10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$19-23-10$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
11	1931, as amended, relating to distributing money that was set	
12	aside from the West Virginia Greyhound Breeder Development	
13	Fund for two dog training track facilities during the period	
14	of 1996 through 2001 to the Secondary Road Maintenance Fund.	
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
16	That §19-23-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
18	ARTICLE 23. HORSE AND DOG RACING.	
19	§19-23-10. Daily license tax; pari-mutuel pools tax; how taxes	
20	<pre>paid; alternate tax; credits.</pre>	
21	(a) Any racing association conducting thoroughbred racing at	
22	any horse racetrack in this state shall pay each day upon which	
23	horse races are run a daily license tax of \$250. Any racing	
24	association conducting harness racing at any horse racetrack in	
25	this state shall pay each day upon which horse races are run a	
26	daily license tax of \$150. Any racing association conducting dog	
27	races shall pay each day upon which dog races are run a daily	
28	license tax of \$150. In the event thoroughbred racing, harness	

1 racing, dog racing, or any combination of the foregoing are 2 conducted on the same day at the same racetrack by the same racing 3 association, only one daily license tax in the amount of \$250 shall 4 be paid for that day. Any <u>The</u> daily license tax shall <u>does</u> not 5 apply to any local, county or state fair, horse show or 6 agricultural or livestock exposition at which horse racing is 7 conducted for not more than six days.

(b) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission 8 9 to conduct thoroughbred racing and permitting and conducting pari-10 mutuel wagering under the provisions of this article shall, in 11 addition to the daily license tax set forth in subsection (a) of 12 this section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission 13 deducted each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on 14 thoroughbred racing а tax calculated on the total dailv 15 contribution of all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any and 16 every thoroughbred race meeting of the licensee licensed under the 17 provisions of this article. The tax, on the pari-mutuel pools 18 conducted or made each day during the months of January, February, 19 March, October, November and December, shall be calculated at four 20 tenths of one percent of the pool; and, on the pari-mutuel pools 21 conducted or made each day during all other months, shall be 22 calculated at one and four-tenths percent of the pool: Provided, 23 That out of the amount realized from the three tenths of one 24 percent decrease in the tax effective for fiscal year 1991 and 25 thereafter, which decrease correspondingly increases the amount of 26 commission retained by the licensee, the licensee shall annually 27 expend or dedicate: (I) One half of the realized amount for 28 capital improvements in its barn area at the track, subject to the

1 Racing Commission's prior approval of the plans for the 2 improvements; and (ii) the remaining one half of the realized 3 amount for capital improvements as the licensee may determine 4 appropriate at the track. The term "capital improvement" shall be 5 as defined by the Internal Revenue Code: Provided, however, That 6 any racing association operating a horse racetrack in this state 7 having an average daily pari-mutuel pool on horse racing of 8 \$280,000 or less per day for the race meetings of the preceding 9 calendar year shall, in lieu of payment of the pari-mutuel pool 10 tax, calculated as in this subsection, be permitted to conduct 11 pari-mutuel wagering at the horse racetrack on the basis of a daily 12 pari-mutuel pool tax fixed as follows: On the daily pari-mutuel 13 pool not exceeding \$300,000 the daily pari-mutuel pool tax shall be 14 \$1,000 plus the otherwise applicable percentage rate imposed by 15 this subsection of the daily pari-mutuel pool, if any, in excess of 16 \$300,000: Provided further, That upon the effective date of the 17 reduction of the daily pari-mutuel pool tax to \$1,000 from the 18 former \$2,000, the association or licensee shall daily deposit \$500 19 into the special fund for regular purses established by subdivision 20 (1), subsection (b), section nine of this article: And provided 21 further, That if an association or licensee qualifying for the 22 foregoing alternate tax conducts more than one racing performance, 23 each consisting of up to thirteen races in a calendar day, the 24 association or licensee shall pay both the daily license tax 25 imposed in subsection (a) of this section and the alternate tax in 26 this subsection for each performance: And provided further, That 27 a licensee qualifying for the foregoing alternate tax is excluded 28 from participation in the fund established by section thirteen-b of

1 this article: And provided further, That this exclusion shall does
2 not apply to any thoroughbred racetrack at which the licensee has
3 participated in the West Virginia Thoroughbred Development Fund for
4 more than four consecutive years prior to December 31, 1992.

5 (c) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission 6 to conduct harness racing and permitting and conducting pari-mutuel 7 wagering under the provisions of this article shall, in addition to 8 the daily license tax required under subsection (a) of this 9 section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission deducted 10 each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on harness 11 racing, as a tax, three percent of the first \$100,000 wagered, or 12 any part thereof; four percent of the next \$150,000; and five and 13 three-fourths percent of all over that amount wagered each day in 14 all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any and every harness 15 race meeting of the licensee licensed under the provisions of this 16 article.

(d) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission to conduct dog racing and permitting and conducting pari-mutuel ywagering under the provisions of this article shall, in addition to the daily license tax required under subsection (a) of this section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission deducted each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on dog racing, as a tax, four percent of the first \$50,000 or any part thereof of the pari-mutuel pools, five percent of the next \$50,000 of the pari-mutuel pools, six percent of the next \$100,000 of the parimutuel pools, seven percent of the next \$150,000 wagered each day: *Provided*, That the licensee shall deduct daily from the pari-mutuel

1 tax an amount equal to one tenth of one percent of the daily pari-2 mutuel pools in dog racing in fiscal year 1990; fifteen hundredths 3 of one percent in fiscal year 1991; two tenths of one percent in 4 fiscal year one 1992; one quarter of one percent in fiscal year 5 1993; and three tenths of one percent in fiscal year 1994 and every 6 fiscal year thereafter after. The amounts deducted shall be paid 7 to the Racing Commission to be deposited by the Racing Commission 8 in a banking institution of its choice in a special account to be 9 known as "West Virginia Racing Commission-Special Account-West 10 Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund". The purpose of the 11 fund is to promote better breeding, training track facilities and 12 racing of greyhounds in the state through awards and purses to bona 13 fide resident registered greyhound owners of accredited West 14 Virginia whelped greyhounds. In order to participate and be 15 eligible to receive an award or purse through the fund, the 16 registered greyhound owner must have an appropriate license from 17 the Racing Commission to race in West Virginia. The registered 18 greyhound dam at the time of breeding must be wholly or solely 19 owned or leased by a bona fide resident or residents of West 20 Virginia. The accredited West Virginia whelped greyhound must be 21 wholly or solely owned by a bona fide resident or residents of this 22 state. To qualify as a bona fide resident of West Virginia, a 23 registered greyhound owner may not claim residency in any other 24 state. A registered greyhound owner must prove bona fide residency 25 by providing to the commission personal income tax returns filed in 26 the State of West Virginia for the most recent tax year and the 27 three previous tax years, has real or personal property in this 28 state on which the owner has paid real or personal property taxes

1 during the most recent tax year and the previous three tax years 2 and an affidavit stating that the owner claims no other state of 3 residency. The Racing Commission shall maintain a registry for 4 West Virginia bred greyhounds. The moneys shall be expended by the 5 Racing Commission for purses for stake races, training track 6 facilities, supplemental purse awards, administration, promotion 7 and educational programs involving West Virginia whelped dogs, 8 owned by residents of this state under rules promulgated by the The Racing Commission shall pay out of the 9 Racing Commission. 10 Greyhound Breeding Development Fund to each of the licensed dog 11 racing tracks the sum of \$75,000 for the fiscal year ending June 12 30, 1994. The licensee shall deposit the sum into the special fund 13 for regular purses established under the provisions of section nine 14 of this article. The funds shall be expended solely for the 15 purpose of supplementing regular purses under rules promulgated by 16 the Racing Commission.

17 Supplemental purse awards will be distributed as follows: 18 Supplemental purses shall be paid directly to the registered 19 greyhound owner of an accredited greyhound.

The registered greyhound owner of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds that earn points at any West Virginia meet will receive a bonus award calculated at the end of each month as a percentage of the fund dedicated to the owners as purse supplements, which shall be a minimum of fifty percent of the total moneys deposited into the West Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund monthly.

The total amount of the fund available for the owners' awards shall be distributed according to the ratio of points earned by an

1 accredited greyhound to the total amount earned in races by all 2 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds for that month as a 3 percentage of the funds dedicated to the owners' purse supplements. 4 The point value at all greyhound tracks shall be the same as 5 approved by the Racing Commission to be effective April 1, 2007. 6 The West Virginia Greyhound Owners and Breeders Association shall 7 submit a list of any additions or deletions to the registry of 8 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds on the first of each 9 month. The Racing Commission shall <u>may</u> not require anyone to be a 10 member of a particular association in order to participate in the 11 West Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund.

12 The registered greyhound owner of an accredited West Virginia 13 whelped greyhound shall file a purse distribution form with the 14 Racing Commission for a percentage of his or her dog's earnings to 15 be paid directly to the registered greyhound owner or owners of the 16 greyhound. Distribution shall be made on the fifteenth day of each 17 month for the preceding month's achievements.

In no event shall may points earned at a meet held at a track which did not make contributions to the West Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund out of the daily pool on the day the meet was held qualify or count toward eligibility for supplemental purse awards.

Any balance in the purse supplement funds after all distributions have been made for the year revert to the general account of the fund for distribution in the following year: Provided, That not more than \$2,000,000 from the balance in the purse supplemental fund shall be used for the construction and maintenance of two dog training track facilities if such be

1 approved by the Racing Commission: *Provided, however,* That not 2 more than \$1,000,000 may be allocated for the construction and 3 maintenance of each training track: *Provided further,* That both 4 training track facilities must be located in West Virginia. The 5 West Virginia Racing Commission shall be authorized to promulgate 6 rules governing dog training tracks: *And provided further,* That 7 the Racing Commission shall (1) provide a process in its rules for 8 competitive bidding of the construction or maintenance, or both, of 9 the training tracks, and (2) set standards to assure that only the 10 actual costs of construction and maintenance shall be paid out of 11 the foregoing fund. All money set aside under this paragraph for 12 two dog training facilities shall be distributed by the West 13 Virginia Racing Commission to the Secondary Road Maintenance Fund. 14 All money shall be distributed by June 30, 2014.

In an effort to further promote the breeding of quality West If Virginia whelped greyhounds, a bonus purse supplement shall be restablished in the amount of \$50,000 per annum, to be paid in equal quarterly installments of \$12,500 per quarter using the same method to calculate and distribute these funds as the regular supplemental purse awards. This bonus purse supplement is for three years only, commencing on July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1996. This money would come from the current existing balance in the Greyhound Development Fund.

Each pari-mutuel greyhound track shall provide stakes races for accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds: *Provided*, That each pari-mutuel track shall have one juvenile and one open stake race annually. Each pari-mutuel dog track shall provide at least three restricted races for accredited West Virginia whelped

1 greyhounds per race card: Provided, however, That sufficient dogs 2 are available. To assure breeders of accredited West Virginia 3 whelped greyhounds an opportunity to participate in the West 4 Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund the West Virginia 5 Racing Commission by July 1, each year shall establish and announce 6 the minimum number of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds 7 that greyhound racing kennels at West Virginia dog tracks must have 8 on their racing active list during the calendar year following such The minimum number may vary from dog track to dog track. 9 action. 10 The minimum number shall be established after consultation with the 11 West Virginia Greyhound Owners and Breeders Association and kennel 12 owners and operators. Factors to be considered in establishing this 13 minimum number shall be are the number of individually registered 14 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds whelped in the previous 15 two years, the number of all greyhounds seeking qualification at 16 each West Virginia dog track, the ratio of active running 17 greyhounds to housed number of greyhounds at each West Virginia dog 18 track and the size and number of racing kennels at each West 19 Virginia dog track. Any greyhound racing kennel not having the 20 minimum number of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds 21 determined by the West Virginia Racing Commission on their active 22 list shall is only be permitted to race the maximum allowable 23 number on the active list less the number of accredited West 24 Virginia whelped greyhounds below the established minimum number. 25 Consistent violations of this minimum requirement may be reviewed 26 by the Racing Commission and may constitute be cause for denial or 27 revocation of a kennel's racing license. The Racing Commission 28 shall oversee and approve racing schedules and purse amounts.

1 Ten percent of the deposits into the Greyhound Breeding 2 Development Fund beginning July 1, 1993 and continuing each year 3 thereafter, after, shall be withheld by the Racing Commission and 4 placed in a special revenue account hereby created in the State 5 Treasury called the "Administration, Promotion and Educational and 6 Capital Improvement Account". The Racing Commission is authorized 7 to expend the moneys deposited in the Administration, Promotion and 8 Educational and Capital Improvement Account at such times and in 9 such amounts as the commission determines to be necessary for 10 purposes of administering and promoting the greyhound development Provided, That beginning with fiscal year 1995 and in 11 program: 12 each fiscal year thereafter after in which the commission 13 anticipates spending any money from the account, the commission 14 shall submit to the executive department during the budget 15 preparation period prior to the Legislature convening before that 16 fiscal year for inclusion in the executive budget document and 17 budget bill, the recommended expenditures, as well as requests of 18 appropriations for the purpose of administration, promotion and 19 education. The commission shall make an annual report to the 20 Legislature on the status of the administration, promotion and 21 education account, including the previous year's expenditures and 22 projected expenditures for the next year.

The Racing Commission, for the fiscal year 1994 only, may expend up to \$35,000 from the West Virginia greyhound breeding development fund to accomplish the purposes of this section without strictly following the requirements in the previous paragraph. (e) All daily license and pari-mutuel pools tax payments required under the provisions of this section shall be made to the

1 Racing Commission or its agent after the last race of each day of 2 each horse or dog race meeting, and the pari-mutuel pools tax 3 payments shall be made from all contributions to all pari-mutuel 4 pools to each and every race of the day.

5 (f) Every association or licensee subject to the provisions of 6 this article, including the changed provisions of sections nine and 7 ten of this article, shall annually submit to the Racing Commission 8 and the Legislature financial statements, including a balance 9 sheet, income statement, statement of change in financial position 10 and an audit of any electronic data system used for pari-mutuel 11 tickets and betting, prepared in accordance with generally accepted 12 auditing standards, as certified by an experienced public 13 accountant or a certified public accountant.
