23	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended

- 2 ARTICLE 3. PURCHASING DIVISION.
- 3 §5A-3-10d. Reverse auction pilot program.
- 4 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, the 5 director is hereby authorized to initiate a reverse auction pilot 6 program to procure office supplies. The director may not use the 7 pilot program for the procurement of services under any
- 9 (b) The reverse auction pilot program may be utilized if the 10 director determines the use of a reverse auction would be fair, 11 economical and in the best interests of the state, and the office 12 supplies to be procured:
- 13 (1) Are subject to low price volatility;
- 14 (2) Have specifications that are common and not complex;
- 15 (3) Vary little between suppliers;
- 16 (4) Are sourced primarily on price, with limited ancillary 17 considerations;
- 18 (5) Require little collaboration from suppliers; and
- 19 (6) Are sold by a large, competitive supply base.
- (c) For purposes of this section, "reverse auction" means a process by which bidders compete to provide office supplies in an open and interactive market, including but not limited to, the Internet. Reverse auction bids are opened and made public upon receipt by the director, and then bidders are given the opportunity

- 1 to submit revised bids until the bidding process is complete. The
- 2 contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.
- 3 (d) The director may contract with qualified, industry-
- 4 recognized third-party vendors to conduct reverse auctions on
- 5 behalf of the director.
- 6 (e) The director shall propose rules for legislative approval
- 7 in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-
- 8 nine-a of this code to establish the procedures for conducting
- 9 reverse auctions under the pilot program authorized by this
- 10 section. The rules shall include procedures for contracting with
- 11 qualified, industry-recognized third-party vendors.
- 12 (f) This section shall expire and be of no further force and
- 13 effect on and after July 1, 2017.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize a reverse auction pilot program for purposes of purchasing office supplies in limited circumstances.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
