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10 \text{ A} BILL to amend and reenact \$9A-1-2, \$9A-1-5, \$9A-1-6, \$9A-1-8,
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       \$9A-1-9, \$9A-1-10, \$9A-1-11 and \$9A-1-12 of the Code of West
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       Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to the administration
       of veterans' assistance generally; redesignating employment
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       positions; providing additional power and authority of
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       Secretary of Department of Veterans' Assistance; modifying
       duties of Veterans' Council; authorizing compensation of
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       volunteer drivers; revising language related to the Veterans
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       Facilities Support Fund; and conforming terminology used in
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       existing statutory provisions.
20 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
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       That $9A-1-2, $9A-1-5, $9A-1-6, $9A-1-8, $9A-1-9, $9A-1-10,
22 §9A-1-11 and §9A-1-12 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as
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- 1 amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 2 CHAPTER 9A. VETERANS' ASSISTANCE.
- 3 ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' ASSISTANCE.
- 4 §9A-1-2. Veterans' Council; administration of department.
- 5 There is continued the "Veterans' Council" consisting of nine 6 members who must be citizens and residents of this state and who 7 have served in and been honorably discharged or separated under 8 honorable conditions from the Armed Forces of the United States and 9 whose service was within a time of war as defined by the laws of 10 the United States, either Public Law No. 2 -- 73rd Congress, or 11 Public Law No. 346 -- 78th Congress, and amendments thereto. Where 12 feasible, two members of the council shall be veterans of either 13 World War II or the Korean Conflict, at least two members of the 14 council shall be veterans of the Vietnam era, at least one member 15 shall be a veteran of the first Gulf War and at least one member 16 shall be a veteran of the Afghanistan or Iraqi Conflicts. 17 members of the veterans' council shall be selected with special 18 reference to their ability and fitness to effectuate the purposes 19 of this article. If an eligible veteran is not available or cannot 20 be selected, a veteran who is a citizen and resident of this state, 21 who served in and was honorably discharged or separated under 22 honorable conditions from the Armed Forces of the United States and

- 1 who served during any time of war or peace may be selected.
- 2 A The secretary and such veterans' affairs officers,
- 3 assistants and employees as the secretary considers advisable,
- 4 shall administer the West Virginia Department of Veterans'
- 5 Assistance.
- 6 §9A-1-5. Compensation to and expenses of Secretary and Veterans'
- 7 Council members; meetings of Veterans' Council.
- 8 (a) The director secretary shall receive an annual salary as
- 9 provided in section two-a, article seven, chapter six of this code
- 10 and necessary traveling expenses incident to the performance of his
- 11 or her duties. The salaries of the veterans' affairs officers,
- 12 assistants and employees shall be fixed by the Veterans' Council.
- 13 The members of the Veterans' Council shall receive no salary, but
- 14 each member shall receive the same compensation and expense
- 15 reimbursement as is paid to members of the Legislature for their
- 16 interim duties as recommended by the Citizens Legislative
- 17 Compensation Commission and authorized by law for each day or
- 18 portion thereof engaged in the discharge of official duties. The
- 19 requisition for such expenses and traveling expenses shall be
- 20 accompanied by a sworn and itemized statement, which shall be filed
- 21 with the Auditor and permanently preserved as a public record.
- 22 (b) The Veterans' Council shall hold its initial meeting on

1 the call of the Governor, and thereafter shall meet on the call of
2 its chairman, except as otherwise provided. With the exception of
3 the first three meetings of the Veterans' Council, none of which
4 shall be of a duration longer than two weeks each, for
5 organizational purposes, the The Veterans' Council shall meet not
6 more than once every two months at such times as may be determined
7 by and upon the call of the chairman for a period of not more than
8 two days, unless there should be an emergency requiring a special
9 meeting or for a longer period and so declared and called by the
10 Governor or by the chairman with the approval of the Governor. A
11 majority of the members of the Veterans' Council shall constitute
12 a quorum for the conduct of official business.

## 13 **§9A-1-6**. Oaths.

The members of the Veterans' Council, the <u>director secretary</u>

15 and the <u>veterans' affairs</u> officers <u>of the department</u> shall take and

16 subscribe to the oath prescribed by article four, section five of

17 the state Constitution before entering on their duties. Their

18 oaths shall be filed with the Secretary of State.

## 19 **§9A-1-8**. Offices.

The offices of the <u>director</u> <u>secretary</u> shall be located at the 21 state capitol or other place provided in the capital city. The 22 <u>director</u> secretary shall keep his or her offices open at all

- 1 reasonable times for the transaction of business. The offices and
- 2 meeting place of the Veterans' Council shall be in the offices of
- 3 the director secretary: Provided, That the Veterans' Council with
- 4 the approval of the Governor may hold meetings at other places but
- 5 not outside of this state, except in the District of Columbia.

## 6 §9A-1-9. Duties of department.

- 7 The <u>division department</u> of veterans' <u>affairs assistance</u> of 8 West Virginia shall:
- 9 (1) Assist veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans 10 within the state, in properly presenting their claims before the 11 United States Veterans' Administration, its administrator, or any 12 federal agency, the State of West Virginia, or any of the several 13 states of the United States, when the claims arise out of service 14 with the Armed Forces of the United States as defined in section 15 one of this article;
- 16 (2) Contact all veterans' organizations in this state through
  17 their duly elected or appointive officers to effectuate the
  18 purposes of this article and aid in the efficiency of the
  19 operations of the division department;
- 20 (3) Render all possible and proper advice, assistance and 21 counsel to veterans, their families, and their widows, dependents 22 and orphans, within the state, and furnish them information on

- 1 compensation, allowances, pensions, insurance, rehabilitation,
- 2 hospitalization, education, vocational training, or refresher or
- 3 retraining courses in education or training, employment, loans or
- 4 aid for the purchase, acquisition or construction of homes, farms,
- 5 farm equipment and business property, preference in the purchase of
- 6 property and preference in employment, as provided or may be
- 7 provided by any federal act, any federal agency, this state or
- 8 other states;
- 9 (4) Make careful inquiry into all claims presented for payment
- 10 out of the State Treasury from any appropriation made for the
- 11 benefit of veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans.

## 12 §9A-1-10. Additional powers and duties of secretary.

- 13 The director secretary is the executive and administrative
- 14 head of the division department and has the power and duty, subject
- 15 to the provisions of section four of this article, to:
- 16 (a) Supervise and put into effect the purposes and provisions
- 17 of this article and the rules for the government of the division
- 18 department;
- 19 (b) Prescribe methods pertaining to investigations and
- 20 reinvestigations of all claims and to the rights and interests of
- 21 all veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans;
- (c) Prescribe uniform methods of keeping all records and case

- 1 records of the veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans;
- 2 (d) Sign and execute, in the name of the state by West
- 3 Virginia Division Department of Veterans' Affairs Assistance, and
- 4 by and with the consent of the Veterans' Council, any contract or
- 5 agreement with the federal government or its agencies, other
- 6 states, subdivisions of this state, corporations, associations,
- 7 partnerships or individuals;
- 8 (e) Supervise the fiscal affairs and responsibilities of the
- 9 division department;
- 10 (f) Organize the division department to comply with the
- 11 requirements of this article and with the standards required by any
- 12 federal act or any federal agency;
- 13 (g) Establish any regional or area offices throughout the
- 14 state that are necessary to promote efficiency and economy in
- 15 administration;
- 16 (h) Make reports that comply with the requirements of any
- 17 federal act or federal agency and the provisions of this article;
- (i) Cooperate with the federal and state governments for the
- 19 more effective attainment of the purposes of this article;
- 20 (j) Keep a complete and accurate record of all proceedings;
- 21 record and file all contracts and agreements and assume
- 22 responsibility for the custody and preservation of all papers and

- 1 documents pertaining to his or her office and the division
- 2 department;
- 3 (k) Prepare for the Veterans' Council the annual reports to
- 4 the Governor of the condition, operation and functioning of the
- 5 division department;
- 6 (1) Exercise any other powers necessary and proper to
- 7 standardize the work; to expedite the service and business; to
- 8 assure fair consideration of the rights and interests and claims of
- 9 veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans; to provide
- 10 resources for a program which will promote a greater outreach to
- 11 veterans and which will advise them of the benefits and services
- 12 that are available, and to promote the efficiency of the division
- 13 department;
- 14 (m) Invoke any legal, equitable or special remedies for the
- 15 enforcement of his or her orders or the provisions of this article;
- 16 (n) Appoint the veterans' affairs officers and heads of
- 17 divisions of the division department, and of regional or area
- 18 offices, and employ assistants and employees, including case
- 19 managers and counselors, that are necessary for the efficient
- 20 operation of the division department;
- 21 (o) Provide resources and assistance in the development of an
- 22 Internet website which is to be used to inform veterans of programs

- 1 and services available to them through the division department and
  2 the state and federal governments;
- (p) Delegate to all or any of his or her appointees,

  4 assistants or employees all powers and duties vested in the

  5 director secretary, except the power to sign and execute contracts

  6 and agreements, but the director secretary shall be responsible for

  7 the acts of his or her appointees, assistants and employees; and

  8 (q) Provide volunteers who will drive or transport Award

  9 grants, as he or she deems advisable, subject to available

  10 appropriations, for the purpose of supporting the transportation of

  11 veterans to veterans' hospitals from the veteran's home or local

  12 veterans' affairs assistance offices. and who shall be paid an
- 14 §9A-1-11. Establishment of veterans facilities support fund;
  15 authorized expenditures.

13 expense per diem of seventy-five dollar.

There is hereby created continued in the State Treasury a 17 special revenue fund to be designated and known as the Veterans 18 Facilities Support Fund and shall be administered by the secretary. 19 All interest or other returns earned on the investment of the 20 moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Funds paid into 21 the account shall be derived from the following sources: (1) Any 22 gift, grant, bequest, endowed fund or donation which may be

1 received by any veterans facility created by statute from any 2 governmental entity or unit or any person, firm, foundation or 3 corporation; and (2) all interest or other return on investment 4 accruing to the fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used for the 5 operational costs of any veterans facility created by statute, the 6 acquisition, design, construction, equipping, furnishing, 7 including, without limitation, the payment of debt service on bonds 8 issued to finance the foregoing and/or as otherwise designated or 9 specified by the donor. Any balance, including accrued interest or 10 other earnings, in this special fund at the end of any fiscal year 11 shall not revert to the General Revenue Fund but shall remain in 12 the fund. Funds from the Veterans Facility Support Fund for 13 operational costs will be distributed by appropriation of the 14 Legislature. Funds from the veterans facility support fund for the 15 acquisition, design, construction, equipping, furnishing, 16 including, without limitation, the payment of debt service on bonds 17 issued to finance the veterans nursing home shall be transferred to 18 the veterans nursing home building fund upon written request of the 19 director of the division of Veterans Affairs to the Investment 20 Management Board and the state Treasurer in accordance with the 21 provisions of this section.

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22 §9A-1-12. Legal assistance.

- 1 The Attorney General of the state and his or her assistants,
- 2 and the prosecuting attorneys of the various counties, shall render
- 3 to the Veterans' Council or director secretary, without additional
- 4 compensation, such legal services as may be required in the
- 5 discharge of the provisions of this article.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide consistent use of terms in the existing statutes governing the provision of assistance to veterans through the Department of Veteran's Assistance, to remove obsolete or superseded language, and to clarify and provide additional power and authority to the Department's Secretary.
