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10	A BILL to amend and reenact §30-20A-1, §30-20A-2, §30-20A-3,
11	\$30-20A-4, $$30-20A-5$ , $$30-20A-6$ and $$30-20A-7$ of the Code of
12	West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to requiring
13	that athletic trainers be licensed, instead of registered, by
14	West Virginia Board of Physical Therapy.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That \$30-20A-1, \$30-20A-2, \$30-20A-3, \$30-20A-4, \$30-20A-5,
17	\$30-20A-6 and $$30-20A-7$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
18	amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
19	ARTICLE 20A. ATHLETIC TRAINERS.
20	§30-20A-1. Definitions.
21	As used in this article:
22	(1) "Applicant" means any person making application for an
23	original or renewal registration <u>license</u> to act as an athletic
24	trainer under the provisions of this article.
25	(2) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Physical Therapy

- 1 established under article twenty of this chapter.
- 2 (4) "Registration" <u>"License"</u> means a registration <u>license</u>
- 3 issued by the board to practice athletic training.
- 4 (3) "Registrant" "Licensee" means a person registered licensed
- 5 as an athletic trainer under the provisions of this article.
- 6 "Practice of athletic training" means services performed for
- 7 physically active patients under the direction of a physician and
- 8 <u>as prescribed by the board, for which the athletic trainer has</u>
- 9 received appropriate education and training. The practice of
- 10 athletic training does not include the practice of physical
- 11 therapy, the practice of medicine, the practice of osteopathic
- 12 medicine and surgery, the practice of chiropractic or medical
- 13 diagnosis or treatment.
- 14 §30-20A-2. Title protection.
- 15 (a) A person may not advertise or represent himself or herself
- 16 as an athletic trainer in this state and may not use the initials
- 17 "AT", the words "registered athletic trainer" or "athletic
- 18 trainer", or any other words, abbreviations, titles or insignia
- 19 that indicates, implies or represents that he or she is an athletic
- 20 trainer, unless he or she is registered licensed by the board.
- 21 (b) Nothing contained in This article shall be construed as
- 22 preventing does not prevent any person, firm, partnership or
- 23 corporation from practicing athletic training, in any manner
- 24 desired.

- 1 (c) Nothing in this article may be construed to prohibit or
- 2 otherwise limit the use of the term "athletic trainer" in secondary
- 3 school settings by persons who were practicing athletic training
- 4 under a West Virginia Board of Education Athletic Certification,
- 5 provided the practice is in accordance with Board of Education
- 6 policy in effect prior to July 1, 2011.
- 7 §30-20A-3. Powers and duties of the board.
- 8 The board has the following powers and duties:
- 9 (1) Establish procedures for submitting, approving and denying
- 10 applications for registration licensure;
- 11 (2) Investigate alleged violations of the provisions of this 12 article;
- 13 (3) Establish a fee schedule;
- 14 (4) Issue, renew, deny, suspend, revoke or reinstate a
- 15 registration license;
- 16 (5) Determine disciplinary action and issue orders;
- 17 (6) Institute appropriate legal action for the enforcement of
- 18 the provisions of this article; and
- 19 (7) Maintain an accurate registry of the names and addresses
- 20 of <del>registrants</del> licensees.
- 21 §30-20A-4. Rule-making authority.
- 22 The board shall propose rules for legislative approval, in
- 23 accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter
- 24 twenty-nine-a of this code, to implement the provisions of this

- 1 article, including:
- 2 (1) Procedures for the issuance and renewal of a registration
- 3 license;
- 4 (2) A fee schedule;
- 5 (3) Procedures for denying, suspending, revoking, reinstating
- 6 or limiting the <del>registration of a registrant</del> <u>licensing of a</u>
- 7 <u>license;</u> and
- 8 (4) Any other rules necessary to effectuate the provisions of
- 9 this article.

## 10 §30-20A-5. Requirements for registration license.

- 11 (a) To be eligible for  $\frac{1}{1}$  the board as
- 12 an athletic trainer, an applicant shall:
- 13 (1) Submit an application in the form prescribed by the board;
- 14 (2) Submit a current certification from the National Athletic
- 15 Trainers' Association Board of Certification or successor
- 16 organization; and
- 17 (3) Pay the required fee.
- 18 (b) The board shall issue a registration license to an
- 19 applicant satisfying all the requirements in subsection (a) of this
- 20 section: Provided, That the board may deny an application for
- 21 registration license if the applicant:
- 22 (1) Has been convicted of a felony or other crime involving
- 23 moral turpitude;
- 24 (2) Is an alcohol or drug abuser as these terms are defined in

- 1 section eleven, article one-a, chapter twenty-seven of this code:
- 2 Provided, That the board may take into consideration that an
- 3 applicant in an active recovery process, which may, in the
- 4 discretion of the board, be evidenced by participation in a
- 5 twelve-step program or other similar group or process;
- 6 (3) Has been convicted of fraudulent, false, misleading or 7 deceptive advertising;
- 8 (4) Has been convicted for wrongfully prescribing medicines or 9 drugs, or practicing any licensed profession without legal
- 10 authority;
- 11 (5) Has had a registration license or other authorization
- 12 revoked, suspended, restricted or other disciplinary action taken
- 13 by the proper authorities of another jurisdiction;
- 14 (6) Is incapacitated by a physical or mental disability which
- 15 is determined by a physician to render further practice by the
- 16 applicant inconsistent with competency and ethic requirements; or
- 17 (7) Has been convicted of sexual abuse or sexual misconduct.
- 18 (c) In determining whether an application should be denied for
- 19 any of the reasons set forth in subsection (b), the board may
- 20 consider:
- 21 (1) How recently the conduct occurred;
- (2) The nature of the conduct and the context in which it
- 23 occurred; and
- 24 (3) Any other relevant conduct of the applicant.

1 (d) A registration <u>license</u> issued by the board is valid for 2 two years from the date it was is issued.

## 3 §30-20A-6. Renewal requirements.

- 4 (a) A registrant <u>licensee</u> may apply to renew his or her 5 registration <u>license</u> by submitting an application for renewal in 6 the form prescribed by the board and paying the renewal fee. The 7 renewal application must be signed by the applicant.
- 8 (b) A renewal of registration <u>license</u> issued by the board is 9 valid for two years from the date it was is issued.
- 10 (c) The board may deny an application for renewal for any 11 reason which would justify the denial of an original application 12 for a registration license.
- 13 §30-20A-7. Due process procedures; grounds for disciplinary action.
- 15 (a) The board may, after notice and opportunity for hearing,
  16 suspend, restrict or revoke a registration license of, impose
  17 probationary conditions upon or take disciplinary action against,
  18 any registrant licensee if the board determines the registrant
  19 licensee:
- 20 (1) Is grossly negligent in the practice of athletic training;
- 21 (2) Obtained a registration <u>license</u> by fraud,
  22 misrepresentation or concealment of material facts; engaged in the
  23 practice of athletic training under a false or assumed name; or
  24 impersonated another registrant licensee of a like or different

- 1 name; or
- 2 (3) Has violated any of the provisions of subsection (b),
- 3 section five of this article.
- 4 (b) For purposes of subsection (a) of this section,
- 5 disciplinary action may include:
- 6 (1) Reprimand;
- 7 (2) Probation;
- 8 (3) Administrative fines;
- 9 (4) Practicing under supervision or other restriction;
- 10 (5) Requiring the registrant <u>licensee</u> to report to the board
- 11 for periodic interviews for a specified period of time; or
- 12 (6) Other corrective action as determined by the board.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require that athletic trainers be licensed by the West Virginia Board of Physical Therapy instead of registered.
