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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18C-7-6$ of the Code of West Virginia,
11	1931, as amended, relating to removing the requirement that
12	home schooled students have to acquire a general equivalency
13	degree (GED) in order to qualify for the promise scholarship.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That §18C-7-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 7. WEST VIRGINIA PROVIDING REAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR
18	MAXIMIZING IN-STATE STUDENT EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP
19	PROGRAM.
20	<pre>\$18C-7-6. Promise scholarship program requirements; legislative</pre>
21	rule.
22	(a) A PROMISE scholarship annual award shall meet the
23	following conditions:
24	(1) For a student enrolled in a state institution of higher

1 education, the annual award is equal to the lesser of the cost of 2 tuition or \$4,750, except that a student who was awarded and used 3 a PROMISE scholarship annual award prior to January 1, 2010, shall 4 continue to receive the annual award calculated under the same 5 terms and conditions that applied on the day before the effective 6 date of this article;

7 (2) For a student enrolled in an eligible institution other 8 than a state institution of higher education, the annual award is 9 equal to, but may not exceed, the lesser of the cost of tuition or 10 \$4,750, except that a student who was awarded and used a PROMISE 11 scholarship annual award prior to January 1, 2010, shall continue 12 to receive the annual award calculated under the same terms and 13 conditions that applied on the day before the effective date of 14 this article;

(3) The annual award may exceed \$4,750, if the commission determines that adequate funds are available, but in any case, may not be greater than the actual cost of tuition;

18 (4) The annual award shall be used by an eligible institution 19 to supplement, but may not supplant, a tuition and fee waiver for 20 which the individual is eligible pursuant to section five, six-a, 21 seven or seven-b, article ten, chapter eighteen-b of this code.

(b) The total cost of all scholarships awarded by the commission in any year may not exceed the amount of funds available to the commission during that fiscal year.

1 (c) In order to be eligible to receive a PROMISE scholarship 2 award an individual shall:

(1) Submit a scholarship award application to the commission:
(A) Within two years of graduating from <u>a public or private</u>
5 high school; or within three years of completing eleventh grade in
6 <u>a home school which operates pursuant to section one, article</u>
7 <u>eight, chapter eighteen of this code;</u> or within two years of
8 acquiring a general equivalency degree if provided instruction in
9 the home or other approved place pursuant to subsection (c),
10 section one, article eight, chapter eighteen of this code; or

(B) Within seven years of initially entering military service, and within one year of discharge from military service, if the individual has entered the United States Armed Services within two years after graduating from high school;

15 (2) Apply for and submit a Free Application for Federal 16 Student Aid;

17 (3) Maintain a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 18 grading scale in the required core and elective course work 19 necessary to prepare students for success in post-secondary 20 education at the Associate and Baccalaureate Degree levels as 21 determined by the commission, if the individual has completed not 22 more than one semester or term at an institution of higher 23 education, excluding credits earned in advanced placement, 24 international baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses

1 while the student is enrolled in high school;

2 (4) Maintain appropriate academic progress toward the 3 completion of a degree at the undergraduate education level as 4 determined by the commission if the individual has completed more 5 than one semester or term at an institution of higher education, 6 excluding credits earned in advanced placement, international 7 baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses while the student 8 is enrolled in high school;

9 (5) Be a United States citizen or legal immigrant to the 10 United States;

11 (6) Meet additional objective standards the commission 12 considers necessary to promote academic excellence and to maintain 13 the financial stability of the fund; and

14 (7) Enroll in an eligible institution. A student enrolled at 15 an eligible institution who receives a PROMISE scholarship award 16 may retain and renew the scholarship to complete his or her 17 undergraduate education at that institution or any other eligible 18 institution under the following circumstances:

(A) The institution at which the student is enrolled loses its 20 status as an eligible institution pursuant to the provisions of 21 subdivision (1), subsection (b), section three of this article; and 22 (B) The student meets all other renewal requirements of this 23 code and of commission rules.

24 (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission

1 shall strongly encourage prospective candidates for the PROMISE 2 scholarship to perform at least twenty hours of unpaid community 3 service while in high school to help prepare them for success in 4 post-secondary education. The community service may include, but 5 is not limited to, participation with nonprofit, governmental or 6 community-based organizations designed with any or all of the 7 following purposes:

8 (1) Improving the quality of life for community residents;

9 (2) Meeting the needs of community residents; or

10 (3) Fostering civic responsibility.

11 (e) The commission shall promulgate a legislative rule in 12 accordance with the provisions of article three-a, chapter 13 twenty-nine-a of this code.

(1) The rule shall include at least the following provisions: (A) The amount of a PROMISE scholarship award in combination with aid from all other sources may not exceed the cost of education at the institution the recipient is attending. This provision does not apply to members of the West Virginia National guard, recipients of an Underwood-Smith teacher scholarship and recipients of a West Virginia engineering, science and technology scholarship;

22 (B) Additional objective standards the commission considers 23 necessary:

24 (i) To promote academic excellence;

(ii) To maintain the financial stability of the fund; and
 (iii) To operate the program within the limits of available
 funds.

4 (C) Provisions for making the highest and best use of the 5 PROMISE Scholarship Program in conjunction with the West Virginia 6 College Prepaid Tuition and Savings Program Act set forth in 7 article thirty, chapter eighteen of this code;

8 (D) A provision defining the relationship of PROMISE 9 scholarship awards to all other sources of student financial aid to 10 ensure maximum coordination. The provision shall include the 11 following:

12 (i) Methods to maximize student eligibility for federal13 student financial aid;

14 (ii) A requirement that PROMISE scholarship awards not 15 supplant tuition and fee waivers; and

16 (iii) Clarification of the relationship between the PROMISE 17 Scholarship Program, tuition savings plans and other state-funded 18 student financial aid programs;

19 (E) A method for awarding scholarships within the limits of 20 available appropriations, including circumstances when program 21 funds are not sufficient to provide awards to all eligible 22 applicants. The commission may not use any of the following 23 methods:

24 (i) Providing for an annual PROMISE scholarship award that is

1 less than the amounts provided for in this section; or

2 (ii) Eliminating any current recipient from eligibility; and
3 (F) A method for applicants to appeal determinations of
4 eligibility and renewal.

5 (2) The rule may provide for or require the following at the 6 commission's discretion:

7 (A) Requiring repayment of the amount of the scholarship, in 8 whole or in part, if a scholarship recipient chooses to work 9 outside the state after graduation. The rule may not require a 10 recipient to repay a scholarship, in whole or in part, unless the 11 prospective recipient has been informed of this requirement in 12 writing before initial acceptance of the PROMISE scholarship award; 13 (B) Targeting a portion of the scholarship funds to be used 14 for applicants enrolled in an engineering, science, technology or 15 other designated program;

16 (C) Determining what other sources of funding for higher 17 education are to be deducted from the PROMISE scholarship award; 18 and

19 (D) Providing additional criteria as determined by the 20 commission.

(3) The Legislature finds that an emergency exists and, 22 therefore, the commission shall file a rule to implement the 23 provisions of this section as an emergency rule pursuant to the 24 provisions of article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code.

1 The rule is subject to the prior approval of the Legislative 2 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability.

3 (4) Any rule promulgated by the commission pursuant to 4 previous enactments of this article in effect on the effective date 5 of the amendment and reenactment of this article in the year 2009 6 remains in effect until amended, modified, repealed or replaced by 7 the commission.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to remove the requirement that home schooled students have to acquire a general equivalency degree (GED) in order to qualify for the promise scholarship.
