## H. B. 2477

(BY DELEGATE(S) OVERINGTON, BARILL, CAPUTO, SOBONYA AND PERDUE)

[Introduced February 15, 2013; referred to the Committee on Roads and Transportation then the Judiciary.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-15-23 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to permitting certain auxiliary lighting on motorcycles.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §17C-15-23 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 15. EQUIPMENT.

- §17C-15-23. Lighting equipment on motorcycles, motor-driven cycles and mopeds.
  - 1 The head lamp or head lamps upon every motorcycle, motor-
  - 2 driven cycle and moped may be of the single-beam or multi-

- 3 ple-beam type but in either event shall comply with the require-
- 4 ments and limitations as follows:
- 5 (1) Every said head lamp or head lamps shall be of sufficient
- 6 intensity to reveal a person or a vehicle at a distance of not less
- 7 than one hundred feet when the motorcycle, motor-driven cycle
- 8 or moped is operated at any speed less than twenty-five miles per
- 9 hour and at a distance of not less than two hundred feet when it
- 10 is operated at a speed of twenty-five or more miles per hour.
- 11 (2) In the event If the motorcycle, motor-driven cycle or
- 12 moped is equipped with a multiple-beam type head lamp or head
- 13 lamps the upper beam shall meet the minimum requirements set
- 14 forth above and shall not exceed the limitations set forth in
- 15 section twenty (a) of this article and the lowermost beam shall
- 16 meet the requirements applicable to a lowermost distribution of
- 17 light as set forth in section twenty (b) of this article.
- 18 (3) In the event If the motorcycle, motor-driven cycle or
- 19 moped is equipped with a single-beam lamp or lamps, said the
- 20 lamp or lamps shall be so aimed that when the vehicle is loaded
- 21 none of the high-intensity portion of light, at a distance of
- 22 twenty-five feet ahead, shall project higher than the level of the
- 23 center of the lamp from which it comes.

- 24 (4) (A) Subject to paragraph (B) of this subdivision, a
- 25 motorcycle may be equipped with, and an operator of a motorcy-
- 26 cle may use, the following auxiliary lighting:
- 27 (i) Amber and white illumination;
- 28 (ii) Standard bulb running lights; or
- 29 (iii) Light-emitting diode pods and strips added to protect the
- 30 driver.
- 31 (B) Lighting under this subdivision shall be:
- 32 (i) Nonblinking;
- 33 (ii) Nonflashing;
- 34 (iii) Nonoscillating; and
- 35 (iv) Directed toward the engine and the drive train of the
- 36 motorcycle.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit certain auxiliary lighting on motorcycles.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
