10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
11	adding thereto a new article, designated $\$46A-6M-1$, $\$46A-6M-2$,
12	\$46A-6M-3 and $$46A-6M-4$, all relating to creating the Internet
13	Service Provider Protection Act; defining terms; making
14	legislative findings; designating a contract between an
15	Internet service provider and a subscriber to be an adhesion
16	contract; and providing remedies.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
19	by adding thereto a new article, designated $$46A-6M-1$, $$46A-6M-2$,
20	\$46A-6M-3 and $$46A-6M-4$, all to read as follows:
21	ARTICLE 6M. INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDER ACCOUNTABILITY ACT.
22	§46A-6M-1. Short title.
23	This article may be known and cited as the "Internet Service
24	Provider Accountability Act."
25	§46A-6M-2. Definitions.

- 1 For purposes of this article:
- 2 "Adhesion contract" means a standard form contract drafted by
- 3 one party with stronger bargaining power and signed by the weaker
- 4 party who must adhere to the contract and therefore does not have
- 5 the power to negotiate or modify the terms of the contract.
- 6 "Internet", without limitations, means:
- 7 (A) The computer network commonly known as the Internet and
- 8 any other local, regional or global computer network that is
- 9 similar to or is a predecessor or successor of the Internet;
- 10 (B) Any identifiable site on the Internet or such other
- 11 computer network;
- 12 (C) A website or other similar site on the World Wide Web;
- 13 (D) A site that is identifiable through a Uniform Resource
- 14 Location;
- 15 (E) A site on a computer network that is owned, operated,
- 16 administered or controlled by an Internet service provider;
- 17 (F) A list server;
- 18 (G) A newsgroup; or
- 19 (H) A chat room.
- "Internet service provider" means any person, for a fee or
- 21 other consideration, provides subscribers with access to the
- 22 Internet.
- 23 §46A-6M-3. Legislative findings.
- 24 The Legislature finds that a contract between an Internet

- 1 service provider and a subscriber is an adhesion contract and, as
- 2 such, many of its provisions are highly advantageous to the
- 3 provider and leaving the subscriber with few, if any options.
- 4 Therefore, in addition to all other remedies available to
- 5 subscribers, including civil actions, injunctions and protections
- 6 <u>afforded elsewhere in this code</u>, it is the public policy of this
- 7 state that, as a matter of law, the remedies as set forth in
- 8 section four of this article shall be added to all contracts
- 9 between an Internet service provider and a subscriber.

10 **§46A-6M-4**. Remedies.

- 11 (a) In the event a subscriber loses service for more than an
- 12 hour during a twenty-four hour day, the subscriber shall receive a
- 13 credit for one day of service for the next billing cycle.
- 14 (b) In the event the subscriber loses service for more than an
- 15 hour during a twenty-four hour period for any two days within a
- 16 billing cycle, the subscriber shall receive a credit for one week
- 17 of service for the next billing cycle.
- 18 (c) In the event the subscriber loses service for more than an
- 19 hour during a twenty-four hour period for any three days within a
- 20 billing cycle, the subscriber shall receive a credit for one month
- 21 of service for the next billing cycle.
- 22 (d) In the event the subscriber has lost service for more than
- 23 three separate days in one month, the subscriber may terminate the
- 24 service agreement and may not be penalized or owe any additional

1 fees, including, but not limited to, early termination fees.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create the Internet Service Provider Protection Act. The bill defines terms. The bill makes legislative findings. The bill designates a contract between an Internet service provider and a subscriber to be an adhesion contract. The bill provides remedies.
