# H. B. 2434

(BY DELEGATE(S) MILEY, PETHTEL, WHITE, MOORE, L. PHILLIPS, BOGGS, BARILL, P. SMITH AND JONES)

[Introduced February 14, 2013; referred to the Committee on the Judiciary then Finance.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §50-1-3, §50-1-8, §50-1-9 and §50-1-9a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating generally to the magistrate court system; providing compensation for magistrates, magistrate assistants, magistrate court clerks and magistrate court deputy clerks; and authorizing judges to appoint magistrate court clerks in certain circumstances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §50-1-3, §50-1-8, §50-1-9 and §50-1-9a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

## ARTICLE 1. COURTS AND OFFICERS.

### §50-1-3. Salaries of magistrates.

- 1 (a) The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 2 (1) The West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals has held

10	(3) The utilization of a two-tiered salary schedule for
11	magistrates is an equitable and rational manner by which
12	magistrates should be compensated for work performed;

(b) The salary of each magistrate shall be paid by the state.
Magistrates who serve fewer than eight thousand four hundred
in population shall be paid annual salaries of thirty thousand six

hundred twenty-five dollars and magistrates who serve eight 24 thousand four hundred or more in population shall be paid 25 annual salaries of thirty-seven thousand dollars: Provided, That 26 27 on and after the first day of July, two thousand three, magis-28 trates who serve fewer than eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid annual salaries of thirty-three thousand 29 six hundred twenty-five dollars and magistrates who serve eight 30 thousand four hundred or more in population shall be paid 31 32 annual salaries of forty thousand dollars: Provided, however, 33 That on and after the first day of July, two thousand five, magistrates who serve fewer than eight thousand four hundred 34 35 in population shall be paid annual salaries of forty-three 36 thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars and magistrates who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population shall 37 be paid annual salaries of fifty thousand dollars. Provided 38 39 further, That on and after the first day of July, 2011, magistrates 40 who serve fewer than eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid annual salaries of \$51,125 and magistrates who 41 serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population shall 42 be paid annual salaries of \$57,500. 43

(c) For the purpose of determining the population served by
each magistrate, the number of magistrates authorized for each
county shall be divided into the population of each county. For
the purpose of this article, the population of each county is the
population as determined by the last preceding decennial census
taken under the authority of the United States government.
<u>All magistrates shall be compensated equally. Beginning July</u>

51 <u>1, 2013, the annual salary of all magistrates is \$57,500.</u>

# \$50-1-8. Magistrate court clerks; salaries; duties; duties of circuit clerk.

(a) In each county, having three or more magistrates the 1 judge of the circuit court or the chief judge of the circuit court, 2 3 if there is more than one judge of the circuit court, shall appoint a magistrate court clerk. In all other counties the judge may 4 5 appoint a magistrate court clerk or may by rule require the duties of the magistrate court clerk to be performed by the clerk 6 of the circuit court, in which event the circuit court clerk is 7 entitled to additional compensation in the amount of \$2,500 per 8 9 year. The magistrate court clerk serves at the will and pleasure of the circuit judge. 10

11 (b) Magistrate court clerks shall be paid a monthly salary by the state. Magistrate court clerks serving magistrates who serve 12 less than eight thousand four hundred in population shall be 13 14 paid up to \$26,436 per year and magistrate court clerks serving 15 magistrates who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population shall be paid up to \$31,344 per year: Provided, That 16 17 on and after July 1, 2006, magistrate court clerks serving magistrates who serve less than eight thousand four hundred in 18 population shall be paid up to \$31,436 per year and magistrate 19 20 court clerks serving magistrates who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population shall be paid up to \$36,344 per 21 year: Provided, however, That on and after July 1, 2007, 22 23 magistrate court clerks serving magistrates who serve less than 24 eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid up to \$36,436 per year and magistrate court clerks serving magistrates 25 26 who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population 27 shall be paid up to \$41,344 per year: Provided further, That 28 after the effective date of this section, any general salary increase granted to all state employees, whose salaries are not 29 set by statute, expressed as a percentage increase or an "across-30

31 the-board" increase, may also be granted to magistrate court 32 clerks. For the purpose of determining the population served by 33 each magistrate, the number of magistrates authorized for each 34 county shall be divided into the population of each county. The 35 salary of the magistrate court clerk shall be established by the 36 judge of the circuit court, or the chief judge of the circuit court 37 if there is more than one judge of the circuit court, within the 38 limits set forth in this section compensated equally. 39 (c) Beginning July 1, 2013, the annual salary of all magis-40 trate court clerks is \$44,720. After the effective date of this

41 section, a general salary increase granted to state employees,

42 whose salaries are not set by statute, expressed as a percentage

43 increase or an "across-the-board" increase, may also be granted

44 to magistrate court clerks.

45 (c) (d) In addition to other duties that may be imposed by
46 the provisions of this chapter or by the rules of the Supreme
47 Court of Appeals or the judge of the circuit court or the chief
48 judge of the circuit court if there is more than one judge of the
49 circuit court, it is the duty of the magistrate court clerk to
50 establish and maintain appropriate dockets and records in a

51 centralized system for the magistrate court, to assist in the 52 preparation of the reports required of the court and to carry out 53 on behalf of the magistrates or chief magistrate if a chief 54 magistrate is appointed, the administrative duties of the court. 55 (d) (e) The magistrate court clerk or if there is no magistrate 56 <del>court clerk in the county, the clerk of the circuit court,</del> may issue 57 all manner of civil process and require the enforcement of subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum in magistrate court. 58

#### §50-1-9. Magistrate assistants; salary; duties.

1 (a) In each county there shall be one magistrate assistant for 2 each magistrate. Each magistrate assistant shall be appointed by 3 the magistrate under whose authority and supervision and at 4 whose will and pleasure he or she shall serve. The assistant shall may not be a member of the immediate family of any 5 magistrate and shall may not have been convicted of a felony or 6 any a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude and shall must 7 reside in the State of West Virginia. For the purpose of this 8 9 section, "immediate family" means the relationships of mother, 10 father, sister, brother, child or spouse.

11	(b) A magistrate assistant shall have the duties, clerical or
12	otherwise, assigned by the magistrate and prescribed by the
13	rules of the Supreme Court of Appeals or the judge of the circuit
14	court or the chief judge of the circuit court if there is more than
15	one judge of the circuit court. In addition to these duties,
16	magistrate assistants shall perform and are accountable to the
17	magistrate court clerks with respect to the following duties:
18	(1) The preparation of summons in civil actions;
19	(2) The assignment of civil actions to the various magis-
20	trates;
21	(3) The collection of all costs, fees, fines, forfeitures and
22	penalties which are payable to the court;
23	(4) The submission of moneys, along with an accounting of
24	the moneys, to appropriate authorities as provided by law;
25	(5) The daily disposition of closed files which are to be
26	located in the magistrate clerk's office;
27	(6) All duties related to the gathering of information and
28	documents necessary for the preparation of administrative
29	reports and documents required by the rules of the Supreme
30	Court of Appeals or the judge of the circuit court or the chief

judge of the circuit court if there is more than one judge of thecircuit court;

(7) All duties relating to the notification, certification and
payment of jurors serving pursuant to the terms of this chapter;
(8) All other duties or responsibilities whereby the magistrate assistant is accountable to the magistrate court clerk as
determined by the magistrate.

38 (c) Magistrate assistants shall be paid a monthly salary by 39 the state. Magistrate assistants serving magistrates who serve 40 less than eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid up to \$23,148 per year and magistrate assistants serving 41 42 magistrates who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in 43 population shall be paid up to \$26,244 per year: Provided, That on and after July 1, 2006, magistrate assistants serving magis-44 45 trates who serve less than eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid up to \$28,148 per year and magistrate 46 47 assistants serving magistrates who serve eight thousand four 48 hundred or more in population shall be paid up to \$31,244 per 49 year: Provided, however, That on and after July 1, 2007, magistrate assistants serving magistrates who serve less than 50

51 eight thousand four hundred in population shall be paid up to 52 \$33,148 per year and magistrate assistants serving magistrates who serve eight thousand four hundred or more in population 53 54 shall be paid up to \$36,244 per year: Provided further, That 55 after the effective date of this section, any general salary 56 increase granted to all state employees, whose salaries are not 57 set by statute, expressed as a percentage increase or an "across-58 the-board" increase, may also be granted to magistrate assis-59 tants. For the purpose of determining the population served by 60 each magistrate, the number of magistrates authorized for each 61 county shall be divided into the population of each county. The 62 salary of the magistrate assistant shall be established by the 63 magistrate within the limits set forth in this section compensated equally. 64

(d) Beginning July 1, 2013, the annual salary of all magistrate assistants is \$39,348. After the effective date of this
section, a general salary increase granted to state employees,
whose salaries are not set by statute, expressed as a percentage
increase or an "across-the-board" increase, may also be granted
to magistrate assistants.

### §50-1-9a. Magistrate court deputy clerks; duties; salary.

1 (a) Whenever required by workload and upon the recom-2 mendation of the judge of the circuit court, or the chief judge of 3 the circuit court if there is more than one judge of the circuit 4 court, the Supreme Court of Appeals may, by rule, provide for 5 the appointment of magistrate court deputy clerks, not to exceed 6 seventy-two in number. The magistrate court deputy clerks shall be appointed by the judge of the circuit court, or the chief 7 8 judge if there is more than one judge of the circuit court, to 9 serve at his or her will and pleasure under the immediate 10 supervision of the magistrate court clerk.

11 (b) Magistrate court deputy clerks shall have the duties, 12 clerical or otherwise, as may be assigned by the magistrate court 13 clerk and as may be prescribed by the rules of the Supreme 14 Court of Appeals or the judge of the circuit court or the chief 15 judge if there is more than one judge of the circuit court. 16 Magistrate court deputy clerks may also exercise the power and 17 perform the duties of the magistrate court clerk as may be 18 delegated or assigned by the magistrate court clerk.

19 (c) A magistrate court deputy clerk may not be an immedi-20 ate family member of any a magistrate, magistrate court clerk, 21 magistrate assistant or judge of the circuit court within the same 22 county, may not have been convicted of a felony or any a 23 misdemeanor involving moral turpitude and must reside in this 24 state. For purposes of this subsection, "immediate family 25 member" means a mother, father, sister, brother, child or spouse. 26 (d) Magistrate court deputy clerks shall be paid an annual 27 salary by the state on the same basis and in the same amounts 28 established for magistrate assistants in each county, as provided 29 in section nine of this article compensated equally.

30 (e) Beginning July 1, 2013, the annual salary of all magis-

31 trate court deputy clerks is \$39,348. After the effective date of

32 this section, a general salary increase granted to state employees,

33 whose salaries are not set by statute, expressed as a percentage

34 increase or an "across-the-board" increase, may also be granted

35 to magistrate court deputy clerks.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide compensation of equal amount to all magistrates, magistrate assistants, magistrate court clerks and magistrate court deputy clerks within their respective job titles.
