10	A BILL to repeal $\$18-6-9$ and $\$18-6-10$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, to amend and reenact $\$18-6-1$ , $\$18-6-2$ , $\$18-$
12	6-4, $\$18-6-5$ and $\$18-6-8$ of said code, all relating to driver
13	education programs; repealing requirements on the State
14	Department of Education and county superintendents related to
15	instruction and licensing of commercial driver education
16	schools; removing the requirement that schools provide course
17	availability to out-of-school youths and adults; allowing
18	summer school offerings in driver education; prohibiting
19	charges to students for the course; authorizing permitted
20	instructors under certain circumstances; and allowing
21	successful completion of the course in commercial driving
22	school or class accepted by the state board to meet purposes
23	of article.

24 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

1 That \$18-6-9 and \$18-6-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, 2 as amended, be repealed; and that \$18-6-1, \$18-6-2, \$18-6-4, \$18-6-3 5 and \$18-6-8 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as 4 follows:

5 **ARTICLE 6. DRIVER EDUCATION.** 

## 6 §18-6-1. Purpose and objectives of article.

7 The purpose of this article is to ensure that every secondary school pupil has the opportunity, at or about the time he or she 8 reaches licensing age, to enroll in a course of driver education 9 10 designed to train him or her to drive skillfully and safely under all traffic and roadway conditions and circumstances. to make the 11 12 driver education course available to out-of-school youths and to 13 adults; and to ensure that commercial driver education schools achieve and maintain a level of driver education equal to the 14 15 minimum standards that are prescribed for secondary schools.

## 16 §18-6-2. Where provided; implementation deadlines; priorities for 17 course availability permit or certificate for persons

18 who are not professional educators to teach course.

No later than the first day of the public school term
 beginning in the year one thousand nine hundred seventy-three,

(a) There shall be offered in all public secondary schools
 within the state, <u>without charge to students</u>, an approved,
 comprehensive course in driver education. <u>The course may be offered</u>

- 1 in summer school in addition to the regular instructional term.
- As the first priority, the driver education course shall be made available at no cost to all secondary school pupils at or about the time they reach licensing age.

As the second priority, the driver education course shall be made available to all persons who do not attend secondary schools who have reached their sixteenth birthday and are under eighteen years of age. County boards of education may require the persons described in this paragraph who enroll in a public secondary school driver education course to pay tuition not to exceed \$50.

11 As the third priority, the driver education course shall be made available to all persons who do not attend secondary school 12 13 who are eighteen years of age or older, but first consideration for 14 persons in this age group shall be given to those who are applying 15 for their first operator's license. County boards of education may 16 require the persons described in this paragraph who enroll in a 17 public secondary school driver education course to pay tuition not to exceed \$75. 18

19 (b) In those counties where sufficient public secondary school 20 driver education courses are not available to meet all requests for 21 the course, county boards of education shall, as quickly as 22 possible, make sufficient courses available to fill those requests. 23 (c) Under the authority and subject to the conditions provided 24 in section two-a, article three, chapter eighteen-a of this code,

1	the State Superintendent may issue a permit or other certificate to
2	persons who do not qualify for the professional certificate for the
3	purpose of providing instruction in driver education subject to the
4	following:
5	(1) The applicant for the permit or certificate is subject to
6	the criminal history check of applicants for licensure provided in
7	section ten, article three, chapter eighteen-a of this code;
8	(2) The permit or certificate may not be given permanent
9	status, but may be renewed in accordance with rules adopted by the
10	State Department of Education;
11	(3) The duties of a person who has a valid permit or
12	certificate under this subsection may include the supervision of
13	students;
14	(4) The person, when providing instruction in the public
15	schools, may only be employed under a contract with the respective
16	county board of education that specifies the duties to be
17	performed, a rate of pay that is equivalent to the rate of pay for
18	professional educators in the district who accept similar duties as
19	extra duty assignments and provides for liability insurance
20	associated with the activity;
21	(5) The person may not be considered an employee of the board
22	for salary and benefit purposes other than as specified in the
23	<pre>contract;</pre>
24	(6) The person completes an orientation program designed and

1 <u>approved in accordance with State Department of Education rules;</u>
2 <u>and</u>

3 <u>(7) The position is posted annually and a professional</u> 4 educator fully certified for the position has not applied.

5 §18-6-4. Rules. and regulations

In accordance with article three-b, chapter twenty-nine-a of 6 7 this code, the state board shall, with the advice of the State 8 Superintendent and the Superintendent of the Department of Public 9 Safety State Police, adopt rules and regulations governing the establishment, conduct and scope of driver education for use in the 10 11 public, private and parochial and denominational secondary schools 12 located within this state, subject to the requirements and 13 exceptions set forth in this article.

14 §18-6-5. Establishment and maintenance of driver education course;

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who may enroll; exemption from learner's permit requirement; nonpermit student drivers.

17 The State Superintendent shall promote and direct the 18 establishment and maintenance of courses of instruction in driver education in secondary schools in accordance with the provisions of 19 20 this article and the rules that the state board adopts pursuant to 21 section four of this article. Directors, trustees or other persons having control or authority over private or parochial or 22 denominational secondary schools, who establish and maintain the 23 24 courses in the schools under their control or supervision, shall

1 comply with the rules that the state board adopts pursuant to
2 section four of this article.

In the case of a pupil who will not reach the age of fifteen years before completion of the driver education course in which enrolled, instruction shall be limited to the classroom. Pupils who are fifteen years of age and older shall receive instruction and practical training in the operation of motor vehicles on the public streets and highways.

9 Notwithstanding section three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code, any student who is at least fifteen years 10 11 of age and is enrolled in a driver education course in accordance 12 with the provisions of this article and the rules that the state 13 board adopts pursuant to section four of this article, may operate a motor vehicle on the roadways of West Virginia while accompanied 14 15 by a certified driver education teacher or instructor permitted by the state superintendent to provide driver education instruction. 16 §18-6-8. Driver education course to be made available to all 17 18 secondary school pupils prior to their graduation; exemption; application by pupil for unrestricted 19 20 operator's license.

Before any pupil is graduated graduates from a secondary school after September 1, 1975, he or she shall first be provided an opportunity and encouraged to successfully complete a driver education course approved by the state board in a public, private

or parochial or denominational secondary school within the state.
If a pupil has successfully completed a similar course in a secondary school of another state <u>or in a commercial driving school</u>
or <u>class</u> and the course is accepted by the state board as adequately meeting and complying with the course standards established by the state board, then the aforementioned requirement shall be deemed fulfilled regarding that pupil.

8 On or before December 31, 2000, any secondary school pupil 9 sixteen years of age or older, but under eighteen years of age, who 10 has successfully completed a driver education course approved by 11 the state board in a public, private, parochial or denominational secondary school within the state or a similar course in a 12 13 secondary school of another state and accepted by the state board 14 as adequately meeting and complying with the course standards 15 established by the state board, shall, upon proper application and 16 successful completion of all examination and driving tests required 17 by law for issuance of an operator's license to a person eighteen 18 years of age or older, be issued an operator's license without any 19 restriction rather than the junior or probationary operator's 20 license provided for in section three, article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code. On or after January 1, 2001, Any 21 22 secondary school pupil sixteen years of age or older, but under 23 eighteen years of age, who has successfully completed a driver education course approved by the state board in a public, private, 24

parochial or denominational secondary school within the state or a 1 similar course in a secondary school of another state or in a 2 commercial driving school or class and accepted by the state board 3 as adequately meeting and complying with the course standards 4 5 established by the state board, shall be exempted from submitting 6 a sworn affidavit certified by the parent, legal guardian, or other 7 responsible adult over the age of twenty-one that the applicant has 8 successfully completed the minimum number of hours of 9 behind-the-wheel training as provided in section three-a, article two, chapter seventeen-b of the code. 10
