A BILL to amend and reenact §31-15C-2, §31-15C-4, §31-15C-8, §31-15C-9 and §31-15C-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to the actions of the broadband deployment council generally; modifying the minimum data rates and other components of the definition of the terms "broadband" and "broadband service"; modifying and adding other definitions; requiring annual reports to the Legislature; providing that the council's public outreach and education efforts extend beyond unserved areas; revising the council's guidelines on requests for

funding assistance; requiring projects for broadband service involving the construction of a network to meet the revised definition of "broadband service" and "broadband" before being approved; revising the criteria for funding assistance applications; modifying the application process for project assistance; and revising notice and publication requirements.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §31-15C-2, §31-15C-4, §31-15C-8, §31-15C-9 and §31-15C-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 15C. BROADBAND DEPLOYMENT.

§31-15C-2. Definitions.

- 1 (a) For the purposes of this article,
- 2 (1) "Broadband" or "broadband service" means any service
- 3 providing advanced telecommunications capability with either
- 4 a minimum downstream data rate or of 6 Mbps and a minimum
- 5 upstream data rate of at least 200 kilobits per second 1.5 Mbps,
- 6 that does not require the end-user to dial up a connection that has
- 7 the capacity to always be on, and for which the transmission
- 8 speeds are based on regular available bandwidth rates, not
- 9 sporadic or burstable rates, with a minimum downstream-to-

- upstream data ratio of 10:1 for services with a downstream data 10 11 rate of up to five megabits per second, and with a minimum upstream data rate of 500 kilobits per second for services with a 12 13 downstream data rate of five megabits per second or greater 14 latency suitable for real-time applications and services such as 15 VoIP and video conferencing, and with monthly usage capacity 16 reasonably comparable to that of residential terrestrial fixed 17 broadband offerings in urban areas. 18 (2) "Broadband deployment project" means either: (A) A a 19 project to provide broadband services to in a type 2 and/or type 20 3 unserved area, as defined in section six of this article; or (B) a 21 project to undertake activities to promote demand for broadband 22 services and broadband applications. 23 (3) "Broadband demand promotion project" means a 24 statewide or regional project to undertake activities to promote 25 demand for broadband services and broadband applications. (3)(4) "Downstream data rate" means the transmission speed 26
- 28 (4)(5) "Upstream data rate" means the transmission speed 29 from the end-user to the service provider source.

from the service provider source to the end-user.

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- 30 (5)(6) "Unserved area" means a community that has no access to broadband service.
- 32 (b) The definition of the term "broadband," the designation 33 of areas that are "unserved", and the level of service required to 34 qualify for funding of state programs and projects, are based on the Federal Communications Commission's current definition of 35 36 broadband, which is stated in terms of the number of Kilobits 37 (Kbps) per second, either upstream or downstream National 38 Telecommunications and Information Administration's speed 39 tiers. It is the intention of the Legislature that the definition of 40 broadband in this article and the level of service requirements for 41 state funding be promptly updated by future Legislatures to
- 43 regulation promulgated by the Federal Communications

conform with any revisions enacted by Congress or any rule or

- 44 Commission or other federal agencies involved with deploying
- 45 and enhancing broadband services.

§31-15C-4. Powers and duties of the council generally.

1 (a) The council shall:

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- 2 (1) Explore the potential for increased use of broadband
- 3 service for the purposes of education, career readiness,
- 4 workforce preparation and alternative career training;

- 5 (2) Explore ways for encouraging state and municipal
- 6 agencies to expand the development and use of broadband
- 7 services for the purpose of better serving the public, including
- 8 audio and video streaming, voice-over Internet protocol,
- 9 teleconferencing and wireless networking; and
- 10 (3) Cooperate and assist in the expansion of electronic
- instruction and distance education services by July, 2014.
- 12 (b) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this
- 13 article, the council is hereby granted, has and may exercise all
- 14 powers necessary or appropriate to carry out and effectuate the
- 15 purpose and intent of this article. The council shall have the
- 16 power and capacity to:
- 17 (1) Provide consultation services to project sponsors in
- 18 connection with the planning, acquisition, improvement,
- 19 construction or development of any broadband deployment
- 20 project;
- 21 (2) Promote awareness of public facilities that have
- 22 community broadband access that can be used for distance
- 23 education and workforce development;

- 24 (3) Advise on deployment of e-government portals such that
- 25 all public bodies and political subdivisions have homepages,
- 26 encourage one-stop government access, and that all public
- 27 entities stream audio and video of all public meetings;
- 28 (4) To make and execute contracts, commitments and other
- 29 agreements necessary or convenient for the exercise of its
- 30 powers, including, but not limited to, the hiring of consultants to
- 31 assist in the mapping of the state, categorization of areas within
- 32 the state and evaluation of project applications: *Provided*, That
- 33 the provisions of article three, chapter five-a of this code do not
- 34 apply to the agreements and contracts executed under the
- 35 provisions of this article;
- 36 (5) Acquire by gift or purchase, hold or dispose of real
- 37 property and personal property in the exercise of its powers and
- 38 performance of its duties as set forth in this article;
- 39 (6) Receive and dispense funds appropriated for its use by
- 40 the Legislature or other funding sources or solicit, apply for and
- 41 receive any funds, property or services from any person,
- 42 governmental agency or organization to carry out its statutory
- 43 duties: and

- 44 (7) Perform any and all other activities in furtherance of its 45 purpose.
- 46 (c) The council shall exercise its powers and authority to
- 47 bring broadband service to unserved areas. The council may not
- 48 duplicate or displace broadband service in areas already served
- 49 or where private industry feasibly can be expected to offer
- 50 services in the reasonably foreseeable future.
- 51 (d) The council shall report to the Legislature on or before
- 52 January 1 of each year concerning the action taken by the
- 53 council during the previous year in carrying out the provisions
- 54 of this article and make such special reports as may be required
- 55 by the Legislature and Governor.

§31-15C-8. Stimulation of demand through public outreach and education.

- 1 In order to implement and carry out the intent of this article,
- 2 the council may take such actions as it deems necessary or
- 3 advisable in order to stimulate demand through public outreach
- 4 and education. in unserved areas. The council shall consider the
- 5 views, if offered, of affected members of the public, including
- 6 private industry.

§31-15C-9. Development of guidelines and application for funding assistance; emergency rule-making authority.

1 (a) In order to implement and carry out the intent of this 2 article in type 2 and type 3 unserved areas, the council shall 3 promulgate emergency propose for promulgation legislative rules pursuant to the provisions of section fifteen, article three, 4 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to develop comprehensive, 5 6 uniform guidelines for use by the council in evaluating any 7 request by a project sponsor for funding assistance to plan, 8 acquire, construct, improve or otherwise develop and execute a 9 broadband deployment project in a type 2 or type 3 unserved 10 area, and may promulgate emergency rules under section fifteen 11 of said article three pending authorization of the legislative rules. 12 The guidelines shall include the following factors: (1) The cost-13 effectiveness of the project; (2) the economic development 14 benefits of the project; (3) the availability of alternative sources 15 of funding that could help finance the project, including, but not 16 limited to, private grants or federal funding and the efforts 17 undertaken to obtain such funding; (4) if the project requires the 18 construction of a network, the applicant's ability to operate and 19 maintain such network; (5) the degree to which the project 20 advances statewide broadband access and other state broadband 21 planning goals; (6) if the project involves the construction of a 22 network, the proposed technologies, bandwidths, upstream data 23 rates and downstream data rates; (7) the estimated date the 24 project would commence and be completed; (8) how the 25 proposed project compares to alternative proposals for the same 26 unserved area with regard to the number of people served, the 27 amount of financial assistance sought, and the long-term 28 viability of the proposed project; and (9) any other consideration 29 the council deems pertinent in evaluating requests for funding 30 assistance. 31 (b) Under no circumstances may the council's guidelines 32

allow for the approval of any project for broadband service that
does not include a minimum downstream transmission rate of
600 kilobits per second (Kbps) and a minimum downstream-toupstream ratio of 8.5:1 for services with a downstream rate of up
to five megabits per second (Mbps). In those cases where a
project's broadband service's downstream rate is five Mbps or
greater, the council's guidelines must require a minimum
upstream data rate of 588 Kbps and allow information

40 applications and market demands to dictate acceptable 41 downstream-to-upstream data ratios involving the construction 42 of a network that does not meet the minimum requirements for 43 broadband service as that term and the term broadband are 44 defined in section two of this article. 45 (c) The council shall create an application form that shall be 46 used by all project sponsors requesting funding assistance from 47 the council to plan, acquire, construct, improve or otherwise 48 develop and execute broadband deployment projects in type 2 or 49 type 3 unserved areas or broadband demand promotion projects. 50 The application form shall contain all advise applicants of 51 information required by all state agencies that will be required 52 to issue permits and certificates regarding the project. The 53 application form shall require the project sponsor to set forth the 54 proposed location of the project; if the project involves the 55 construction of a network, the type(s) of unserved area(s) the 56 project proposes to address;; the estimated total cost of the 57 project, the amount of funding assistance required and the 58 specific uses of the funding; other sources of funding available 59 potentially available for the project; information

- 60 demonstrating the need for the project; that the proposed funding
- 61 of the project is the most economically feasible and viable
- alternative to completing the project; and such other information
- 63 as the council considers necessary.

§31-15C-10. Requirements for project funding assistance; review of project application by council; competitive applications.

- 1 (a) Once the council has categorized unserved areas pursuant
- 2 to section six of this article, At a time and place determined by
- 3 the council, project sponsors may submit applications for
- 4 funding assistance. for projects in those unserved areas. Upon
- 5 receiving its first completed application for a categorized
- 6 unserved area, the council shall post notice of such application
- 7 with the Secretary of State Broadband deployment projects,
- 8 including projects involving the construction of a network, may
- 9 be submitted for type 2 and/or type 3 unserved areas as those
- 10 areas are categorized pursuant to section six of this article.
- 11 Broadband demand promotion projects may be submitted on a
- 12 statewide or regional basis. When a completed application is
- 13 received for a project area, the council shall post notice with the
- 14 Secretary of State of the first completed application received for

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that project area. The notice shall be published in the State 15 16 Register for sixty days so as to allow for competing applications 17 to be submitted to the council. Within thirty days of the close of 18 the aforementioned sixty-day notice period, the council shall 19 review all applications timely received during the sixty-day 20 period and either: (i) Approve funding for one or more projects 21 after determining that the funding would constitute an 22 appropriate investment of public funds; or (ii) if the council 23 determines that the application does not contain all of the 24 required information or otherwise is incomplete, or that a 25 proposed project is not eligible for funding assistance, or that the 26 proposed project is otherwise not an appropriate or prudent 27 investment of state funds, the council shall deny the project 28 funding request. Prior to approving or denying any funding 29 request, the council may seek the advice of any expert consultant 30 retained pursuant to section seven of this article, but the council 31 is not bound by that advice. The council shall also consider the 32 views, if offered, of affected members of the public, including 33 private industry. 34 (b) To apply for or receive any funding assistance for a

broadband deployment project or a broadband demand

- promotion project from the council pursuant to subsection (a) of this section, the project sponsor seeking the funding assistance shall submit a completed application to the council on the form prepared for such purpose by the council pursuant to section nine of this article.
- 41 (c) In reviewing each application, the council may use the 42 engineering, financial and technical expertise of outside 43 consultants in addition to the respective staffs of the government 44 agencies and private-sector entities represented on the council or 45 other government agencies.
- (d) Notwithstanding any provision of article fifteen-a,
 chapter thirty-one or any other provision of this code, broadband
 deployment project proposals and broadband demand promotion
 project proposals submitted to the council for its consideration
 pursuant to this article and the council's decisions with regard to
 such projects shall not be subject to review by the West Virginia
 Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council.
