Smith and John Shott) 6 7 (By request of the Division of Motor Vehicles) 8 [Introduced January 29, 2014; referred to the 9 Committee on the Judiciary then Finance.] 10 A BILL to amend and reenact §17B-2-8, §17B-2-12 and §17B-2-12a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to 11 12 issuance and renewal of driver's licenses; changing renewal 13 cycle for driver's licenses from five to eight years; allowing 14 the commissioner to provide a program for online renewal of 15 driver's licenses; and providing an additional fee for the issuance of driver's license issued for federal use. 16 17 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: That §17B-2-8, §17B-2-12 and §17B-2-12a of the Code of West 18 19 Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read 20 as follows: 21 ARTICLE 2. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE, EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL. 22 §17B-2-8. Issuance and contents of licenses; fees. 23 (a) The division shall, upon payment of the required fee, 24 issue to every applicant qualifying therefor a driver's license, 25 which shall indicate the type or general class or classes of 26 vehicle or vehicles the licensee may operate in accordance with

1 this chapter or chapter seventeen-e of this code, or 2 motorcycle-only license. Each license shall contain a coded number 3 assigned to the licensee, the full legal name, date of birth, 4 residence address, a brief description and a color photograph of 5 the licensee and either a facsimile of the signature of the 6 licensee or a space upon which the signature of the licensee <del>shall</del> 7 <del>be</del> <u>is</u> written with pen and ink immediately upon receipt of the 8 license. No license is valid until it has been so signed by the 9 licensee.

10 (b) A driver's license which is valid for operation of a 11 motorcycle shall contain a motorcycle endorsement. <u>A driver's</u> 12 <u>license which is valid for the operation of a commercial motor</u> 13 <u>vehicle shall be issued in accordance with chapter seventeen-e of</u> 14 <u>this code</u>.

15 (c) The division shall use such process or processes in the 16 issuance of licenses that will, insofar as possible, prevent any 17 <u>identity theft</u>, alteration, counterfeiting, duplication, 18 reproduction, forging or modification of, or the superimposition of 19 a photograph on, the license.

20 (d) The fee for the issuance of a Class E driver's license is 21 \$2.50 per year for each year the license is issued to be valid. 22 The fee for issuance of a Class D driver's license is \$6.25 per 23 year for each year the license is issued to be valid. An 24 additional fee of 50¢ shall be collected from the applicant at the

1 time of original issuance or each renewal and the additional fee
2 shall be deposited in the Combined Voter Registration and Driver's
3 Licensing Fund established pursuant to the provisions of section
4 twelve, article two, chapter three of this code. The additional
5 fee for adding a motorcycle endorsement to a driver's license is \$1
6 per year for each year the license is issued.

7 (e) The fee for issuance of a motorcycle-only license is \$2.50 8 for each year for which the motorcycle license is to be valid. The 9 fees for the motorcycle endorsement or motorcycle-only license 10 shall be paid into a special fund in the State Treasury known as 11 the Motorcycle Safety Fund as established in section seven, article 12 one-d of this chapter.

13 (f) The fee for the issuance of either the level one or level 14 two graduated driver's license as prescribed in section three-a of 15 this article is \$5.

16 (q) The fee for issuance of a federally compliant driver's 17 license or identification card for federal use is \$10 in addition 18 to any other fee required by this chapter. Any fees collected 19 under the provisions of this subsection shall be deposited into the 20 Motor Vehicle Fees Fund established in accordance with section 21 twenty-one, article two, chapter seventeen-a of this code.

(g) (h) The division may use an address on the face of the
license other than the applicant's address of residence if:
(1) The applicant has a physical address or location that is

1 not recognized by the post office for the purpose of receiving
2 mail;

3 (2) The applicant is enrolled in a state address4 confidentiality program or the alcohol test and lock program;

5 (3) The applicant's address is entitled to be suppressed under 6 a state or federal law or suppressed by a court order; or

7 (4) At the discretion of the commissioner, the applicant's 8 address may be suppressed to provide security for classes of 9 applicants such as law-enforcement officials, protected witnesses 10 and members of the state and federal judicial systems.

## 11 §17B-2-12. Expiration of licenses.

12 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, 13 every driver's license shall expire five <u>expires eight</u> years from 14 the date of its issuance.

(b) (1) Every driver's license issued to a person who has attained his or her twenty-first birthday shall expire expires on the licensee's birthday. in those years in which the licensee's age subdivisible by five. Except as provided in the following subdivisions and in subsection (c) of this section, no driver's license may be issued for less than three years or for more than seven years and shall be valid for a period of five years, expiring on the licensee's birthday in a year in which the licensee's age is evenly divisible by five. The commissioner may modify the expiration date of any licensee as necessary to effectuate the

1 transition from the five-year renewal cycle to an eight-year
2 renewal cycle as he or she considers necessary.

3 (2) Every driver's license issued to a person who has not 4 attained his or her twenty-first birthday shall expire expires 5 thirty days after the licensee's twenty-first birthday, except as 6 provided in section three-a of this article.

7 (3) The driver's license of any person in the Armed Forces 8 shall expire <u>expires</u> six months after the date on which the person 9 is separated from active duty in the Armed Forces under honorable 10 circumstances.

11 (c) A license issued to a person who is not a citizen of the 12 United States may only be issued for the time the person is legally 13 authorized to be in the United States, not to exceed <u>five eight</u> 14 years. If the time the person is authorized to be in the United 15 States is extended, the commissioner may renew the license in 16 accordance with section twelve-a of this article for the time 17 extended, not to exceed <u>five</u> eight years.

18 §17B-2-12a. Renewal of driver's license upon expiration; vision 19 screening; renewal fees.

20 (a) The commissioner shall notify each person who holds a 21 valid driver's license of the expiration date of the license by 22 first class mail <u>or by electronic means</u> to the last address known 23 to the division. The notice shall be mailed at least ninety days 24 prior to the expiration date of the license and shall include a

1 renewal application form and instructions for renewal.

(b) The commissioner, at his or her discretion, may provide a program of electronic renewal notices to licensees and an electronic web-based renewal process. This process may include an electronic vision screening verification or waiver subject to processes and restrictions the commissioner considers necessary for highway safety, secure processing and identity verification. The online program shall require the applicant to have his or her digital photo updated at least once every sixteen years.

10 (b) (c) The holder of a valid driver's license may apply to 11 the division for renewal of the license on the form provided by the 12 division. To be eligible for license renewal the applicant must: 13 (1) Pay the fee required by section eight of this article;

14 (2) Obtain a new color photograph from the division, <u>except as</u>
15 provided in subsection (b) of this section; and

16 (3) Pass a vision screening conducted <u>in the manner prescribed</u> 17 by the division.

18 (c) (d) The commissioner shall assess an additional fee of \$5 19 for every application for renewal submitted after the expiration of 20 the applicant's license.

21 (d) (e) The commissioner shall determine whether an applicant 22 qualifies for a renewed license.

23 (e) (f) The commissioner shall provide by rule a procedure by 24 which an applicant who does not meet the minimum vision standards

1 for licensure may present evidence to show that his or her vision 2 has been corrected to meet the minimum visual standards and that he 3 or she is capable of safely operating a motor vehicle.

4 (f) (g) The commissioner may not renew the driver's license of 5 an applicant whose eyesight cannot be corrected to conform to the 6 minimum vision standards established by this code and by the rules 7 of the commissioner.

8 (g) (h) Vision screening conducted pursuant to this section 9 shall may not be used to collect any type of personal biometric 10 identifying information including, but not limited to, a retinal 11 scan.

12 (h) (i) The commissioner shall propose legislative rules for 13 promulgation in accordance with the provisions of article three, 14 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the provisions of 15 this section.

(i) The provisions of this section requiring an applicant for renewal of a driver's license to successfully complete a vision screening as a condition of renewing a driver's license shall become effective on January 1, 2009.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to extend the renewal cycle of drivers' licenses from five years to eight years, provide an option to renew driver's licenses and identification cards on-line without requiring an in-person appearance and to provide a \$10 fee for applicants who opt for a federally compliant driver's license or identification card.
