8 9	FISCAL NOTE
10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$5A-3-37$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §6-13-1 of said
12	code, all relating to disabled veteran's preference
13	eligibility in hiring for state civil service jobs; and
14	resident vendor bidding on state contracts.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §5A-3-37 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted; and that $6-13-1$ of said code be amended
18	and reenacted, all to read as follows:
19	CHAPTER 5A. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION.
20	ARTICLE 3. PURCHASING DIVISION.
21	5A-3-37. Preference for resident vendors; preference for vendors
22	employing state residents; preference for veteran
23	residents; preference for disabled veteran residents;
24	exceptions.
25	(a) Effective beginning July 1, 1992, In any instance that a

1 purchase of commodities or printing by the director or by a state 2 department is required under the provisions of this article to be 3 made upon competitive bids, the successful bid shall be determined 4 as provided in this section.

5 <u>(b)</u> The Secretary of the Department of Revenue Administration 6 shall promulgate any propose rules for legislative approval 7 pursuant to the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a 8 of this code, necessary to:

9 (I) Determine that vendors have met the residence 10 residency requirements described in this section;

11 (ii) (2) Establish the procedure for vendors to certify the 12 residency requirements at the time of submitting their bids;

13 (iii) (3) Establish a procedure to audit bids which make a 14 claim for preference permitted by this section and to reject 15 noncomplying bids; and

16 (iv) otherwise (4) Accomplish the objectives of this section.
17 (c) In prescribing the rules, the secretary shall use a strict
18 construction of the residence residency requirements set forth in
19 this section.

20 (d) For purposes of this section, a successful bid shall be 21 determined and accepted as follows:

(1) From an individual resident vendor who has resided in West Overginia continuously for the four years immediately preceding the date on which the bid is submitted or from a partnership, sassociation, corporation resident vendor, or from a corporation nonresident vendor which has an affiliate or subsidiary which

1 employs a minimum of one hundred state residents and which has 2 maintained its headquarters or principal place of business within 3 West Virginia continuously for four years immediately preceding the 4 date on which the bid is submitted, if the vendor's bid does not 5 exceed the lowest qualified bid from a nonresident vendor by more 6 than two and one-half percent of the latter bid, and if the vendor 7 has made written claim for the preference at the time the bid was 8 submitted: Provided, That for purposes of this subdivision, any 9 partnership, association or corporation resident vendor of this 10 state, which does not meet the requirements of this subdivision 11 solely because of the continuous four-year residence residency 12 requirement, shall be considered to meet the requirement if at 13 least eighty percent of the ownership interest of the resident 14 vendor is held by another individual, partnership, association or 15 corporation resident vendor who otherwise meets the requirements of 16 this subdivision, including the continuous four-year residency Provided, however, That the Secretary of the 17 requirement: Revenue Administration shall promulgate rules 18 Department of 19 relating to attribution of ownership among several resident vendors 20 for purposes of determining the eighty percent ownership 21 requirement; or

(2) From a resident vendor, if, for purposes of producing or distributing the commodities or completing the project which is the subject of the vendor's bid and continuously over the entire term of the project, on average at least seventy-five percent of the vendor's employees are residents of West Virginia who have resided

1 in the state continuously for the two immediately preceding years, 2 and the vendor's bid does not exceed the lowest qualified bid from 3 a nonresident vendor by more than two and one-half percent of the 4 latter bid, and if the vendor has certified the residency 5 requirements of this subdivision and made written claim for the 6 preference, at the time the bid was submitted; or

(3) From a nonresident vendor, which employs a minimum of one 7 8 hundred state residents or a nonresident vendor which has an 9 affiliate or subsidiary which maintains its headquarters or 10 principal place of business within West Virginia and which employs 11 a minimum of one hundred state residents, if, for purposes of 12 producing or distributing the commodities or completing the project 13 which is the subject of the vendor's bid and continuously over the 14 entire term of the project, on average at least seventy-five 15 percent of the vendor's employees or the vendor's affiliate's or 16 subsidiary's employees are residents of West Virginia who have 17 resided in the state continuously for the two immediately preceding 18 years and the vendor's bid does not exceed the lowest qualified bid 19 from a nonresident vendor by more than two and one-half percent of 20 the latter bid, and if the vendor has certified the residency 21 requirements of this subdivision and made written claim for the 22 preference, at the time the bid was submitted; or

(4) From a vendor who meets either the requirements of both 24 subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection, or subdivisions (1) 25 and (3) of this subsection, if the bid does not exceed the lowest 26 qualified bid from a nonresident vendor by more than five percent

1 of the latter bid, and if the vendor has certified the residency 2 requirements above and made written claim for the preference at the 3 time the bid was submitted; or

4 (5) From an individual resident vendor who is a veteran of the 5 United States Armed Forces, the Reserves or the National Guard and 6 has resided in West Virginia continuously for the four years 7 immediately preceding the date on which the bid is submitted, if 8 the vendor's bid does not exceed the lowest qualified bid from a 9 nonresident vendor by more than three and one-half percent of the 10 latter bid, and if the vendor has made written claim for the 11 preference at the time the bid was submitted; or

12 (6) From an individual resident vendor who is a disabled 13 veteran, as defined in subsection (e) of this section, and has 14 resided in West Virginia continuously for the four years 15 immediately preceding the date on which the bid is submitted, if 16 the vendor's bid does not exceed the lowest qualified bid from a 17 nonresident vendor by more than four and one-half percent of the 18 latter bid, and if the vendor has made written claim for the 19 preference at the time the bid was submitted; or

20 (6) (7) From a resident vendor who is a veteran of the United 21 States Armed Forces, the Reserves or the National Guard, if, for 22 purposes of producing or distributing the commodities or completing 23 the project which is the subject of the vendor's bid and 24 continuously over the entire term of the project, on average at 25 least seventy-five percent of the vendor's employees are residents 26 of West Virginia who have resided in the state continuously for the

1 two immediately preceding years and the vendor's bid does not 2 exceed the lowest qualified bid from a nonresident vendor by more 3 than three and one-half percent of the latter bid, and if the 4 vendor has certified the residency requirements of this subdivision 5 and made written claim for the preference, at the time the bid was 6 submitted; or

7 (8) From a resident vendor who is a disabled veteran, as 8 defined in subsection (e) of this section, if, for purposes of 9 producing or distributing the commodities or completing the project 10 which is the subject of the vendor's bid and continuously over the 11 entire term of the project, on average at least seventy-five 12 percent of the vendor's employees are residents of West Virginia 13 who have resided in the state continuously for the two immediately 14 preceding years and the vendor's bid does not exceed the lowest 15 gualified bid from a nonresident vendor by more than four and one-16 half percent of the latter bid, and if the vendor has certified the 17 residency requirements of this subdivision and made written claim 18 for the preference, at the time the bid was submitted; or

19 (7) (9) Notwithstanding any provisions of subdivisions (1), 20 (2), (3), (4), (5), or (6), (7) or (8) of this subsection to the 21 contrary, if any nonresident vendor that is bidding on the purchase 22 of commodities or printing by the director or by a state department 23 is also certified as a small, women or minority-owned business 24 pursuant to section fifty-nine of this article, the nonresident 25 vendor shall be provided the same preference made available to any 26 resident vendor under the provisions of this subsection.

1 <u>(e) For purposes of this section, "disabled veteran" means an</u> 2 <u>individual who has served on active duty in the armed forces, has</u> 3 <u>been separated therefrom under honorable conditions, and has</u> 4 <u>established the present existence of a service-connected disability</u> 5 <u>or is receiving compensation, disability retirement benefits, or</u> 6 <u>pension because of a public statute administered by the Department</u> 7 <u>of Veterans Affairs or a military department.</u>

8 (b) (f) If the Secretary of the Department of Revenue 9 <u>Administration</u> determines under any audit procedure that a vendor 10 who received a preference under this section fails to continue to 11 meet the requirements for the preference at any time during the 12 term of the project for which the preference was received the 13 secretary may:

14 (1) Reject the vendor's bid; or

15 (2) Assess a penalty against the vendor of not more than five 16 percent of the vendor's bid on the project.

(c) (g) Political subdivisions of the state including county boards of education may grant the same preferences to any vendor of this state who has made a written claim for the preference at the time a bid is submitted, but for the purposes of this subsection, in determining the lowest bid, any political subdivision shall exclude from the bid the amount of business occupation taxes which must be paid by a resident vendor to any municipality within the county comprising or located within the political subdivision as a result of being awarded the contract which is the object of the bid; in the case of a bid received by a municipality, the

1 municipality shall exclude only the business and occupation taxes 2 as will be paid to the municipality: Provided, That prior to 3 soliciting any competitive bids, any political subdivision may, by 4 majority vote of all its members in a public meeting where all the 5 votes are recorded, elect not to exclude from the bid the amount of 6 business and occupation taxes as provided in this subsection.

7 (d) (h) If any of the requirements or provisions set forth in 8 this section jeopardize the receipt of federal funds, then the 9 requirement or provisions are void and of no force and effect for 10 that specific project.

(e) (i) If any provision or clause of this section or 11 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, 13 the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of 14 this section which can be given effect without the invalid 15 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 16 section are severable.

(f) (j) This section may be cited as the "Jobs for West 17 18 Virginians Act of 1990."

CHAPTER 6. GENERAL PROVISIONS RESPECTING OFFICERS. 19

20 ARTICLE 13. PREFERENCE RATING OF VETERANS ON WRITTEN EXAMINATION 21

ON NONPARTISAN MERIT BASIS.

22 §6-13-1. Preference rating of veterans on written examinations for 23 positions in state departments filled under nonpartisan merit system. 24

25 (a) For positions in any agency, as defined in section four,

1 article one, chapter five-f of this code, or any other political 2 subdivision of this state in which positions are filled under civil 3 service or any job classification system, a preference of five 4 points in addition to the regular numerical score received on 5 examination shall be awarded to all veterans <u>and disabled veterans</u> 6 having qualified for appointment by making a minimum passing grade; 7 and to all veterans awarded the Purple Heart, or <del>having a</del> 8 <del>compensable service-connected disability, as established by any</del> 9 <del>proper veterans' bureau or department of the federal government</del> 10 disabled veterans, an additional five points shall be allowed.

10 (b) For purposes of this article, a person shall receive 12 "disabled veteran" preference if he or she has served on active 13 duty in the Armed Forces, has been separated therefrom under 14 honorable conditions, and has established the present existence of 15 a service-connected disability or is receiving compensation, 16 disability retirement benefits, or pension because of a public 17 statute administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs or a 18 military department;

19 <u>(c)</u> For the purpose purposes of this article, a person is 20 defined as a "veteran" if he or she fulfills the requirements of 21 one of the following subsections <u>subdivisions:</u>

(a) (1) Served on active duty anytime between December 7, (a) (1) Served on active duty anytime between December 7, 23 1941, and July 1, 1955. However, any person who was a reservist 24 called to active duty between February 1, 1955, and October 14, 25 1976, must meet condition (b) stated below subdivision (2) of this 26 subsection;

1 (b) (2) Served on active duty anytime between July 2, 1955, 2 and October 14, 1976, or a reservist called to active duty between 3 February 1, 1955, and October 14, 1976, and who served for more 4 than one hundred eighty days;

5 (c) (3) Entered on active duty between October 15, 1976, and 6 September 7, 1980, or a reservist who entered on active duty 7 between October 15, 1976, and October 13, 1982, and received a 8 campaign badge or expeditionary medal; or is a disabled veteran; or

9 (d) (4) Enlisted in the Armed Forces after September 7, 1980, 10 or entered active duty other than by enlistment on or after October 11 14, 1982, and (1) completed twenty-four months of continuous active 12 duty or the full period called or ordered to active duty, or was 13 discharged under 10 U.S.C. 1171, or for hardship under 10 U.S.C. 14 1173, and received or was entitled to receive a campaign badge or 15 expeditionary medal. or (2) Is a disabled veteran.

16 (d) To receive veteran preference, separation from active duty 17 must have been under honorable conditions. This includes honorable 18 and general discharges. A clemency discharge does not meet the 19 requirements of the Veteran Preference Act. Active duty for 20 training in the military reserve and National Guard programs is not 21 considered active duty for purposes of veteran preference.

(e) These awards shall be made for the benefit and preference an appointment of all veterans who have heretofore or who shall hereafter take examinations, but shall not operate to the detriment of any person heretofore appointed to a position in a department or agency.
