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10 AN ACT to amend and reenact §8-5-7 of the Code of West Virginia,  
11 1931, as amended, relating to increasing or decreasing the  
12 number of municipal wards or election districts and council  
13 members.

14 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

15 That §8-5-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be  
16 amended and reenacted to read as follows:

17 **ARTICLE 5. ELECTION, APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATION AND COMPENSATION**  
18 **OF OFFICERS; GENERAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO OFFICERS**  
19 **AND EMPLOYEES; ELECTIONS AND PETITIONS GENERALLY;**  
20 **CONFLICT OF INTEREST.**

21 **§8-5-7. Certain officers; wards or election districts; residency**  
22 **and other requirements.**

23 (a) Unless otherwise provided in the charter of a

1 municipality, there shall be elected a mayor, a recorder and  
2 council members, who together shall form the governing body of the  
3 municipality.

4 (b) When a municipality has not been divided into wards or  
5 election districts, there shall be at least five council members,  
6 but when the municipality has been divided into wards or election  
7 districts, the governing body may, by ordinance, determine the  
8 number of council members to be elected from each ward or election  
9 district. When it is considered necessary, the governing body may,  
10 by ordinance, increase or decrease the number of wards or election  
11 districts and change the boundaries thereof, the wards or election  
12 districts to be made as nearly equal as may be, in population, and  
13 when the municipality is divided into wards or election districts,  
14 or there is an increase or decrease in the number of wards or  
15 election districts as aforesaid, the governing body may increase or  
16 decrease the number of council members and, in the case of an  
17 increase in the number of council members, direct an election to be  
18 held at the next regular municipal election in the additional ward  
19 or wards or election district or districts so that each ward or  
20 election district may have its full number of council members  
21 residing therein and may have equal representation on the governing  
22 body. When a municipality has been divided into wards or election  
23 districts, the governing body may, by ordinance, also provide for  
24 the election of council members at large in addition to the council

1 members to be elected from each ward or election district. The  
2 provisions of this subsection are applicable to any municipality  
3 except to the extent otherwise provided in the charter of the  
4 municipality.

5 (c) Unless otherwise provided by charter provision or  
6 ordinance, the mayor, recorder and council members must be  
7 residents of the municipality and must be qualified voters entitled  
8 to vote for members of its governing body. A city manager in a  
9 manager form of government need only be a resident of the city at  
10 the time of his or her appointment.
