10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$17C-7-3$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §17C-11-5 and
12	§17C-11-7 of said code, all relating to use of a bicycle on a
13	roadway; overtaking a bicycle on a roadway; providing
14	exceptions to the requirement bicycles ride as close as
15	practicable to the edge of the roadway; and allowing a person
16	to operate a bicycle without a bell or other device capable of
17	giving an audible signal.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
19	That §17C-7-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
20	be amended and reenacted; and that $\$17C-11-5$ and $\$17C-11-7$ of said
21	code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
22	ARTICLE 7. DRIVING ON RIGHT SIDE OF ROADWAY, OVERTAKING AND
23	PASSING, ETC.
24	§17C-7-3. Overtaking and passing vehicle or bicycle proceeding in
25	same direction Passing on the left generally;

penalty.

2 (a) The following rules shall govern the overtaking and 3 passing of vehicles proceeding in the same direction subject to 4 these limitations, exceptions, and special rules hereinafter 5 stated:

6 (1) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle 7 proceeding in the same direction shall give an audible signal and 8 pass to the left thereof of the overtaken vehicle at a safe 9 distance and shall may not again drive to the right side of the 10 roadway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.

11 (2) The driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle traveling in 12 the same direction shall pass to the left of the bicycle at a 13 distance of not less than three feet at a careful and reduced 14 speed, and may not again drive to the right side of the roadway 15 until safely clear of the overtaken bicycle.

16 (2)(3) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is 17 permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle shall give way to the 18 right in favor of the overtaking vehicle on audible signal and 19 shall <u>may</u> not increase the speed of his or her vehicle until 20 completely passed by the overtaking vehicle.

(b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is 22 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 23 fined not more than \$100; upon a second conviction within one year 24 thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200; and upon a third or

1 subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500.

2 ARTICLE 11. OPERATION OF BICYCLES AND PLAY VEHICLES.

3 §17C-11-5. Riding on roadways and bicycle paths.

4 (a) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall ride
5 as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable, exercising
6 due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the
7 same direction.

8 <u>(a) Any person operating a bicycle upon a roadway at less than</u> 9 <u>the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under the</u> 10 <u>conditions then existing shall ride in the lane marked for bicycle</u> 11 <u>use or, if no lane is marked for bicycle use, as close as</u> 12 <u>practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway except</u> 13 <u>under any of the following situations:</u>

14 (1) When overtaking and passing another bicycle or vehicle 15 proceeding in the same direction;

16 (2) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into 17 a private road or driveway; or

18 (3) When reasonably necessary to avoid any condition or 19 potential conflict, including, but not limited to, a fixed or 20 moving object, parked or moving vehicle, bicycle, pedestrian, 21 animal, surface hazard, turn lane, or substandard-width lane, which 22 makes it unsafe to continue along the right-hand curb or edge or 23 within a bicycle lane. For the purposes of this subsection, a 24 "substandard-width lane" is a lane that is too narrow for a bicycle 1 and another vehicle to travel safely side by side within the lane.
2 (b) Any person operating a bicycle upon a one-way highway with
3 two or more marked traffic lanes may ride as near the left-hand
4 curb or edge of such roadway as practicable.

5 (b)(c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall may not 6 ride more than two abreast except on paths or parts of roadways set 7 aside for the exclusive use of bicycles.

8 (c) Whenever a usable path for bicycles has been provided 9 adjacent to a roadway, bicycle riders shall use such path and shall 10 not use the roadway.

11 §17C-11-7. Lamps and other equipment on bicycles.

(a) Every bicycle when in use at nighttime shall be equipped is with a lamp on the front which shall emit emits a white light visible from a distance of at least five hundred feet to the front and with a red reflector on the rear of a type approved by the department which shall be visible from all distances from fifty feet to three hundred feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of head lamps on a motor vehicle. A lamp emitting a red light visible from a distance of five hundred feet to the rear may be used in addition to the red reflector.

21 (b) No person shall operate a bicycle unless it is equipped 22 with a bell or other device capable of giving a signal audible for 23 a distance of at least one hundred feet, except that a bicycle 24 shall not be equipped with nor shall any person use upon a bicycle

1 any siren or whistle.

2 (c) (b) Every bicycle shall be equipped with a brake which 3 will enable that enables the operator to make the braked wheels 4 skid on dry, level and clean pavement.
