15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That §31-20-5h of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
17	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 20. WEST VIRGINIA REGIONAL JAIL AND CORRECTIONAL FACILITY
19	AUTHORITY.
20	§31-20-5h. Programs for inmates committed to prison.
21	(a) The Division of Corrections may develop and implement a
22	cognitive behavioral program to address the needs of inmates
23	detained in a regional jail, but committed to the custody of the
24	Commissioner of Corrections. The program shall be developed in

- 1 consultation with the Regional Jail Authority, and may be offered
- 2 by video teleconference or webinar technology. The costs of the
- 3 program shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Division of
- 4 Corrections. The program shall be covered by the rehabilitation
- 5 plan policies and procedures adopted by the Division of Corrections
- 6 under subsection (h), section thirteen, article twelve, chapter
- 7 sixty-two of this code.
- 8 (b) In addition to the program established under subsection
- 9 (a), all classes and programs available to inmates in a Division of
- 10 Corrections facility shall be made available to inmates detained in
- 11 a regional jail, but committed to the custody of the Commissioner
- 12 of Corrections. The costs of the programs shall be paid out of
- 13 funds appropriated to the Division of Corrections.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require that inmates in a regional jail, but committed to the custody of the Commissioner of Corrections, have available the same classes and programs that are offered in Division of Corrections facilities.
