21	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
22	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by repealing §30-27-11a and
23	$\S 30\text{-}27\text{-}12; that \ \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}1, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}2, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}3, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}4, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}5, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}6, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}8, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}8a, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}4, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}6, \S 30\text{-}27\text{-}8a, \S 30\text{-}27$
24	§30-27-10, §30-27-11 and §30-27-16 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that said code be

27	CHAPTER 30. PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.

ARTICLE 27. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS.

§30-27-1. Unlawful acts.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice barbering, barber permanent waving, cosmetology, or hair styling, aesthetics, or nail care in this state without a license issued under the provisions of this article, or advertise or use any title or description tending to convey the impression that the person is a licensed aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent wavist, cosmetologist, cosmetologist crossover or nail technician or hairstylist, unless the person has been licensed under the provisions of this article, and the license has not expired, been suspended or revoked.
- (b) No salon, except through a licensee, may render any service or engage in any activity which if rendered or engaged in by an individual, would constitute the practices licensed under the provisions of this article.
- (c) No school, except through a licensee, may instruct, render any service or engage in any activity which if taught, rendered or engaged in by an individual, would constitute the practices licensed under the provisions of this article.

§30-27-2. Applicable law.

The practices licensed <u>or registered</u> under the provisions of this article and the board of Barbers and Cosmetologists are subject to the provisions of article one of this chapter, the provisions of this article, and any rules promulgated hereunder.

§30-27-3. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following words and terms have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- (a) "Aesthetics" or "esthetics" means any one or any combination of the following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
- (1) Administering cosmetic treatments to enhance or improve the appearance of the skin, including cleansing, toning, performing effluence or other related movements, stimulating,

exfoliating or performing any other similar procedure on the skin of the human body or scalp;

- (2) Applying, by hand or with a mechanical or electrical apparatus, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders, clays, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations necessary for the practice of aesthetics to another person's face, neck, back, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and including the knee;
- (3) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or grooming of another person's face, neck, back, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and including the knee;
 - (4) The waxing, tweezing and threading of hair on another person's body;
 - (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body wrap;
 - (6) Applying artificial eyelashes and eyebrows; and

- (7) The lightening of hair on the body except the scalp.
- (b) "Aesthetician" or "esthetician" means a person licensed under the provisions of this article who engages in the practice of aesthetics.
- (c) "Applicant" means a person making application for a professional license, license, certificate, registration, permit or renewal under the provisions of this article.
- (d) "Barber" means a person licensed under the provisions of this article who engages in the practice of barbering and has completed 1500 clock hours of training at a licensed school approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education.
- (e) "Barbering" means any one or any combination of the following acts when done on the human body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
 - (1) Shaving, shaping and trimming the beard, or both;
- (2) Cutting, singeing, shampooing, arranging, dressing, tinting, bleaching, or applying lotions or tonics on human hair, or a wig or hairpiece; and
- (3) Applications, treatments or rubs of the scalp, face, or neck with oils, creams, lotions, cosmetics, antiseptics, powders, or other preparations in connection with the shaving, cutting or trimming of the hair or beard.

1	(f) "Barber crossover" or "cosmetologist crossover" is a person who is licensed to perform
2	barbering and cosmetology. who has completed 1500 clock hours of training, is licensed as a barber,
3	and completes an additional 600 hours of training to perform cosmetology
4	(g) "Barber permanent waving" means the following acts done on the human body for
5	compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
6	(1) The bleaching or tinting of hair; and
7	(2) The permanent waving of hair.
8	(h) "Barber permanent wavist" means a person licensed to perform barbering and barber
9	permanent waving.
10	(i) (g) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists.
11	(j) (h)"Certificate" means an instructor certificate to teach in a school under the provisions
12	of this article a document issued by the Board for additional training received through a school
13	licensed in this state or through an industry recognized program.
14	(k) "Certificate holder" means a person certified as an instructor to teach in a school under
15	the provisions of this article.
16	(1) (i)-"Cosmetologist" means a person licensed under the provisions of this article who
17	engages in the practice of cosmetology and who has completed 1800 clock hours of training at a
18	licensed school approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College
19	Education.
20	(m) (j) "Cosmetology" means any one or any combination of the following acts when done
21	on the human body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
22	(1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding, weaving, dressing, adding extensions,
23	curling, waving, permanent waving, relaxing, straightening, shampooing, cleansing, singeing,
24	bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing, tweezing, or similarly work on human hair, or a wig or
25	hairpiece, by any means, including hands, mechanical or electrical devices or appliances;
26	(2) Nail care;

(3)	Applying by hand or with a mechanical or electrical device or appliance, any cosmetics,
makeups,	oils, powders, clays, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations necessary

11	(t) (s) "Licensee" means a person, corporation or firm holding a license issued under the
12	provisions of this article.
13	(u) (t) "Nail care" means any one or any combination of the following acts when done on the
14	human body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:
15	(1) The cleansing, dressing, or polishing of nails of a person;
16	(2) Performing artificial nail service; and
17	(3) The cosmetic treatment of the feet up to the knee and the hands up to the elbow.

23	crossover, barber permanent wavist, cosmetologist, cosmetologist crossover or nail technician hair

25	$\frac{(z)}{(y)}$ "Registration" means a registration issued by the board to a person who rents or leases
26	a booth or chair from a licensed salon owner and operator, or both, or a registration issued by the

1	board to a person who is a student in a school or a registration issued to an aesthetician or nail
2	technician pursuant to section eight-b or this article.
3	(aa)(z)"Registrant" means a person who holds a registration under the provisions of this
4	article.
5	(bb)(aa) "Salon" means a shop or other facility where a person practices under a professional
6	license.
7	(ce)(bb)"Salon license" means a license to own and operate a salon.
8	(dd) "Student registration" means a registration issued by the board to a student to study at
9	a school licensed under the provisions of this article.
10	(cc) "Shampoo assistant" means a person who performs only the following services:
11	(1) Shampooing and rinsing hair;
12	(2) Removing rollers or permanent rods; and
13	(3) Cleansing or other sink-related functions not requiring the skill of a basic barber.
14	§30-27-4. Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists.
15	(a) The West Virginia Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists is continued. The members of
16	the board in office on July 1, 2014 <u>2015</u> , shall, unless sooner removed, continue to serve until their
17	respective terms expire and until their successors have been appointed and qualified.
18	(b) The Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint:
19	(1) One licensed cosmetologist or crossover cosmetologist;
20	(2) One licensed barber or barber crossover;
21	(3) One licensed barber crossover or licensed barber permanent wavist;
22	(4) One licensed aesthetician;
23	(5) One licensed nail technician;
24	(6) One representative from a privately owned beauty school licensed by the West Virginia
25	Council for Community and Technical College Education; and
26	(7) One Four citizen members representing the general public.

(c) After the initial appointment term, the term shall be for five years. All appointments to the board shall be made by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

- (d) Each licensed member of the board, at the time of his or her appointment, must have held a professional license in this state for a period of not less than three years immediately preceding the appointment.
 - (e) Each member of the board must be a resident of this state during the appointment term.
- (f) A member may not serve more than two consecutive full terms. A member may continue to serve until a successor has been appointed and has qualified. A member serving on the board on June 30, 2014 2015, may be reappointed in accordance with the provisions of this section.
- (g) A vacancy on the board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the unexpired term of the member whose office is vacant and the appointment shall be made within sixty days of the vacancy.
- (h) The Governor may remove any member from the board for neglect of duty, incompetency e or official misconduct.
- (i) A member of the board immediately and automatically forfeits membership to the board if his or her license to practice is suspended or revoked, is convicted of a felony under the laws of any jurisdiction or becomes a nonresident of this state.
- (j) The board shall elect annually one of its members as chairperson who serves at the will of the board.
- (k) Each member of the board is entitled to compensation and expense reimbursement in accordance with article one of this chapter.
 - (1) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum.
- (m) The board shall hold at least two annual meetings. Other meetings may be held at the call of the chairperson or upon the written request of two members, at the time and place as designated in the call or request.
 - (n) Prior to commencing his or her duties as a member of the board, each member shall take

1 and subscribe to the oath required by section five, article four of the Constitution of this state. 2 §30-27-5. 10	§30-27-6. Rulemaking.
11	(a) The board shall propose rules for legislative approval, in accordance with article three,
12	chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, to implement the provisions of this article, including:
13	(1) Standards and requirements for licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;
14	(2) Procedures for examinations and reexaminations: Provided, That the board shall offer
15	examinations in all languages other than English if available to the board and requested by the

16	§30-27-8. Professional license requirements.
17	(a) An applicant for a professional license to practice as a aesthetician, barber, barber
18	crossover, barber permanent wavist, cosmetologist, or hair stylist, cosmetologist crossover or nail
19	technician shall present satisfactory evidence that he or she:
20	(1) Is at least eighteen years of age;
21	(2) Is of good moral character;
22	(3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the "ability to benefit test" approved
23	by the United States Department of Education;
24	(4) Has graduated from a licensed school which has been approved by the West Virginia
25	Council for Community and Technical College Education or has completed education requirements
26	in another state and meets the licensure provisions of the board;

(5) Has passed an examination that tests the applicant's knowledge of subjects specified by the board: Provided, That the board may recognize a certificate or similar license in lieu of the examination or part of the examination that the board requires: Provided further, That any examination shall meet national standards; (6) Has paid the applicable fee; (7) Presents a certificate of health from a licensed physician; (8) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for employment in the United States; and (9) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the board. (b) A license to practice issued by the board prior to July 1, 2009 2015, shall for all purposes be considered a professional license issued under this article: *Provided*. That a person holding a license issued prior to July 1, 2009 2015, must renew the license pursuant to the provisions of this article. After July 1, 2015, the Board shall issue both barber and cosmetologist renewal licenses in the case of a barber crossover or cosmetologist crossover and shall issue a barber license renewal in the case of barber permanent wavist. §30-27-8a. Barber apprentice (a) The board may establish an apprenticeship program to become a barber. A person wishing to become a barber through an apprenticeship shall apply with the board and receive a permit. A barber apprentice shall work at all times under the direct supervision of a licensed barber and any permit issued by the board to work as a barber apprentice does not allow a person to practice individually as a barber. (b) An applicant for a barber apprenticeship shall present satisfactory evidence that he or she: (1) Is at least eighteen years of age; (2) Is of good moral character; (3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the "ability to benefit test" approved

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by the United States Department of Education;

(4) Has paid the applicable fee;

1	(5) Has a certificate of health from a licensed physician; and
2	(6) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for employment in the United States; and.
3	(7) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the board.
4	(c) An applicant for a sponsor of a barber apprentice shall present satisfactory evidence that
5	he or she:
6	(1) Is licensed as a barber under the provisions of this article;
7	(2) Has paid the applicable fee; and
8	(3) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the board.
9	(c) A sponsor of a barber apprentice shall be a licensed barber with at least five years
10	experience.
11	(d) A barber apprentice program shall consist of up to two years of supervised training by a
12	sponsor who shall advise the board in writing that the barber apprentice is ready to take the
13	examination for licensure; Provided, that at the end of two years of supervised training, a barber
14	apprentice may take the examination for licensure without the recommendation of the sponsor.
15	(d) The board may propose emergency rules and rules for legislative approval, in accordance
16	with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code, to implement the provisions
17	of this section, including:
18	(1) The requirements for:
19	(A) The barber apprenticeship program;
20	(B) The barber apprentice permit; and
21	(C) A licensed barber to sponsor a barber apprentice;

25	§30-27-8b. Registration of Aestheticians and Nail Technicians.
26	(a) A person may not advertise or represent himself or herself as an aesthetician or nail

2	(b) To be eligible for registration by the board as an aesthetician or nail technician, an
3	applicant shall present satisfactory evidence that he or she:
4	(1) Is at least eighteen years of age;
5	(2) Is of good moral character;
6	(3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the "ability to benefit test" approved
7	by the United States Department of Education;
8	(4) Has graduated from a licensed school which has been approved by the West Virginia

11	(5) Has paid the applicable fee;

14	§30-27-8c. Certifications
15	(a) The Board shall issue a certification to an applicant licensed under this article who obtains
16	additional training at a licensed school that has been approved by the West Virginia Council for
17	Community and Technical College Education or an industry recognized training program in the
18	following areas:
19	(1) Waxing;
20	(2) Permanent waving;
21	(3) Barber crossover;
22	(4) Cosmetology crossover;
23	(5) Hairstylist crossover;
24	§30-27-8d. Shampoo Assistant and Hair Braiding; exemptions from licensure.
25	(a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code, a person may practice hair braiding without
26	obtaining a license or any other authorization from a professional board of this state and is not

- subject to educational or training requirements. A person practicing hair braiding may work at or be employed by a salon or other place of business or may practice hair braiding individually.
- (b) Notwithstanding any provision of this code, a shampoo assistant is not required to obtain a permit or any other authorization from a professional board of this state and is not subject to education or training requirements. A shampoo assistant may work at or be employed by a salon or other place of business or may practice individually as a shampoo assistant.
- (c) Notwithstanding any provision of this code, the board has no authority to propose legislative rules to implement the provisions of this section or to exercise any jurisdiction or authority over the practice of or any shampoo assistant or acts of hair braiding or the qualifications for a person to practice hair braiding.

§30-27-10. Professional license and certificate renewal requirements.

- (a) A professional licensee and certificate holder shall annually or biennially on or before January 1, renew his or her professional license or certificate by completing a form prescribed by the board, paying the renewal fee and submitting any other information required by the board.
- (b) The board shall charge a fee for each renewal of a license or certificate, and a late fee for any renewal not paid by the due date.
- (c) The board shall require as a condition of renewal of a professional license or certificate that each licensee or certificate holder complete continuing education: *Provided*, That a <u>licensed</u> barber who has been licensed for twenty years or more is exempt from the continuing education requirement of this subsection <u>except</u>, beginning January 1, 2016, licensed barbers must take a sanitation course through a program approved by the board each year for the first five years after becoming licensed and once every five years thereafter for fifteen years; *Provided*, *however*, That cosmetologists and hair stylists must take four hours of continuing education training annually for the first fifteen years after becoming licensed; *Provided further*, That the Board shall approve for credit for continuing education any education course providing instruction in any curriculum, subject matter or discipline included in the education required for licensure that is submitted to the board

I	or offered by:
2	(1) A licensed school or instructor;
3	(2) A manufacturer or distributor of barbering or cosmetology products;
4	(3) A barber or cosmetology trade organization; or
5	(4) Any course offered at an accredited private or public university, college or community
6	college in this state.
7	(d) The board may deny an application for renewal for any reason which would justify the
8	denial of an original application for a license or certificate.
9	§30-27-11. Work permit.
10	(a) The board may issue a work permit to practice to an applicant who meets the following
11	conditions:
12	(1) Has graduated from a licensed school approved by the West Virginia Council for
13	Community and Technical College Education or has completed education requirements in another
14	state and meets the licensure provisions of the board;
15	(2) Is waiting to take the examination;
16	(3) Has employment in the field in which he or she applied to take the examination and is
17	working under the general supervision of a professional licensee;
18	(4) Has paid the work permit fee;
19	(5) Has presented a certificate of health issued by a licensed physician;
20	(6) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for employment in the United States; and
21	(7) Meets all the other requirements specified by the board.
22	(b) A work permit expires at the end of the month after issuance following the next
23	examination in the specific field. A work permit may be renewed once.
24	(c) While in effect, a work permitee is subject to the restrictions and requirements imposed
25	by this article.
26	§30-27-13. Display of professional license and permits.

1	(a) The board shall prescribe the form for a professional license and work and student
2	permits, including a photograph, and may issue a duplicate license or permit, upon payment of a fee.
3	(b) Every professional licensee and work permitee shall display his or her license or permit
4	in a conspicuous place at his or her work station.
5	(c) Every student shall have available his or her student permit and be able to produce it upon
6	request.
7	(d) (c) Every professional licensee, work permitee or student must present such license,
8	permit or registration to an investigator/inspector or a board member upon request.
9	§30-27-16. Certification requirements to be an instructor in a school.
10	(a) The board may issue a certificate to be an instructor in a school to an applicant who meets
11	the following requirements:
12	(1) Meets the educational requirements established by the board;
13	(2) Has completed the required instructor's training;
14	(3) Has passed the instructor examination;
15	(4) Has paid the appropriate fees;
16	(5) Presents a certificate of health from a licensed physician;
17	(6) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for employment in the United States; and
18	(7) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the board.
19	(a) The Board shall issue a certificate to be an instructor in a school for barbering,
20	cosmetology, hairstyling, nail technician or aesthetics if a person:
21	(1) Completes an application prescribed by the Board;
22	(2) Holds a current West Virginia license in the field in which the person seeks to teach or
23	equivalent from another state as determined by the Board;
24	(3) Completes a one year instructor training course in a school that is licensed by the West
25	Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education;
26	(4) Passes the instructor training final examination; and

1	(5) Passes a national written examination in instructor training.
2	(b) All instructor certifications must be renewed annually or biennially on or before January
3	1, and pay a renewal fee.
4	(c) A certification to be an instructor issued by the board prior to January 1, 2009, the
5	effective date of this section shall for all purposes be considered a certification issued under thi
6	article: <i>Provided</i> , That a person holding a certification issued prior to January 1, 2009, the effective
7	date of this section must renew the certification pursuant to the provisions of this article.
8	(d) An instructor with an expired certificate must comply with the following to renew his o
9	her certificate:
10	(1) Notify the board that he or she wants to be placed on inactive status; or
11	(2) Pay all lapsed renewal fees;
12	(3) Present a new certificate of health; and
13	(4) Meet the qualifications for certification set out in this article.
14	(e) A certified instructor is not required to have an active professional license, unless the

instructor is in fact practicing outside the scope of his or her employment as an instructor.
