



1 United States Congress of the "REAL ID Act of 2005", as part of  
2 Public Law 109-13, is inimical to security and well-being of the  
3 people of West Virginia, will cause unneeded expense and  
4 inconvenience to the people of this state, and was adopted by the  
5 United States Congress in violation of the principles of federalism  
6 contained in the tenth amendment to the United States Constitution.

7 (2) The State of West Virginia will not participate in the  
8 implementation of the "REAL ID Act of 2005." The Department of  
9 Transportation, including the Division of Motor Vehicles, is  
10 directed not to implement the provisions of the "REAL ID Act of  
11 2005" and to report to the Governor any attempt by agencies or  
12 agents of the United States Department of Homeland Security to  
13 secure the implementation of the "REAL ID Act of 2005" through the  
14 operations of that division.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that West Virginia will not participate in the "REAL ID Act of 2005" enacted by the United States Congress in Public Law 109-13.
