1 §29-9-1. Legislative findings.

- 2 (a) The Legislature finds that state agencies, boards,
- 3 commissions and entities that administer tests predominately in
- 4 Charleston do not serve a majority of the citizens of the state and
- 5 in some cases make a hardship on the citizens due to the
- 6 significant driving distance to Charleston.
- 7 (b) Therefore, providing for the administration of tests at
- 8 least regionally will better serve the citizens of the state.
