10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$3-1A-6$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
11	1931, as amended, relating to authorizing the Secretary of	
12	State to prosecute election violations.	
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
14	That §3-1A-6 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
15	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
16	ARTICLE 1A. STATE ELECTION COMMISSION AND SECRETARY OF STATE.	
17	§3-1A-6. Powers and duties of Secretary of State; exercise of	
18	powers by appointees.	
19	(a) The Secretary of State shall be the chief election	
20	official of the state. Except for those rules required by the	
21	provisions of section five of this article to be promulgated by the	
22	commission, the Secretary of State shall have the authority, after	
23	consultation with the State Election Commission, of which he or she	
24	is a member, to make, amend and rescind such orders and to	

25 promulgate legislative rules, in accordance with the provisions of

1 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, as may be necessary to 2 standardize and make effective the provisions of this chapter. All 3 election officials, county commissions, clerks of county 4 commissions, clerks of circuit courts, boards of ballot 5 commissioners, election commissioners and poll clerks shall abide 6 by any orders that may be issued and any legislative rules that may 7 be promulgated by the Secretary of State and the commission.

8 (b) The Secretary of State also shall have authority to 9 require collection and report of statistical information and to 10 require other reports by county commissions, clerks of county 11 commissions and clerks of circuit courts.

12 (c) The Secretary of State shall also advise with election 13 officials; furnish to the election officials a sufficient number of 14 indexed copies of the current election laws of West Virginia and 15 the administrative orders and rules issued or promulgated 16 thereunder; investigate the administration of election laws, frauds 17 and irregularities in any registration or election; report 18 violations of election laws to the appropriate prosecuting 19 officials; and prepare an annual report.

20 (d) The Secretary of State shall also have the power to 21 administer oaths and affirmations, issue subpoenas for the 22 attendance of witnesses, issue subpoena duces tecum to compel the 23 production of books, papers, records, registration records and 24 other evidence and fix the time and place for hearing any matters

1 relating to the administration and enforcement of this chapter, or 2 the rules promulgated by the State Election Commission or by the 3 Secretary of State as the chief election official of the state. In 4 case of disobedience to a subpoena or subpoena duces tecum, he or 5 she may invoke the aid of any circuit court in requiring the 6 attendance, evidence and testimony of witnesses and the production 7 of papers, books, records, registration records and other evidence. 8 (e) (1) The Secretary of State shall also have the power, 9 after consultation with the Secretary of the Department of Military 10 Affairs and Public Safety, to implement emergency procedures and 11 rules to ensure that all eligible voters have the opportunity to 12 cast a valid ballot and to uphold the integrity of an election in 13 the event of natural disaster as declared by the Governor of this 14 state, terrorist attack, war or general emergency, if any of which 15 occur during or immediately preceding an election.

16 (2) For purposes of this subsection, a "general emergency" 17 means circumstances preventing the casting of ballots in one or 18 more voting precincts. The chief judge of the circuit court of the 19 county where the casting of ballots is being prevented must declare 20 by order that a general emergency exists."

21 (f) The Secretary of State is authorized to prosecute 22 elections violations.

(f) (g) All powers and duties vested in the Secretary of State
24 pursuant to this article may be exercised by appointees of the

1 Secretary of State at his or her discretion, but the Secretary of

2 State shall be responsible for their acts.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Secretary of State to prosecute elections violations.
