22	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 2 CHAPTER 17B. MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER'S LICENSES.
- 3 ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL.
- 4 §17B-2-7b. Separate examination and endorsement for a license
- 5 valid for operation of motorcycle.
- (a) The state police shall administer a separate motorcycle 6 7 examination for applicants for a license valid for operation of a 8 motorcycle. On and after July 1, 2000 the Division of Motor 9 Vehicles shall administer the examination provided for in this 10 section. Any applicant for a license valid for operation of a 11 motorcycle shall be required to successfully complete the 12 motorcycle examination, which is in addition to the examination 13 administered pursuant to section seven of this article and, if 14 under the age of eighteen, shall be required to complete the 15 requirements for a level two intermediate driver's license set 16 forth in paragraphs (B), (C), and (D), subdivision (1), subsection 17 (j), section three-a of this article: Provided, That the 18 commissioner may exempt an applicant for a motorcycle driver 19 license or endorsement from all or part of the motorcycle license 20 examination as provided in section six, article one-d of this 21 chapter. The motorcycle examination shall test the applicant's 22 knowledge of the operation of a motorcycle and of any traffic laws 23 specifically relating to the operation of a motorcycle and shall

1 include an actual demonstration of the ability to exercise ordinary 2 and reasonable control in the operation of a motorcycle. An 3 applicant for a license valid for the operation of only a 4 motorcycle shall be tested as provided in this section and in 5 section seven of this article, but need not demonstrate actual 6 driving ability in any vehicle other than a motorcycle. 7 examination provided in this section shall not be made a condition 8 upon the renewal of the license of any person under this section. 9 For an applicant who successfully completes the motorcycle 10 examination, upon payment of the required fee, the division shall 11 issue a motorcycle endorsement on the driver's license of the 12 applicant, or shall issue a special motorcycle-only license if the 13 applicant does not possess a driver's license: Provided, however, 14 That any holder of a motorcycle-only license under the age of 15 eighteen shall be subject to the provisions of paragraphs (A), (B), 16 (E), (F), (G) and (H), subdivision (2), subsection (j), section 17 three-a of this article. Every person, including those holding a valid driver's 19 license, is required to take the examination specified in this 20 section to obtain a motorcycle license or endorsement, unless 21 exempted under the provisions of subsection (b) of this section. 22 (b) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a person 23 with a valid driver's license who is operating an autocycle as 24 defined in subsection (c) of this section is exempt from the

- 1 motorcycle examination, licensing and endorsement requirements set
- 2 forth in article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code.
- 3 (c) "Autocycle" means an enclosed motorcycle that is equipped
- 4 with safety belts, rollbar, windshield, wipers, steering wheel, and
- 5 equipment otherwise required on a motorcycle, and which has no more
- 6 than three wheels in contact with the roadway at any one time.
- 7 CHAPTER 17C. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND LAWS OF THE ROAD.

- 9 §17C-15-44. Safety equipment and requirements for motorcyclists,
- 10 motorcycles, motor-driven cycles and mopeds;
- 11 motorcycle safety standards and education

- 13 (a) No person shall operate or be a passenger on any
- 14 motorcycle or motor-driven cycle unless the person is wearing
- 15 securely fastened on his or her head by either a neck or chin strap
- 16 a protective helmet designed to deflect blows, resist penetration
- 17 and spread impact forces. Any helmet worn by an operator or
- 18 passenger shall meet the current performance specifications
- 19 established by the American National Standards Institute Standard,
- 20 Z 90.1, the United States Department of Transportation Federal
- 21 Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 218 or Snell Safety Standards for
- 22 Protective Headgear for Vehicle Users.
- 23 (b) No person shall operate or be a passenger on any

- 1 motorcycle or motor-driven cycle unless the person is wearing 2 safety, shatter-resistant eyeglasses (excluding contact lenses), or 3 eyegoggles or face shield that complies with the performance 4 specifications established by the American National Standards 5 Institute for Head, Eye and Respiratory Protection, Z 2.1. In 6 addition, if any motorcycle, motor-driven cycle or moped is 7 equipped with a windshield or windscreen, the windshield or 8 windscreen shall be constructed of safety, shatter-resistant 9 material that complies with the performance specifications 10 established by Department of Transportation Federal Motor Vehicle 11 Safety Standard No. 205 and American National Standards Institute, 12 Safety Glazing Materials for Glazing Motor Vehicles Operated on 13 Land Highways, Standard Z 26.1.
- 14 (c) No person shall operate a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle
 15 or moped on which the handlebars or grips are more than fifteen
 16 inches higher than the uppermost part of the operator's seat when
 17 the seat is not depressed in any manner.
- (d) A person operating a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle or moped shall ride in a seated position facing forward and only upon a permanent operator's seat attached to the vehicle. No operator shall carry any other person nor shall any other person ride on the vehicle unless the vehicle is designed to carry more than one person, in which event a passenger may ride behind the operator upon the permanent operator's seat if it is designed for two

- 1 persons, or upon another seat firmly attached to the vehicle to the
 2 rear of the operator's seat and equipped with footrests designed
 3 and located for use by the passenger or in a sidecar firmly
 4 attached to the vehicle. No person shall ride side saddle on a
 5 seat. An operator may carry as many passengers as there are seats
 6 and footrests to accommodate those passengers. Additional
 7 passengers may be carried in a factory produced sidecar provided
 8 that there is one passenger per seat. Passengers riding in a
 9 sidecar shall be restrained by safety belts.
- 10 (e) Every motorcycle, motor-driven cycle and moped shall be 11 equipped with a rearview mirror affixed to the handlebars or 12 fairings and adjusted so that the operator shall have a clear view 13 of the road and condition of traffic behind him or her for a 14 distance of at least two hundred feet.
- (f) There is hereby created a six member motorcycle safety and education committee consisting of: The superintendent of the State Police or a designee; the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles or a designee; the director of the West Virginia safety council or a designee; a licensed motorcycle operator; an owner of a motorcycle dealership; and a supplier of aftermarket nonfranchised motorcycle supplies. The nongovernmental representatives shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall serve without compensation, and the terms shall be for three years, except that as to the members first appointed, one shall be

- 1 appointed for a term of one year, one shall be appointed for a term
- 2 of two years and one shall be appointed for a term of three years.
- 3 Members may be reappointed to the committee.
- 4 (g) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a person
- 5 with a valid driver's license who is operating an autocyle as
- 6 defined in subsection (h) of this section is exempt from the
- 7 provisions of this section forty-four.
- 8 (h) "Autocycle" means an enclosed motorcycle that is equipped
- 9 with safety belts, rollbar, windshield, wipers, steering wheel, and
- 10 equipment otherwise required on a motorcycle, and which has no more
- 11 than three wheels in contact with the roadway at any one time.
- 12 The committee shall continue to exist pursuant to the
- 13 provisions of article ten, chapter four of this code until July 1,
- 14 1999, to allow for the completion of a preliminary performance
- 15 review by the joint committee on government operations.
- 16 The committee is hereby authorized to recommend to the
- 17 superintendent of public safety types and makes of protective
- 18 helmets, eye protection devices and equipment offered for sale,
- 19 purchased or used by any person. The committee is authorized to
- 20 make recommendations to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles
- 21 regarding the use of the moneys in the motorcycle safety fund
- 22 created under section seven, article one-d, chapter seventeen-b of
- 23 this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create an exemption for autocycles, which are enclosed three wheel motorcycles that are equipped with safety belts, a rollbar, a windshield, wipers and a steering wheel. A person may operate an autocycle with a valid driver's license and is exempt from the motorcycle examination, licensing and endorsement requirements set forth in article two, chapter seventeen-b of this code. The bill would also exempt autocycles from helmet and certain other safety requirements set forth in §17C-15-44.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
