10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$20-9-3$ and $\$20-9-4$ of the Code of West
11	Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to boat dock and
12	marina safety; extending the deadline for electrical
13	inspection, and extending the deadline for compliance with
14	this article.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That $$20-9-3$$ and $$20-9-4$$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
17	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 9. BOAT DOCK AND MARINA SAFETY REQUIREMENTS THE
19	MICHAEL CUNNINGHAM ACT.
20	§20-9-3. Boat dock and marina safety requirements-electrical shock
21	and electrocution.
22	All boat dock or marina owners or operators shall comply with
23	the following requirements to prevent electrical shock

- 1 electrocution or injury to users of their facilities and the 2 surrounding areas:
- 3 (1) All electrical wiring involving 110 AC or 220 AC shall be
- 4 installed by and maintained by a holder of a valid West Virginia
- 5 journeyman electrician license or master electrician license in
- 6 accordance with the most recently adopted versions of the National
- 7 Fire Protection Association's Standards for Marinas and Boatyards
- 8 (NFPA 303) and the National Electric Code (NFPA 70);
- 9 (2) Install ground fault circuit interrupters on all boat dock 10 and marina electrical wiring circuits; and
- 11 (3) Cause an inspection before August 1, 2014 January 1, 2015,
- 12 and at least once every three years thereafter by a West Virginia
- 13 licensed electrical inspector of all sources of electrical supply,
- 14 including ship-to-shore power pedestals, submergible pumps, and
- 15 sewage pump-out facilities, that could result in unsafe electrical
- 16 current in the water.
- 17 §20-9-4. Compliance date and enforcement.
- 18 Each boat dock and marina shall be in full compliance with
- 19 this article by August 1, 2014 <u>January 1, 2015.</u> The penalties
- 20 contained in section seven of this article apply only to conduct on
- 21 or after August 1, 2014 January 1, 2015. Enforcement of sections
- 22 three and four of this article regarding the work of electricians
- 23 shall be conducted by the State Fire Marshal.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to extend the deadlines for electrical inspections of boat docks and marinas, and compliance with Chapter 20, Article 9 of the West Virginia Code.
