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LO	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-1-3a$ of the Code of West Virginia,
L1	1931, as amended, relating to voting for president and vice
L2	president; and permitting voters who have moved to vote for

L 4	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
L 5	That §3-1-3a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
L 6	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
L 7	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.
L 8	§3-1-3a. Persons entitled to vote under federal Voting Rights Act
L 9	Amendments of 1970; authority of Secretary of State.
20	(1) Any citizen of the United States who is a resident of the
21	state and who applies, not later than thirty days immediately prior
22	to any presidential election for registration or qualification to
23	vote for the choice of electors for president and vice-president,

1 or for president and vice-president, in such election, and who is

2 otherwise qualified to vote, may register to vote, and vote, for

3 the choice of electors for president and vice-president, or for

4 president and vice-president, in such election, as provided by the

5 federal Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970.

6 (2) Any citizen of the United States who has moved his or her 7 residence from this state within thirty days next preceding any 8 election for president and vice-president, and who was otherwise 9 qualified to vote in this state as of the date of his or her change residence and who has not satisfied the registration 11 requirements of the state to which he or she has moved, may vote 12 for the choice of electors for president and vice-president, or for 13 president and vice-president, in such election, as provided by the 14 federal Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970. cast a vote for the 15 offices of president and vice-president: (A) In person in the 16 precinct where he or she was registered immediately prior to 17 moving; (B) in person at any designated early voting location 18 serving the precinct from which the voter has moved; or (C) by 19 absentee ballot. The voter's request for a ballot due to a move 20 out-of-state after the thirtieth day preceding the election shall 21 serve as authorization for removal from the West Virginia voter 22 rolls as provided in the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, 23 42 U.S.C. §1973qq-6. The request for the ballot must be on a form

- 1 prescribed by the Secretary of State and, in the case of an
- 2 absentee ballot, must be received by the clerk of the county
- 3 commission of the last county of residence no later than the sixth
- 4 day prior to the general election.
- 5 (3) Any citizen of the United States who is otherwise
- 6 qualified to vote in any election for president and vice-president
- 7 shall not be denied the right to vote for those offices due to the
- 8 failure to comply with any durational residency requirement of the
- 9 state or political subdivision.
- 10 (4) No citizen of the United States may be denied the right to
- 11 vote for electors for president and vice-president, or for
- 12 president and vice-president, in any election because of failure of
- 13 the citizen to be physically present in the state or political
- 14 subdivision at the time of the election if the citizen has complied
- 15 with the requirements prescribed by the laws of this state for the
- 16 casting of an absentee ballot in the election.
- (3) (5) Any citizen of the United States who has attained the
- 18 age of eighteen years but who has not attained the age of
- 19 twenty-one years by the time of the next ensuing primary or
- 20 election in which he may vote under section 302 of the federal
- 21 Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and limited by
- 22 the United States Supreme Court, and who is otherwise qualified to
- 23 vote, may vote in any primary or election for those candidates for

1 whom he or she is entitled to vote under said section 302 of the

2 federal Voting Rights Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and

3 limited by the United States supreme court.

(4) (6) The Secretary of State shall have authority to make, 5 amend and rescind such rules, regulations, orders and instructions, 6 and prescribe such registration and voting procedures, forms 7 (including registration, ballot and ballot label forms), lists and 8 records, as may be necessary in order for this state to fully 9 implement, and comply with, the federal voting laws Voting Rights 10 Act Amendments of 1970, as interpreted and limited by the United 11 States supreme court, and it shall be the duty of all public 12 officers, election officers, boards and commissioners having any 13 authority or responsibility in connection with any election, to 14 comply with all such rules, regulations, orders and instructions, 15 and use, make, follow or comply with all such registration and 16 voting procedures, forms (including registration, ballot and ballot 17 label forms), lists and records as have been prescribed by the 18 Secretary of State under the foregoing authority vested in that 19 office.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to conform the Code of West Virginia to federal requirements for presidential office ballots for registered voters moving from the state.
