14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $\S 8-5-7$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be
16	amended and reenacted to read as follows:

21	§8-5-7. Certain officers; wards or election districts; residency
22	and other requirements.
23	(a) Unless otherwise provided in the charter of a

- 1 municipality, there shall be elected a mayor, a recorder and
- 2  $\frac{\text{councilmen}}{\text{council members,}}$  who together shall form the governing
- 3 body of the municipality.
- (b) When a municipality has not been divided into wards or 5 election districts, there shall be at least five councilmen council 6 members, but when the municipality has been divided into wards or 7 election districts, the governing body may, by ordinance, determine 8 the number of councilmen council members to be elected from each 9 ward or election district. When it is deemed considered necessary, 10 the governing body may, by ordinance, increase or decrease the 11 number of wards or election districts and change the boundaries 12 thereof, such the wards or election districts to be made as nearly 13 equal as may be, in population, and when the municipality shall be 14 <u>is</u> divided into wards or election districts, or there <del>shall be</del> <u>is</u> 15 an increase or decrease in the number of wards or election 16 districts as aforesaid, the governing body may increase or decrease 17 the number of councilmen council members and, in the case of an 18 <u>increase in the number of council members</u>, direct an election to be 19 held at the next regular municipal election in such the additional 20 ward or wards or election district or districts so that each ward 21 or election district may have its full number of councilmen council 22 members residing therein and may have equal representation on the 23 governing body. When a municipality has been divided into wards or 24 election districts, the governing body may, by ordinance, also

- 1 provide for the election of <del>councilmen</del> council members at large in
- 2 addition to the councilmen council members to be elected from each
- 3 ward or election district. The provisions of this subsection shall
- 4 be is applicable to any municipality except to the extent otherwise
- 5 provided in the charter of such the municipality.
- 6 (c) Unless otherwise provided by charter provision or
- 7 ordinance, the mayor, recorder and <del>councilmen</del> <u>council members</u> must
- 8 be residents of the municipality and must be qualified voters
- 9 entitled to vote for members of its governing body. A city manager
- 10 in a manager form of government need only be a resident of the city
- 11 at the time of his or her appointment.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make clear that municipalities have the power to both increase and decrease the number of voting wards and/or council members serving its governing body.
