

1 **ARTICLE 4C. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACT.**

2 **§16-4C-6c. Certification requirements for emergency medical**
3 **technician-industrial.**

4 (a) Commencing July 1, 2014, an applicant for certification as
5 an emergency medical technician-industrial shall:

6 (1) Be at least 18 years old;

7 (2) Apply on a form prescribed by the Executive Director;

8 (3) Pay the fee;

9 (4) Possess a valid CPR certification;

10 (5) Successfully complete an emergency medical
11 technician-industrial education program prescribed by the Executive
12 Director through Regional Educational Service Agencies (RESA); and

13 (6) Successfully complete emergency medical
14 technician-industrial cognitive and skills examinations prescribed
15 by the Executive Director.

16 (b) The emergency medical technician-industrial certification
17 is valid for three years.

18 (c) A certified emergency medical technician-industrial is
19 only authorized to practice on industrial property. For the
20 purposes of this section, industrial property means property on
21 which production, extraction or manufacturing is being performed.

22 (d) To be recertified as an emergency medical
23 technician-industrial, an applicant shall:

- 1 (1) Apply on a form prescribed by the Executive Director;
 - 2 (2) Pay the fee;
 - 3 (3) Possess a valid CPR certification;
 - 4 (4) Successfully complete a thirty-two hour emergency medical
5 technician-industrial recertification course prescribed by the
6 Executive Director through RESA; and
 - 7 (5) Successfully complete emergency medical
8 technician-industrial cognitive and skills recertification
9 examinations prescribed by the Executive Director.
- 10 (e) Commencing July 1, 2014, the certification for emergency
11 medical technician-miner shall be known as a certification for
12 emergency medical technician-industrial and the certification shall
13 be valid until the original expiration date, at which time the
14 person will have to recertify as an emergency medical
15 technician-industrial.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to create a certification process for emergency medical technician-industrial.

§16-4C-6c is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
