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L2	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by
L3	adding thereto a new section, designated §17C-6-11; and to
L 4	amend and reenact §17C-15-26 of said code, all relating to
L 5	special speed limitations as to waste service vehicles;
L 6	directing that no person shall drive a motor vehicle and meet
L 7	or overtake from either direction a stopped waste service
L 8	vehicle at a speed in excess of fifteen miles per hour under
L 9	certain circumstances; defining "waste service vehicle";
20	setting forth situations in which the special speed limit
21	applies; providing criminal penalties; and permitting waste
22	service vehicles to be equipped with special lights.
23	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
24	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended
25	by adding thereto a new section, designated §17C-6-11; and that
26	§17C-15-26 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as
27	follows:

28 ARTICLE 6. SPEED RESTRICTIONS.

## 1 §17C-6-11. Special speed limitations when meeting or overtaking waste service vehicles; penalty.

- 3 (a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle and meet or overtake 4 from either direction a stopped waste service vehicle at a speed in 5 excess of fifteen miles per hour.
- 6 (b) For purposes of this section, "waste service vehicle"
  7 means any garbage collection vehicle, including a vehicle
  8 collecting recyclables or yard waste, which is used for curbside
  9 collection, makes frequent stops and is not fully automated.
- 10 (c) The speed limitation set forth in subsection (a) of this 11 section applies only under the following circumstances:
- 12 (1) The waste service vehicle is identifiable as a waste 13 service vehicle based on the vehicle configuration or markings on 14 the vehicle;
- 15 (2) The waste service vehicle operator is giving a visual 16 signal by means of a stationary sign to warn of the presence of 17 workers or must use flashing lights as permitted in this code to 18 caution other drivers; and
- 19 (3) The waste service vehicle is not located on a private 20 driveway, controlled access highway, interstate highway, turnpike 21 or road or highway with a center line and more than two lanes.
- (d) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$300. If the person convicted of violating subsection (a) exceeded the speed limit by fifteen miles per hour or more or caused serious injury or death to a service vehicle worker, then the person shall be fined not less than \$300 nor more than \$1,000 or confined in jail for not

- 1 more than one year, or both confined and fined.
- 2 ARTICLE 15. EQUIPMENT.
- 3 §17C-15-26. Special restrictions on lamps.
- 4 (a) Any lighted lamp or illuminating device upon a motor 5 vehicle other than head lamps, spot lamps, auxiliary lamps or 6 flashing front-direction signals which projects a beam of light of 7 an intensity greater than three hundred candlepower shall be so 8 directed that no part of the beam will strike the level of the 9 roadway on which the vehicle stands at a distance of more than 10 seventy-five feet from the vehicle.
- 11 (b) No person may drive or move any vehicle or equipment upon 12 any highway with any lamp or device on the vehicle displaying other 13 than a white or amber light visible from directly in front of the 14 center of the vehicle except as authorized by subsection (d) of 15 this section.
- (c) Except as authorized in subsections (d) and (f) (g) of this section and authorized in section nineteen of this article, lashing lights are prohibited on motor vehicles: *Provided*, That any vehicle as a means for indicating right or left turn or any vehicle as a means of indicating the same is disabled or otherwise stopped for an emergency may have blinking or flashing lights.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter, the 33 following colors of flashing warning lights are restricted for the 24 use of the type of vehicle designated:
- 25 (1) Blue flashing warning lights are restricted to police 26 vehicles. Authorization for police vehicles shall be designated by 27 the chief administrative official of each police department.
- 28 (2) Except for standard vehicle equipment authorized by

- 1 section nineteen of this article, red flashing warning lights are
- 2 restricted to the following:
- 3 (A) Ambulances;
- 4 (B) Firefighting vehicles;
- 5 (C) Hazardous material response vehicles;
- 6 (D) Industrial fire brigade vehicles;
- 7 (E) Rescue squad vehicles not operating out of a fire 8 department;
- 9 (F) School buses;
- 10 (G) Class A vehicles, as defined by section one, article ten,
- 11 chapter seventeen-a of this code, of those firefighters who are
- 12 authorized by their fire chiefs to have the lights;
- 13 (H) Class A vehicles of members of duly chartered rescue
- 14 squads not operating out of a fire department;
- 15 (I) Class A vehicles of members of ambulance services or duly
- 16 chartered rescue squads who are authorized by their respective
- 17 chiefs to have the lights;
- 18 (J) Class A vehicles of out-of-state residents who are active
- 19 members of West Virginia fire departments, ambulance services or
- 20 duly chartered rescue squads who are authorized by their respective
- 21 chiefs to have the lights;
- 22 (K) West Virginia Department of Agriculture emergency response
- 23 vehicles;
- 24 (L) Vehicles designated by the Secretary of the Department of
- 25 Military Affairs and Public Safety for emergency response or
- 26 emergency management by the Division of Corrections, Regional Jail
- 27 and Correctional Facility Authority, Division of Juvenile Services
- 28 and Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management; and

- 1 (M) Class A vehicles of emergency response or emergency
- 2 management personnel as designated by the Secretary of the
- 3 Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety and the county
- 4 commission of the county of residence.
- 5 Red flashing warning lights attached to a Class A vehicle may
- 6 be operated only when responding to or engaged in handling an
- 7 emergency requiring the attention of the firefighters, members of
- 8 the ambulance services or chartered rescue squads.
- 9 (3) The use of red flashing warning lights is authorized as 10 follows:
- 11 (A) Authorization for all ambulances shall be designated by
- 12 the Department of Health and Human Resources and the sheriff of the
- 13 county of residence.
- 14 (B) Authorization for all fire department vehicles shall be
- 15 designated by the fire chief and the State Fire Marshal's Office.
- 16 (C) Authorization for all hazardous material response vehicles
- 17 and industrial fire brigades shall be designated by the chief of
- 18 the fire department and the State Fire Marshal's Office.
- 19 (D) Authorization for all rescue squad vehicles not operating
- 20 out of a fire department shall be designated by the squad chief,
- 21 the sheriff of the county of residence and the Department of Health
- 22 and Human Resources.
- 23 (E) Authorization for school buses shall be designated as set
- 24 out in section twelve, article fourteen of this chapter.
- 25 (F) Authorization for firefighters to operate Class A vehicles
- 26 shall be designated by their fire chiefs and the state Fire
- 27 Marshal's office.
- 28 (G) Authorization for members of ambulance services or any

- 1 other emergency medical service personnel to operate Class A
- 2 vehicles shall be designated by their chief official, the
- 3 Department of Health and Human Resources and the sheriff of the
- 4 county of residence.
- 5 (H) Authorization for members of duly chartered rescue squads
- 6 not operating out of a fire department to operate Class A vehicles
- 7 shall be designated by their squad chiefs, the sheriff of the
- 8 county of residence and the Department of Health and Human
- 9 Resources.
- 10 (I) Authorization for out-of-state residents operating Class
- 11 A vehicles who are active members of a West Virginia fire
- 12 department, ambulance services or duly chartered rescue squads
- 13 shall be designated by their respective chiefs.
- 14 (J) Authorization for West Virginia Department of Agriculture
- 15 emergency response vehicles shall be designated by the Commissioner
- 16 of the Department of Agriculture.
- 17 (K) Authorization for vehicles for emergency response or
- 18 emergency management by the Division of Corrections, Regional Jail
- 19 and Correctional Facility Authority, Division of Juvenile Services
- 20 and Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management shall be
- 21 designated by the Secretary of the Department of Military Affairs
- 22 and Public Safety.
- 23 (L) Authorization for Class A vehicles of emergency response
- 24 or emergency management personnel as designated by the Secretary of
- 25 the Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety and the county
- 26 commission of the county of residence.
- 27 (4) Yellow or amber flashing warning lights are restricted to
- 28 the following:

- 1 (A) All other emergency vehicles, including tow trucks and 2 wreckers, authorized by this chapter and by section twenty-seven of 3 this article:
- 4 (B) Postal service vehicles and rural mail carriers, as 5 authorized in section nineteen of this article;
- 6 (C) Rural newspaper delivery vehicles;
- 7 (D) Flag car services;
- 8 (E) Vehicles providing road service to disabled vehicles;
- 9 (F) Service vehicles of a public service corporation;
- 10 (G) Snow removal equipment;
- 11 (H) School buses; and
- 12 (I) Automotive fire apparatus owned by a municipality or other
- 13 political subdivision, by a volunteer or part-volunteer fire
- 14 company or department or by an industrial fire brigade.
- 15 (5) The use of yellow or amber flashing warning lights shall 16 be authorized as follows:
- 17 (A) Authorization for tow trucks, wreckers, rural newspaper
- 18 delivery vehicles, flag car services, vehicles providing road
- 19 service to disabled vehicles, service vehicles of a public service
- 20 corporation and postal service vehicles shall be designated by the
- 21 sheriff of the county of residence.
- 22 (B) Authorization for snow removal equipment shall be
- 23 designated by the Commissioner of the Division of Highways.
- 24 (C) Authorization for school buses shall be designated as set
- 25 out in section twelve, article fourteen of this chapter.
- 26 (D) Authorization for automotive fire apparatus shall be
- 27 designated by the fire chief in conformity with the NFPA 1901
- 28 Standard for Automotive Fire Apparatus as published by the National

- 1 Fire Protection Association (NFPA) on July 18, 2003, and adopted by
- 2 the state Fire Commission by legislative rule (87 CSR 1, et seq.),
- 3 except as follows:
- 4 (i) With the approval of the state Fire Marshal, used
- 5 automotive fire apparatus may be conformed to the NFPA standard in
- 6 effect on the date of its manufacture or conformed to a later NFPA
- 7 standard; and
- 8 (ii) Automotive fire apparatus may be equipped with blinking
- 9 or flashing headlamps.
- 10 (e) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section,
- 11 any vehicle belonging to a county board of education, an
- 12 organization receiving funding from the state or Federal Transit
- 13 Administration for the purpose of providing general public
- 14 transportation or hauling solid waste may be equipped with a white
- 15 flashing strobotron warning light. This strobe light may be
- 16 installed on the roof of a school bus, a public transportation
- 17 vehicle or a vehicle hauling solid waste not to exceed one-third
- 18 the body length forward from the rear of the roof edge. The light
- 19 shall have a single clear lens emitting light three hundred sixty
- 20 degrees around its vertical axis and may not extend above the roof
- 21 more than six and one-half inches. A manual switch and a pilot
- 22 light must be included to indicate the light is in operation.
- 23 <u>(f) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section,</u>
- 24 any waste service vehicle as defined in section eleven, article six
- 25 of this chapter may be equipped with yellow or amber flashing
- 26 warning lights.
- $\frac{(f)}{(g)}$  It is unlawful for flashing warning lights of an
- 28 unauthorized color to be installed or used on a vehicle other than

- 1 as specified in this section, except that a police vehicle may be
- 2 equipped with either or both blue or red warning lights.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to protect waste service workers by prohibiting persons from driving a motor vehicle and meeting or overtaking from either direction a stopped waste service vehicle at a speed in excess of fifteen miles per hour.

§17C-6-11 is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.)
