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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18C-7-6$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
11	1931, as amended, relating to requirements for PROMISE	
12	scholarships; and expanding access to PROMISE scholarship	
13	funds to persons majoring in STEM fields.	
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
15	That §18C-7-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
17	ARTICLE 7. WEST VIRGINIA PROVIDING REAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR	
18	MAXIMIZING IN-STATE STUDENT EXCELLENCE	
19	SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.	
20	<pre>\$18C-7-6. Promise scholarship program requirements; legislative</pre>	
21	rule.	
22	(a) A PROMISE scholarship annual award shall meet the	
23	following conditions:	

1 (1) For a student enrolled in a state institution of higher 2 education, the annual award is equal to the lesser of the cost of 3 tuition or \$4,750, except that a student who was awarded and used 4 a PROMISE scholarship annual award prior to January 1, 2010, shall 5 continue to receive the annual award calculated under the same 6 terms and conditions that applied on the day before the effective 7 date of this article;

8 (2) For a student enrolled in an eligible institution other 9 than a state institution of higher education, the annual award is 10 equal to, but may not exceed, the lesser of the cost of tuition or 11 \$4,750, except that a student who was awarded and used a PROMISE 12 scholarship annual award prior to January 1, 2010, shall continue 13 to receive the annual award calculated under the same terms and 14 conditions that applied on the day before the effective date of 15 this article;

16 (3) The annual award may exceed \$4,750, if the commission 17 determines that adequate funds are available, but in any case, may 18 not be greater than the actual cost of tuition;

(4) The annual award shall be used by an eligible institution 20 to supplement, but may not supplant, a tuition and fee waiver for 21 which the individual is eligible pursuant to section five, six-a, 22 seven or seven-b, article ten, chapter eighteen-b of this code<u>;</u> 3 (5) For each student enrolled in a state institution of higher 24 education, in a major which falls within the fields of science,

1 <u>technology, engineering and mathematics, as determined by the</u>
2 <u>commission, the annual award covers full tuition, room and board.</u>
3 (b) The total cost of all scholarships awarded by the
4 commission in any year may not exceed the amount of funds available
5 to the commission during that fiscal year.

6 (c) In order to be eligible to receive a PROMISE scholarship 7 award an individual shall:

8 (1) Submit a scholarship award application to the commission: 9 (A) Within two years of graduating from high school or within 10 two years of acquiring a general equivalency degree if provided 11 instruction in the home or other approved place pursuant to 12 subsection (c), section one, article eight, chapter eighteen of 13 this code; or

(B) Within seven years of initially entering military service, 15 and within one year of discharge from military service, if the 16 individual has entered the United States armed services within two 17 years after graduating from high school;

18 (2) Apply for and submit a Free Application for Federal19 Student Aid;

20 (3) Maintain a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 21 grading scale in the required core and elective course work 22 necessary to prepare students for success in post-secondary 23 education at the associate and baccalaureate degree levels as 24 determined by the commission, if the individual has completed not

1 more than one semester or term at an institution of higher 2 education, excluding credits earned in advanced placement, 3 international baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses 4 while the student is enrolled in high school;

5 (4) Maintain appropriate academic progress toward the 6 completion of a degree at the undergraduate education level as 7 determined by the commission if the individual has completed more 8 than one semester or term at an institution of higher education, 9 excluding credits earned in advanced placement, international 10 baccalaureate, dual credit and comparable courses while the student 11 is enrolled in high school;

12 (5) Be a United States citizen or legal immigrant to the 13 United States;

14 (6) Meet additional objective standards the commission 15 considers necessary to promote academic excellence and to maintain 16 the financial stability of the fund; and

17 (7) Enroll in an eligible institution. A student enrolled at 18 an eligible institution who receives a PROMISE scholarship award 19 may retain and renew the scholarship to complete his or her 20 undergraduate education at that institution or any other eligible 21 institution under the following circumstances:

(A) The institution at which the student is enrolled loses its 3 status as an eligible institution pursuant to the provisions of 4 subdivision (1), subsection (b), section three of this article; and

1 (B) The student meets all other renewal requirements of this 2 code and of commission rules.

3 (d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission 4 shall strongly encourage prospective candidates for the PROMISE 5 scholarship to perform at least twenty hours of unpaid community 6 service while in high school to help prepare them for success in 7 post-secondary education. The community service may include, but 8 is not limited to, participation with nonprofit, governmental or 9 community-based organizations designed with any or all of the 10 following purposes:

11 (1) Improving the quality of life for community residents;

12 (2) Meeting the needs of community residents; or

13 (3) Fostering civic responsibility.

14 (e) The commission shall promulgate a legislative rule in 15 accordance with the provisions of article three-a, chapter 16 twenty-nine-a of this code.

17 (1) The rule shall include at least the following provisions: 18 (A) The amount of a PROMISE scholarship award in combination 19 with aid from all other sources may not exceed the cost of 20 education at the institution the recipient is attending. This 21 provision does not apply to members of the West Virginia National 22 Guard, recipients of an Underwood-Smith teacher scholarship and 23 recipients of a West Virginia engineering, science and technology 24 scholarship;

1 (B) Additional objective standards the commission considers 2 necessary:

3 (i) To promote academic excellence;

4 (ii) To maintain the financial stability of the fund; and 5 (iii) To operate the program within the limits of available 6 funds.

7 (C) Provisions for making the highest and best use of the 8 PROMISE Scholarship Program in conjunction with the West Virginia 9 College Prepaid Tuition and Savings Program Act set forth in 10 article thirty, chapter eighteen of this code;

11 (D) A provision defining the relationship of PROMISE 12 scholarship awards to all other sources of student financial aid to 13 ensure maximum coordination. The provision shall include the 14 following:

15 (i) Methods to maximize student eligibility for federal 16 student financial aid;

17 (ii) A requirement that PROMISE scholarship awards not 18 supplant tuition and fee waivers; and

(iii) Clarification of the relationship between the PROMISE 20 Scholarship Program, tuition savings plans and other state-funded 21 student financial aid programs;

(E) A method for awarding scholarships within the limits of available appropriations, including circumstances when program funds are not sufficient to provide awards to all eligible

1 applicants. The commission may not use any of the following 2 methods:

3 (i) Providing for an annual PROMISE scholarship award that is4 less than the amounts provided for in this section; or

5 (ii) Eliminating any current recipient from eligibility; and 6 (F) A method for applicants to appeal determinations of 7 eligibility and renewal.

8 (2) The rule may provide for or require the following at the 9 commission's discretion:

10 (A) Requiring repayment of the amount of the scholarship, in 11 whole or in part, if a scholarship recipient chooses to work 12 outside the state after graduation. The rule may not require a 13 recipient to repay a scholarship, in whole or in part, unless the 14 prospective recipient has been informed of this requirement in 15 writing before initial acceptance of the PROMISE scholarship award; 16 (B) Targeting a portion of the scholarship funds to be used 17 for applicants enrolled in an engineering, science, technology or 18 other designated program;

19 (C) Determining what other sources of funding for higher 20 education are to be deducted from the PROMISE scholarship award; 21 and

(D) Providing additional criteria as determined by thecommission.

24 (3) The Legislature finds that an emergency exists and,

1 therefore, the commission shall file a rule to implement the 2 provisions of this section as an emergency rule pursuant to the 3 provisions of article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code. 4 The rule is subject to the prior approval of the Legislative 5 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability.

6 (4) Any rule promulgated by the commission pursuant to 7 previous enactments of this article in effect on the effective date 8 of the amendment and reenactment of this article in the year 2009 9 remains in effect until amended, modified, repealed or replaced by 10 the commission.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to expand access to PROMISE scholarship funds to persons majoring in STEM fields.
