16	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
17	That §18C-3-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
18	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 3. HEALTH PROFESSIONALS STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS.

21	<u>Service Program;</u> establishment; administration;
22	eligibility.
23	(a) Legislative findings The Legislature finds that there
24	is a critical need for additional practicing health care

1 professionals in West Virginia. Therefore, there is hereby created 2 a health sciences scholarship program health sciences service 3 program to be administered by the Vice Chancellor for Health 4 Sciences. The purpose of this program is to provide an incentive 5 for health professional students to complete their training and 6 provide primary care in underserved areas of West Virginia.

7 (b) Establishment of Special account. -- There is hereby 8 established <u>continued</u> a special revolving fund account under the 9 Higher Education Policy Commission in the State Treasury to be 10 <u>formerly</u> known as the "Health Sciences Scholarship Fund" <u>and</u> 11 <u>hereafter designated the "Health Sciences Service Program Fund."</u> 12 <u>The fund that shall be used to carry out accomplish the purposes of</u> 13 this section. The fund <u>shall consist of one or more consists of</u> 14 <u>any</u> of the following:

(1) All unexpended health sciences scholarship funds on l6 deposit in the State Treasury on the effective date of this 17 section;

(2) Appropriations as may be provided by the Legislature;
(3) Repayments, including interest as set by the Vice
Chancellor for Health Sciences, collected from scholarship program
<u>award</u> recipients who fail to practice or teach in West Virginia
under the terms of the scholarship agreement as set forth under
this section; or <u>an award agreement</u> or the health sciences

1 scholarship program previously established by this section; and

(4) Amounts that may become available from other sources.
Balances remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year
4 shall do not expire or revert to the general revenue. All costs
5 associated with the administration of this section shall be paid
6 from the Health Sciences Scholarship Service Program Fund under the
7 direction of the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences.

8 (c) Eligibility requirements. -- <u>Award preference is given</u> 9 <u>to West Virginia residents.</u> An individual is eligible for 10 consideration for a health sciences scholarship <u>Health Sciences</u> 11 <u>Service Program award</u> if the individual:

12 (1) Either:

13 (A) Is a fourth-year medical student at the Marshall 14 University School of Medicine, West Virginia School of Osteopathic 15 Medicine or West Virginia University School of Medicine who has 16 been accepted in a primary care internship/residency program in 17 West Virginia; or

(B) Is enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an approved
education program at a West Virginia institution leading to a
degree or certification in the field of nurse practitioner, <u>nurse</u>
<u>educator</u>, nurse midwife, physician assistant, <u>dentist</u>, <u>pharmacist</u>,
<u>physical therapist</u>, <u>doctoral clinical psychologist</u>, <u>licensed</u>
<u>independent clinical social worker</u> or other disciplines identified

1 as shortage fields by the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences; and 2 (2) Signs an agreement to practice for at least two years in 3 an underserved area of West Virginia, as determined by the bureau 4 for public health. An individual also is eligible for 5 consideration for a health sciences scholarship if the individual 6 is or, if pursuing a master's degree in nursing, and signs an 7 agreement to teach at least two years for a school of nursing 8 located in West Virginia, as may be determined by the Vice 9 Chancellor for Health Sciences, after receiving her or his the 10 master's degree. Awarding preference will be given to West 11 Virginia residents.

12 (d) <u>Scholarship awards</u> <u>Program awards.</u> -- <u>Scholarships</u> 13 <u>Program awards</u> shall be in the amount of <u>an amount set by the</u> 14 <u>Higher Education Policy Commission of at least</u> \$20,000 for medical 15 <u>and dental</u> students and <u>at least</u> \$10,000 for all others and may be 16 awarded by the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences, with the advice 17 of an advisory panel, from the pool of all applicants with a 18 commitment to practice in an underserved area of West Virginia. as 19 determined by the bureau for public health. Nothing herein shall 20 be construed as granting or guaranteeing <u>This section does not</u> 21 <u>grant or quarantee</u> any applicant any right to such a scholarship <u>a</u> 22 <u>program award.</u>

23 (e) Repayment provisions. -- A scholarship program award

1 recipient who fails to practice in an underserved area of West 2 Virginia within six months of the completion of his or her 3 training, or who fails to complete his or her training or who fails 4 to complete the required teaching is in breach of contract and is 5 liable for repayment of the total scholarship amount received plus 6 interest program award and any accrued interest. The granting or 7 renewal of a license to practice in West Virginia or to reciprocal 8 licensure in another state based upon licensure in West Virginia 9 shall be is contingent upon beginning payment and continuing 10 payment until complete repayment of the total scholarship amount if 11 the recipient fails to practice in an underserved area. No award 12 and any accrued interest. A license, renewal or reciprocity shall 13 may not be granted to persons whose repayments are any person whose 14 repayment is in arrears. The appropriate regulatory board shall 15 inform all other states where a recipient has reciprocated based 16 upon West Virginia licensure of any refusal to renew licensure in 17 West Virginia as a result of failure to repay the scholarship 18 amount award. This provision shall be explained in bold type in 19 the scholarship award contract. Repayment terms, not inconsistent 20 with this section, shall be established by the Vice Chancellor for 21 Health Sciences pursuant to rules as required under subsection (f) 22 of the rule required by this section.

23 (f) Promulgation of rules <u>Rule</u>. -- The Higher Education

1 Policy Commission shall promulgate rules <u>a rule</u> pursuant to article 2 three-a, chapter twenty nine-a of this code necessary for the 3 implementation and administration of <u>to implement and administer</u> 4 this section.

5 (g) Definitions. -- For purposes of the repayment provisions
6 of As used in this section: the term

7 <u>(1)</u> "Training" means:

8 <u>(A)</u> The entire degree program or certification program for 9 nurse midwives, nurse practitioners, <u>nurse educators</u>, physician 10 assistants, <u>dentists</u>, <u>pharmacists</u>, <u>physical therapists</u>, <u>doctoral</u> 11 <u>clinical psychologists</u>, <u>licensed independent clinical social</u> 12 <u>workers</u> and other disciplines identified as shortage field <u>fields</u> 13 by the Vice Chancellor <u>for Health Sciences</u>; The term also means 14 the

15 <u>(B)</u> Completion of a degree program and includes completion of 16 an approved residency/internship program for students pursuing a 17 degree in medicine or a degree in osteopathy, <u>or as otherwise may</u> 18 <u>be designated for such students in the rule required by this</u> 19 section.

20 (2) <u>"Underserved area" means any primary care health</u> 21 professional shortage area located in the state as determined by 22 the Bureau for Public Health or any additional health professional 23 shortage area determined by the Vice Chancellor for Health

1 Sciences.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to modify the Health Sciences Scholarship Program to become the Health Sciences Service Program to better reflect the purpose of the program as a job recruitment incentive for attracting practicing health care professionals to underserved areas of the state. The program is not a financial aid program, and there is no requirement that the funds be used for educational purposes, but rather the mission is to improve access to primary care in underserved areas of the state.
