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10	A BILL to amend and reenact §18-5-18a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating	
11	to permitting a salary increase for kindergarten aides and early childhood classroom assistant	
12	teachers who have more than twenty pupils per session.	
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
14	That §18-5-18a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted	
15	to read as follows:	
16	ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.	
17	§18-5-18a. Maximum teacher-pupil ratio.	
18	County boards of education shall provide, by the school year 1983-84, and thereafter,	
19	sufficient personnel, equipment and facilities as will ensure that each first and second grade	
20	classroom, or classrooms having two or more grades that include either the first or second grades	
21	shall not have more than twenty-five pupils for each teacher of the grade or grades and shall not have	
22	more than twenty pupils for each kindergarten teacher per session, unless the state superintendent	

23 has excepted a specific classroom upon application therefor by a county board.

1 County boards shall provide by the school year 1984-85, and continue thereafter, sufficient 2 personnel, equipment and facilities as will ensure that each third, fourth, fifth and sixth grade 3 classroom, or classrooms having two or more grades that include one or more of the third, fourth, 4 fifth and sixth grades, shall not have more than twenty-five pupils for each teacher of the grade or 5 grades.

6 Beginning with the school year 1986-87, and thereafter, no county shall maintain a greater 7 number of classrooms having two or more grades that include one or more of the grade levels 8 referred to in this section than were in existence in said county as of January 1, 1983: *Provided*, That 9 for the prior school years, and only if there is insufficient classroom space available in the school or 10 county, a county may maintain one hundred ten percent of such the number of classrooms.

During the school year 1984-85, and thereafter, the state superintendent is authorized, consistent with sound educational policy: (a)To permit on a statewide basis, in grades four through six, more than twenty-five pupils per teacher in a classroom for the purposes of instruction in physical education; and (b) to permit more than twenty pupils per teacher in a specific kindergarten classroom and twenty-five pupils per teacher in a specific classroom in grades one through six during a school year in the event of extraordinary circumstances as determined by the state superintendent after application by a county board of education.

18 The state board shall establish guidelines for the exceptions authorized in this section, but 19 in no event shall may the superintendent except classrooms having more than three pupils above the 20 pupil-teacher ratio as set forth in this section.

21 The requirement for approval of an exception to exceed the twenty pupils per kindergarten22 teacher per session limit or the twenty-five pupils per teacher limit in grades one through six is

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1 waived in schools where the schoolwide pupil-teacher ratio is twenty-five or less in grades one through six: Provided, That a teacher shall may not have more than three pupils above the 2 teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section. Any kindergarten teacher, kindergarten aide and early 3 childhood classroom assistant teacher who has more than twenty pupils per session and any 4 classroom teacher of grades one through six who has more than twenty-five pupils shall be paid 5 additional compensation based on the affected classroom teacher's, kindergarten aide's or early 6 childhood classroom assistant teacher's average daily salary divided by twenty for kindergarten 7 teachers or the daily salary of kindergarten aide and early childhood classroom assistant teacher or 8 twenty-five for teachers of grades one through six for every day times the number of additional 9 pupils enrolled up to the maximum pupils permitted in the teacher's classroom. All such this 10 additional compensation shall be paid from county funds exclusively. 11

Notwithstanding any other provision of this section to the contrary, commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 1994, a teacher in grades one, two or three or classrooms having two or more such of these grade levels, shall not have more than two pupils above the teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section: *Provided*, That commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 1995, such the teacher shall not have more than one pupil above the teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section: *Provided*, however, That commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 1996, such the teacher shall not have any pupils above the teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section.

20 No provision of this section is intended to limit the number of pupils per teacher in a 21 classroom for the purpose of instruction in choral, band or orchestra music.

22 Each school principal shall assign students equitably among the classroom teachers, taking

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1 into consideration reasonable differences due to subject areas and/or grade levels.

The state board shall collect from each county board of education information on class size and the number of pupils per teacher for all classes in grades seven through twelve. The state board shall report such the information to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability before January 1, of each year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit a salary increase for kindergarten aides and early childhood classroom assistant teachers who have more than twenty pupils per session. The bill permits early childhood classroom assistant teachers to have the same type of salary increase as kindergarten teachers.
