11	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18C-3-2$ of the Code of West Virginia,
12	1931, as amended, relating to providing state aid for certain
13	students pursuing certain degrees; requiring a service
14	commitment to state for future students; setting forth
15	alternatives to service; requiring legislative rule; and
16	specifying rule provisions.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That §18C-3-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 3. HEALTH PROFESSIONALS STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS.
21	§18C-3-2. State aid for students of optometry, podiatry or
22	veterinary medicine.
23	(a) The board of trustees is hereby commission is authorized
24	to enter into a contract contracts with an educational institution
25	or institutions outside the state that offer training in optometry,

- 1 podiatry or veterinary medicine by the terms of which the board of
- 2 trustees commission may obligate itself to pay the institution,
- 3 within the limits of any appropriation made for the purpose, a
- 4 stated amount per year for each West Virginia student the
- 5 institution will agree to accept for training in optometry,
- 6 podiatry or veterinary medicine.
- 7 (b) Each year the board of trustees commission shall each year
- 8 send to any such appropriate institution a certified list of all
- 9 persons applying to the trustees commission for training in
- 10 optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine who are bona fide
- 11 citizens and residents of this state prior to the filing of their
- 12 applications, and who have completed either within or without the
- 13 state the course of study required by the institution as a
- 14 prerequisite to the study of optometry, podiatry or veterinary
- 15 medicine.
- 16 (c) Upon graduation from an educational institution for study
- 17 of optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine, a person who
- 18 <u>receives state aid under this section is required to:</u>
- 19 (1) Practice full time in this state in the field for which he
- 20 or she obtained financial aid, one year for every year the student
- 21 received aid under this section; or
- 22 (2) Reimburse the commission for the amount received under
- 23 this section.
- 24 (d) The commission shall propose a legislative rule in
- 25 accordance with the provisions of article three-a, chapter twenty-
- 26 nine-a of this code to implement the provisions of this section.

- 1 The rule shall address at least the following items:
- 2 (1) Eligibility and selection criteria;
- 3 (2) Reimbursement and repayment;
- 4 (3) Forgiveness options for death or disability;
- 5 (4) Forgiveness or deferment options for continuing education
- 6 in the field of study;
- 7 (5) Terms of an agreement to which the student must agree; and
- 8 <u>(6) An appeal process.</u>
- 9 (e) The provisions of subsection (c) of this section apply
- 10 only to those students entering into an agreement to receive state
- 11 aid to study optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine on or after
- 12 July 1, 2015.
- (f) If considered necessary by the commission, the provisions
- 14 of this section may be extended by legislative rule to other
- 15 professional degrees which are not provided in the state, but which
- 16 are needed to enhance the state's economy.
