20	(a) In an action to recover damages for personal injury or
21	wrongful death, the maximum amount recoverable as punitive damages
22	may not exceed \$500,000, or two times the plaintiff's compensatory
23	damages award, whichever is less.

- 1 (b) For purposes of this section, "punitive damages" means
- 2 noncompensatory damages awarded against a party in a personal
- 3 injury or wrongful death action to penalize that party or to
- 4 provide a deterrence to discourage similar conduct by that party in
- 5 the future.
- 6 (c) Nothing in this section may be construed to create a claim
- 7 for punitive damages not existing in this code at the time of
- 8 enactment of this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to place limits on the amount of punitive damages that may be awarded in a personal injury or wrongful death action.
