of a

- 1 paraprofessional;
- 2 (B) A person who has held or holds an aide title and becomes
- 3 employed as a paraprofessional shall hold a multiclassification
- 4 status that includes both aide and paraprofessional titles in
- 5 accordance with section eight-b of this article; and
- 6 (C) When a service person who holds an aide title becomes
- 7 certified as a paraprofessional and is required to perform duties
- 8 that may not be performed by an aide without paraprofessional
- 9 certification, he or she shall receive the paraprofessional title
- 10 pay grade;
- 11 $\frac{(67)}{(68)}$ "Payroll supervisor" means a person employed in the
- 12 county board office who has primary responsibility for the payroll
- 13 function and who either has completed twelve college hours of
- 14 accounting from an accredited institution of higher education or
- 15 has at least eight years of experience performing progressively
- 16 difficult accounting tasks. Responsibilities of this class title
- 17 may include supervision of other personnel;
- 18 $\frac{(68)}{(69)}$ "Plumber I" means a person employed as an apprentice
- 19 plumber and helper;
- 20 (69) (70) "Plumber II" means a person employed as a journeyman
- 21 plumber;
- 22 (70) (71) "Printing operator" means a person employed to
- 23 operate duplication equipment, and to cut, collate, staple, bind

- 1 and shelve materials as required;
- 2 $\frac{(71)}{(72)}$ "Printing supervisor" means a person employed to
- 3 supervise the operation of a print shop;
- 4 $\frac{(72)}{(73)}$ "Programmer" means a person employed to design and
- 5 prepare programs for computer operation;
- 6 $\frac{(73)}{(74)}$ "Roofing/sheet metal mechanic" means a person
- 7 employed to install, repair, fabricate and maintain roofs, gutters,
- 8 flashing and duct work for heating and ventilation;
- 9 $\frac{(74)}{(75)}$ "Sanitation plant operator" means a person employed
- 10 to operate and maintain a water or sewage treatment plant to ensure
- 11 the safety of the plant's effluent for human consumption or
- 12 environmental protection;
- 13 $\frac{(75)}{(76)}$ (76) "School bus supervisor" means a qualified person:
- 14 (A) Employed to assist in selecting school bus operators and
- 15 routing and scheduling school buses, operate a bus when needed,
- 16 relay instructions to bus operators, plan emergency routing of
- 17 buses and promote good relationships with parents, students, bus
- 18 operators and other employees; and
- 19 (B) Certified to operate a bus or previously certified to
- 20 operate a bus;
- 21 $\frac{(76)}{(77)}$ "Secretary I" means a person employed to transcribe
- 22 from notes or mechanical equipment, receive callers, perform
- 23 clerical tasks, prepare reports and operate office machines;

(77) (78) "Secretary II" means a person employed in any 1 2 elementary, secondary, kindergarten, nursery, special education, 3 vocational or any other school as a secretary. The duties may 4 include performing general clerical tasks; transcribing from notes, 5 stenotype, mechanical equipment or a sound-producing machine; 6 preparing reports; receiving callers and referring them to proper 7 persons; operating office machines; keeping records and handling 8 routine correspondence. Nothing in this subdivision prevents a 9 service person from holding or being elevated to a higher 10 classification; (78) (79) "Secretary III" means a person assigned to the 11 charge of various 12 county board office administrators in 13 instructional, maintenance, transportation, food services, 14 operations and health departments, federal programs or departments 15 with particular responsibilities in purchasing and financial 16 control or any person who has served for eight years in a position 17 which meets the definition of "secretary II" or "secretary III"; 18 (79) (80) "Supervisor of maintenance" means a skilled person 19 who is not a professional person or professional educator as 20 defined in section one, article one of this chapter. 21 responsibilities include directing the upkeep of buildings and 22 shops, and issuing instructions to subordinates relating to 23 cleaning, repairs and maintenance of all structures and mechanical

1 and electrical equipment of a county board;

(80) (81) "Supervisor of transportation" means a qualified 3 person employed to direct school transportation activities properly 4 and safely, and to supervise the maintenance and repair of 5 vehicles, buses and other mechanical and mobile equipment used by 6 the county school system. After July 1, 2010, all persons employed 7 for the first time in a position with this classification title or 8 in a multi-classification position that includes this title shall 9 have five years of experience working in the transportation 10 department of a county board. Experience working in 11 transportation department shall consist of serving as a bus 12 operator, bus aide, assistant mechanic, mechanic, chief mechanic or 13 in a clerical position within the transportation department; 14 (81) (82) "Switchboard operator-receptionist" means a person 15 employed to refer incoming calls, to assume contact with the 16 public, to direct and to give instructions as necessary, to operate 17 switchboard equipment and to provide clerical assistance; 18 (82) "Truck driver" means a person employed to operate 19 light or heavy duty gasoline and diesel-powered vehicles; 20 (83) (84) "Warehouse clerk" means a person employed to be 21 responsible for receiving, storing, packing and shipping goods; 22 (84) (85) "Watchman" means a person employed to protect school

23 property against damage or theft. Additional assignments may

- 1 include operation of a small heating plant and routine cleaning
 2 duties;
- 3 (85) (86) "Welder" means a person employed to provide 4 acetylene or electric welding services for a school system; and
- 5 (86) (87) "WVEIS data entry and administrative clerk" means a 6 person employed to work under the direction of a school principal 7 to assist the school counselor or counselors in the performance of 8 administrative duties, to perform data entry tasks on the West 9 Virginia Education Information System, and to perform other

10 administrative duties assigned by the principal.

- (j) Notwithstanding any provision in this code to the contrary, and in addition to the compensation provided for service personnel in section eight-a of this article, each service person is entitled to all service personnel employee rights, privileges and benefits provided under this or any other chapter of this code without regard to the employee's hours of employment or the methods or sources of compensation.
- (k) A service person whose years of employment exceeds the number of years shown and provided for under the state minimum pay scale set forth in section eight-a of this article may not be paid less than the amount shown for the maximum years of employment shown and provided for in the classification in which he or she is employed.

- 1 (1) Each county board shall review each service person's job
 2 classification annually and shall reclassify all service persons as
 3 required by the job classifications. The state superintendent may
 4 withhold state funds appropriated pursuant to this article for
 5 salaries for service personnel who are improperly classified by the
 6 county boards. Further, the state superintendent shall order a
 7 county board to correct immediately any improper classification
 8 matter and, with the assistance of the Attorney General, shall take
 9 any legal action necessary against any county board to enforce the
 10 order.
- 11 (m) Without his or her written consent, a service person may 12 not be:
- 13 (1) Reclassified by class title; or
- (2) Relegated to any condition of employment which would 15 result in a reduction of his or her salary, rate of pay, 16 compensation or benefits earned during the current fiscal year; or 17 for which he or she would qualify by continuing in the same job 18 position and classification held during that fiscal year and 19 subsequent years.
- (n) Any county board failing to comply with the provisions of 21 this article may be compelled to do so by mandamus and is liable to 22 any party prevailing against the board for court costs and the 23 prevailing party's reasonable attorney fee, as determined and

1 established by the court.

- 2 (o) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the 3 contrary, a service person who holds a continuing contract in a 4 specific job classification and who is physically unable to perform 5 the job's duties as confirmed by a physician chosen by the 6 employee, shall be given priority status over any employee not 7 holding a continuing contract in filling other service personnel 8 job vacancies if the service person is qualified as provided in 9 section eight-e of this article.
- 10 (p) Any person employed in an aide position on the effective
 11 date of this section may not be transferred or subject to a
 12 reduction in force for the purpose of creating a vacancy for the
 13 employment of a licensed practical nurse.
- (q) Without the written consent of the service person, a county board may not establish the beginning work station for a bus operator or transportation aide at any site other than a county board-owned facility with available parking. The workday of the bus operator or transportation aide commences at the bus at the designated beginning work station and ends when the employee is able to leave the bus at the designated beginning work station, unless he or she agrees otherwise in writing. The application or acceptance of a posted position may not be construed as the written consent referred to in this subsection.

1 (r) Itinerant status means a service person who does not have 2 a fixed work site and may be involuntarily reassigned to another 3 work site. A service person is considered to hold itinerant status 4 if he or she has bid upon a position posted as itinerant or has 5 agreed to accept this status. A county board may establish 6 positions with itinerant status only within the aide and autism 7 mentor classification categories and only when the job duties 8 involve exceptional students. A service person with itinerant 9 status may be assigned to a different work site upon written notice 10 ten days prior to the reassignment without the consent of the 11 employee and without posting the vacancy. A service person with 12 itinerant status may be involuntarily reassigned no more than twice 13 during the school year. At the conclusion of each school year, the 14 county board shall post and fill, pursuant to section eight-b of 15 this article, all positions that have been filled without posting 16 by a service person with itinerant status. A service person who is 17 assigned to a beginning and ending work site and travels at the 18 expense of the county board to other work sites during the daily 19 schedule, shall not be considered to hold itinerant status.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify that service on a county board of education while contributing to the state retirement system would count in the calculation of years of service for retirement purposes.
