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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$19-23-10$ of the Code of West Virginia,	
11	1931, as amended, relating to distributing money that was set	
12	aside from the West Virginia Greyhound Breeder Development	
13	Fund for two dog training track facilities to West Virginia	
14	residents who had earnings from the West Virginia Greyhound	
15	Breeder Development Fund during the period of 1996 through	
16	2001.	
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
18	That §19-23-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
20	ARTICLE 23. HORSE AND DOG RACING.	
21	<pre>§19-23-10. Daily license tax; pari-mutuel pools tax; how taxes</pre>	
22	paid; alternate tax; credits.	
23	(a) Any racing association conducting thoroughbred racing at	

1 any horse racetrack in this state shall pay each day upon which 2 horse races are run a daily license tax of \$250. Any racing 3 association conducting harness racing at any horse racetrack in 4 this state shall pay each day upon which horse races are run a 5 daily license tax of \$150. Any racing association conducting dog 6 races shall pay each day upon which dog races are run a daily 7 license tax of \$150. In the event thoroughbred racing, harness 8 racing, dog racing, or any combination of the foregoing are 9 conducted on the same day at the same racetrack by the same racing 10 association, only one daily license tax in the amount of \$250 shall 11 be paid for that day. Any The daily license tax shall does not 12 apply to any local, county or state fair, horse show or 13 agricultural or livestock exposition at which horse racing is 14 conducted for not more than six days.

15 (b) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission 16 to conduct thoroughbred racing and permitting and conducting pari-17 mutuel wagering under the provisions of this article shall, in 18 addition to the daily license tax set forth in subsection (a) of 19 this section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission 20 deducted each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on 21 thoroughbred racing a tax calculated on the total daily 22 contribution of all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any and 23 every thoroughbred race meeting of the licensee licensed under the 24 provisions of this article. The tax, on the pari-mutuel pools

1 conducted or made each day during the months of January, February, 2 March, October, November and December, shall be calculated at four 3 tenths of one percent of the pool; and, on the pari-mutuel pools 4 conducted or made each day during all other months, shall be 5 calculated at one and four-tenths percent of the pool: Provided, 6 That out of the amount realized from the three tenths of one 7 percent decrease in the tax effective for fiscal year 1991 and 8 thereafter, which decrease correspondingly increases the amount of 9 commission retained by the licensee, the licensee shall annually 10 expend or dedicate: (I) One half of the realized amount for 11 capital improvements in its barn area at the track, subject to the 12 Racing Commission's prior approval of the plans for the 13 improvements; and (ii) the remaining one half of the realized 14 amount for capital improvements as the licensee may determine 15 appropriate at the track. The term "capital improvement" shall be 16 as defined by the Internal Revenue Code: Provided, however, That 17 any racing association operating a horse racetrack in this state 18 having an average daily pari-mutuel pool on horse racing of 19 \$280,000 or less per day for the race meetings of the preceding 20 calendar year shall, in lieu of payment of the pari-mutuel pool 21 tax, calculated as in this subsection, be permitted to conduct 22 pari-mutuel wagering at the horse racetrack on the basis of a daily 23 pari-mutuel pool tax fixed as follows: On the daily pari-mutuel 24 pool not exceeding \$300,000 the daily pari-mutuel pool tax shall be

1 \$1,000 plus the otherwise applicable percentage rate imposed by 2 this subsection of the daily pari-mutuel pool, if any, in excess of 3 \$300,000: Provided further, That upon the effective date of the 4 reduction of the daily pari-mutuel pool tax to \$1,000 from the 5 former \$2,000, the association or licensee shall daily deposit \$500 6 into the special fund for regular purses established by subdivision 7 (1), subsection (b), section nine of this article: And provided 8 further, That if an association or licensee qualifying for the 9 foregoing alternate tax conducts more than one racing performance, 10 each consisting of up to thirteen races in a calendar day, the 11 association or licensee shall pay both the daily license tax 12 imposed in subsection (a) of this section and the alternate tax in 13 this subsection for each performance: And provided further, That 14 a licensee qualifying for the foregoing alternate tax is excluded 15 from participation in the fund established by section thirteen-b of 16 this article: And provided further, That this exclusion shall does 17 not apply to any thoroughbred racetrack at which the licensee has 18 participated in the West Virginia Thoroughbred Development Fund for 19 more than four consecutive years prior to December 31, 1992.

(c) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission 21 to conduct harness racing and permitting and conducting pari-mutuel 22 wagering under the provisions of this article shall, in addition to 23 the daily license tax required under subsection (a) of this 24 section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission deducted

1 each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on harness 2 racing, as a tax, three percent of the first \$100,000 wagered, or 3 any part thereof; four percent of the next \$150,000; and five and 4 three-fourths percent of all over that amount wagered each day in 5 all pari-mutuel pools conducted or made at any and every harness 6 race meeting of the licensee licensed under the provisions of this 7 article.

(d) Any racing association licensed by the Racing Commission 8 9 to conduct dog racing and permitting and conducting pari-mutuel 10 wagering under the provisions of this article shall, in addition to 11 the daily license tax required under subsection (a) of this 12 section, pay to the Racing Commission, from the commission deducted 13 each day by the licensee from the pari-mutuel pools on dog racing, 14 as a tax, four percent of the first \$50,000 or any part thereof of 15 the pari-mutuel pools, five percent of the next \$50,000 of the 16 pari-mutuel pools, six percent of the next \$100,000 of the pari-17 mutuel pools, seven percent of the next \$150,000 of the pari-mutuel 18 pools, and eight percent of all over \$350,000 wagered each day: 19 Provided, That the licensee shall deduct daily from the pari-mutuel 20 tax an amount equal to one tenth of one percent of the daily pari-21 mutuel pools in dog racing in fiscal year 1990; fifteen hundredths 22 of one percent in fiscal year 1991; two tenths of one percent in 23 fiscal year one 1992; one quarter of one percent in fiscal year 24 1993; and three tenths of one percent in fiscal year 1994 and every

1 fiscal year thereafter after. The amounts deducted shall be paid 2 to the Racing Commission to be deposited by the Racing Commission 3 in a banking institution of its choice in a special account to be 4 known as "West Virginia Racing Commission-Special Account-West 5 Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund". The purpose of the 6 fund is to promote better breeding, training track facilities and 7 racing of greyhounds in the state through awards and purses to bona 8 fide resident registered greyhound owners of accredited West 9 Virginia whelped greyhounds. In order to participate and be 10 eligible to receive an award or purse through the fund, the 11 registered greyhound owner must have an appropriate license from 12 the Racing Commission to race in West Virginia. The registered 13 greyhound dam at the time of breeding must be wholly or solely 14 owned or leased by a bona fide resident or residents of West 15 Virginia. The accredited West Virginia whelped greyhound must be 16 wholly or solely owned by a bona fide resident or residents of this 17 state. To qualify as a bona fide resident of West Virginia, a 18 registered greyhound owner may not claim residency in any other 19 state. A registered greyhound owner must prove bona fide residency 20 by providing to the commission personal income tax returns filed in 21 the State of West Virginia for the most recent tax year and the 22 three previous tax years, has real or personal property in this 23 state on which the owner has paid real or personal property taxes 24 during the most recent tax year and the previous three tax years

1 and an affidavit stating that the owner claims no other state of 2 residency. The Racing Commission shall maintain a registry for 3 West Virginia bred greyhounds. The moneys shall be expended by the 4 Racing Commission for purses for stake races, training track 5 facilities, supplemental purse awards, administration, promotion 6 and educational programs involving West Virginia whelped dogs, 7 owned by residents of this state under rules promulgated by the The Racing Commission shall pay out of the 8 Racing Commission. 9 Greyhound Breeding Development Fund to each of the licensed dog 10 racing tracks the sum of \$75,000 for the fiscal year ending June 11 30, 1994. The licensee shall deposit the sum into the special fund 12 for regular purses established under the provisions of section nine 13 of this article. The funds shall be expended solely for the 14 purpose of supplementing regular purses under rules promulgated by 15 the Racing Commission.

16 Supplemental purse awards will be distributed as follows: 17 Supplemental purses shall be paid directly to the registered 18 greyhound owner of an accredited greyhound.

19 The registered greyhound owner of accredited West Virginia 20 whelped greyhounds that earn points at any West Virginia meet will 21 receive a bonus award calculated at the end of each month as a 22 percentage of the fund dedicated to the owners as purse 23 supplements, which shall be a minimum of fifty percent of the total 24 moneys deposited into the West Virginia Greyhound Breeding

1 Development Fund monthly.

2 The total amount of the fund available for the owners' awards 3 shall be distributed according to the ratio of points earned by an 4 accredited greyhound to the total amount earned in races by all 5 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds for that month as a 6 percentage of the funds dedicated to the owners' purse supplements. 7 The point value at all greyhound tracks shall be the same as 8 approved by the Racing Commission to be effective April 1, 2007. 9 The West Virginia Greyhound Owners and Breeders Association shall 10 submit a list of any additions or deletions to the registry of 11 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds on the first of each 12 month. The Racing Commission in order to participate in the 13 member of a particular association in order to participate in the

15 The registered greyhound owner of an accredited West Virginia 16 whelped greyhound shall file a purse distribution form with the 17 Racing Commission for a percentage of his or her dog's earnings to 18 be paid directly to the registered greyhound owner or owners of the 19 greyhound. Distribution shall be made on the fifteenth day of each 20 month for the preceding month's achievements.

In no event shall <u>may</u> points earned at a meet held at a track which did not make contributions to the West Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund out of the daily pool on the day the meet was held qualify or count toward eligibility for supplemental purse

1 awards.

2 Any balance in the purse supplement funds after all 3 distributions have been made for the year revert to the general 4 account of the fund for distribution in the following year: 5 Provided, That not more than \$2,000,000 from the balance in the 6 purse supplemental fund shall be used for the construction and 7 maintenance of two dog training track facilities if such be 8 approved by the Racing Commission: Provided, however, That not 9 more than \$1,000,000 may be allocated for the construction and 10 maintenance of each training track: Provided further, That both 11 training track facilities must be located in West Virginia. The 12 West Virginia Racing Commission shall be authorized to promulgate 13 rules governing dog training tracks: And provided further, That 14 the Racing Commission shall (1) provide a process in its rules for 15 competitive bidding of the construction or maintenance, or both, of 16 the training tracks, and (2) set standards to assure that only the 17 actual costs of construction and maintenance shall be paid out of 18 the foregoing fund. All money set aside under this paragraph for 19 two dog training facilities shall be distributed by the West 20 Virginia Racing Commission to those West Virginia residents who had 21 earnings from the West Virginia Greyhound Breeder Development Fund 22 during the period 1996 through 2001. The commission shall require 23 individuals requesting money under this paragraph to submit 24 substantiation of the amount of earnings through Internal Revenue

1 Service form 1099 or other relevant tax forms. The total amount of 2 money available shall be distributed according to the ratio of 3 dollars earned by an accredited greyhound to the total amount of 4 money plus interest set aside for training facilities. All money 5 shall be distributed by June 30, 2014.

In an effort to further promote the breeding of quality West Virginia whelped greyhounds, a bonus purse supplement shall be established in the amount of \$50,000 per annum, to be paid in equal quarterly installments of \$12,500 per quarter using the same method to calculate and distribute these funds as the regular supplemental purse awards. This bonus purse supplement is for three years only, commencing on July 1, 1993, and ending June 30, 1996. This money would come from the current existing balance in the Greyhound development Fund.

Each pari-mutuel greyhound track shall provide stakes races for accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds: *Provided*, That reach pari-mutuel track shall have one juvenile and one open stake race annually. Each pari-mutuel dog track shall provide at least provide at least restricted races for accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds per race card: *Provided*, *however*, That sufficient dogs rare available. To assure breeders of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds an opportunity to participate in the West Virginia Greyhound Breeding Development Fund the West Virginia Racing Commission by July 1, each year shall establish and announce

1 the minimum number of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds 2 that greyhound racing kennels at West Virginia dog tracks must have 3 on their racing active list during the calendar year following such 4 action. The minimum number may vary from dog track to dog track. 5 The minimum number shall be established after consultation with the 6 West Virginia Greyhound Owners and Breeders Association and kennel 7 owners and operators. Factors to be considered in establishing this 8 minimum number shall be are the number of individually registered 9 accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds whelped in the previous 10 two years, the number of all greyhounds seeking qualification at 11 each West Virginia dog track, the ratio of active running 12 greyhounds to housed number of greyhounds at each West Virginia dog 13 track and the size and number of racing kennels at each West 14 Virginia dog track. Any greyhound racing kennel not having the 15 minimum number of accredited West Virginia whelped greyhounds 16 determined by the West Virginia Racing Commission on their active 17 list shall is only be permitted to race the maximum allowable 18 number on the active list less the number of accredited West 19 Virginia whelped greyhounds below the established minimum number. 20 Consistent violations of this minimum requirement may be reviewed 21 by the Racing Commission and may constitute be cause for denial or 22 revocation of a kennel's racing license. The Racing Commission 23 shall oversee and approve racing schedules and purse amounts.

24 Ten percent of the deposits into the Greyhound Breeding

1 Development Fund beginning July 1, 1993 and continuing each year 2 thereafter, after, shall be withheld by the Racing Commission and 3 placed in a special revenue account hereby created in the State 4 Treasury called the "Administration, Promotion and Educational and 5 Capital Improvement Account". The Racing Commission is authorized 6 to expend the moneys deposited in the Administration, Promotion and 7 Educational and Capital Improvement Account at such times and in 8 such amounts as the commission determines to be necessary for 9 purposes of administering and promoting the greyhound development 10 program: Provided, That beginning with fiscal year 1995 and in 11 each fiscal year thereafter after in which the commission 12 anticipates spending any money from the account, the commission 13 shall submit to the executive department during the budget 14 preparation period prior to the Legislature convening before that 15 fiscal year for inclusion in the executive budget document and 16 budget bill, the recommended expenditures, as well as requests of 17 appropriations for the purpose of administration, promotion and 18 education. The commission shall make an annual report to the 19 Legislature on the status of the administration, promotion and 20 education account, including the previous year's expenditures and 21 projected expenditures for the next year.

The Racing Commission, for the fiscal year 1994 only, may expend up to \$35,000 from the West Virginia greyhound breeding development fund to accomplish the purposes of this section without

## 1 strictly following the requirements in the previous paragraph.

2 (e) All daily license and pari-mutuel pools tax payments 3 required under the provisions of this section shall be made to the 4 Racing Commission or its agent after the last race of each day of 5 each horse or dog race meeting, and the pari-mutuel pools tax 6 payments shall be made from all contributions to all pari-mutuel 7 pools to each and every race of the day.

8 (f) Every association or licensee subject to the provisions of 9 this article, including the changed provisions of sections nine and 10 ten of this article, shall annually submit to the Racing Commission 11 and the Legislature financial statements, including a balance 12 sheet, income statement, statement of change in financial position 13 and an audit of any electronic data system used for pari-mutuel 14 tickets and betting, prepared in accordance with generally accepted 15 auditing standards, as certified by an experienced public 16 accountant or a certified public accountant.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to distribute money that was set aside from the West Virginia Greyhound Breeder Development Fund for two dog training track facilities to West Virginia residents who had earnings from the West Virginia Greyhound Breeder Development Fund for the period 1996 through 2001, since is not economically feasible to construct and maintain two dog training track facilities.
