14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That $6-7-1$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be
16	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 7. COMPENSATION AND ALLOWANCES.
18	§6-7-1. State officials, officers and employees to be paid at
19	least twice per month; new employees paid in arrears;
20	effective date.
21	All full-time and part-time salaried and hourly officials,
22	officers and employees of the state, state institutions of higher

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1 education and the Higher Education Policy Commission shall be paid 2 at least twice per month, and under the same procedures and in the 3 same manner as the State Auditor currently pays agencies: 4 Provided, That on and after July 1, 2002, all new officials, 5 officers and employees of the state, a state institution of higher 6 education and the Higher Education Policy Commission, statutory 7 officials, contract educators with higher education and any exempt 8 official who does not earn annual and sick leave, except elected 9 officials, shall be paid one pay cycle in arrears. The term new 10 employee does not include an employee who transfers from one state 11 agency, a state institution of higher education or the Higher 12 Education Policy Commission to another state agency, another state 13 institution of higher education or the Higher Education Policy 14 Commission without a break in service. Nothing contained in this 15 section is intended to increase or diminish the salary or wages of 16 any official, officer or employee.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow the state to pay its employees every two weeks instead of twice per month.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

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
