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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article,
11	designated §16-46-1, §16-46-2, §16-46-3, §16-46-4 and §16-46-5, all relating to allowing
12	authorized entities to maintain a stock of epinephrine auto-injectors to be used for emergency
13	treatment during anaphylactic reactions.
14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
15	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
16	article, designated §16-46-1, §16-46-2, §16-46-3, §16-46-4 and §16-46-5, all to read as follows:
17	ARTICLE 46. EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR AVAILABILITY AND USE.
18	§16-46-1. Definitions.
19	As used in this article the term:
20	"Administer" means to directly apply an epinephrine auto-injector to the body of an
21	individual.
22	"Authorized entity" means an entity or organization at or in connection with which allergens
23	capable of causing a severe allergic reaction may be present. The term includes, but is not limited

- 1 to, hotels, restaurants, recreation camps, youth sports leagues, parks and resorts and sports arenas.
- 2 "Authorized health care practitioner" means an allopathic physician licensed to practice
- 3 pursuant to the provisions of article three, chapter thirty of this code and an osteopathic physician
- 4 <u>licensed to practice pursuant to the provisions of article fourteen, chapter thirty of this code.</u>
- 5 "Department" means the Department of Health and Human Resources.
- 6 "Epinephrine auto-injector" means a single-use device used for the automatic injection of a
- 7 premeasured dose of epinephrine into the human body.
- 8 "Self-administration" means an individual's discretionary administration of an epinephrine
- 9 auto-injector on herself or himself.

10 **§16-46-2.** Purpose; authority.

- 11 (a) The purpose of this article is to provide a way for lifesaving treatment to be made
- 12 available for persons who have severe allergic adverse reactions when a physician is not immediately
- 13 available by making epinephrine auto-injectors available.
- (b) The department may:
- 15 (1) Adopt interpretive and procedural rules and propose legislative rules for legislative
- 16 approval in accordance with the provisions of article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code,
- 17 necessary to administer this article;
- 18 (2) Conduct educational training programs as described in section three of this article, and
- 19 approve programs conducted by other persons or governmental agencies;
- 20 (3) Issue and renew certificates of training to persons who have complied with this article and
- 21 the department's rules;
- 22 (4) Impose and collect reasonable fees necessary to administer this article.

1 §16-46-3. Educational training programs; certificates.

- 2 (a) Educational training programs conducted under this article must be conducted by a
- 3 nationally recognized organization experienced in training laypersons in emergency health treatment
- 4 or an entity or individual approved by the department licensed to practice medicine in this state. The
- 5 curriculum must include at a minimum:
- 6 (1) Recognition of the symptoms of systemic reactions to food, insect stings and other
- 7 allergens; and
- 8 (2) The proper administration of an a subcutaneous injection of epinephrine auto-injector.
- 9 (b) A certificate of training may be given to a person who:
- 10 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;
- 11 (2) Has, or reasonably expects to have, responsibility for or contact with at least one other
- 12 person who has severe adverse reactions to insect stings as a result of his or her occupational or
- 13 volunteer status, including, but not limited to, a camp counselor, scout leader, school teacher, forest
- 14 ranger, tour guide or chaperone;
- 15 (3) Has successfully completed an educational training program as described in subsection
- 16 (a) of this section; and
- 17 (4) Pays the application fee imposed, if any.
- 18 (c) A certificate issued pursuant to this section authorizes the holder thereof to receive, upon
- 19 presentment of the certificate, from any physician licensed in this state or from the department, a
- 20 prescription for premeasured doses of epinephrine auto-injectors from an authorized health care
- 21 practitioner or the department and the necessary paraphernalia for administration. The certificate
- 22 also authorizes the holder to possess and administer, in an emergency situation when a physician is

- 1 not immediately available, to possess and administer a prescribed epinephrine auto-injector to a
- 2 person experiencing suffering a severe allergic adverse reaction to an insect sting.
- 3 §16-46-4. Prescriptive authority for epinephrine auto-injectors; emergency administration.
- 4 (a) An allopathic physician licensed to practice pursuant to the provisions of article three,
- 5 chapter thirty of this code or an osteopathic physician licensed to practice pursuant to the provisions
- 6 of article fourteen, chapter thirty of this code may prescribe within the course of his or her
- 7 professional practice standing orders and protocols for use when necessary by an authorized entity
- 8 designated by the department which wishes to maintain epinephrine auto-injector. Pharmacists may
- 9 dispense epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant to a prescription issued in the name of an authorized
- 10 entity.
- 11 (b) An authorized entity may acquire and stock a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors
- 12 pursuant to a prescription issued in accordance with this section. The epinephrine auto-injectors
- 13 must be stored in accordance with the epinephrine auto-injector's instructions for use and with any
- 14 additional requirements that may be established by the department. An authorized entity shall
- 15 designate employees or agents who hold a certificate issued pursuant to section three of this article
- 16 to be responsible for the storage, maintenance, and general oversight of epinephrine auto-injectors
- 17 acquired by the authorized entity.
- (c) An individual who holds a certificate issued pursuant to section three of this article may,
- 19 on the premises of or in connection with the authorized entity, use epinephrine auto-injectors
- 20 prescribed pursuant to subsection (a) of this section to:
- 21 (1) Provide an epinephrine auto-injector to a person who the certified individual in good faith
- 22 believes is experiencing a severe allergic reaction for that person's immediate self-administration,

- 1 regardless of whether the person has a prescription for an epinephrine auto-injector or has previously
- been diagnosed with an allergy; and
- 3 (2) Administer an epinephrine auto-injector to a person who the certified individual in good
- 4 faith believes is experiencing a severe allergic reaction, regardless of whether the person has a
- 5 prescription for an epinephrine auto-injector or has previously been diagnosed with an allergy.
- 6 (d) An authorized entity that acquires a stock supply of epinephrine auto-injectors pursuant
 - to a prescription issued by an authorized health care practitioner in accordance with this section may
- 8 make the auto-injectors available to individuals other than certified individuals identified in
- 9 subsection (c) of this section who may administer the auto-injector to a person believed in good faith
- 10 to be experiencing a severe allergic reaction if the epinephrine auto-injectors are stored in a locked,
- 11 secure container and are made available only upon remote authorization by an authorized health care
- 12 practitioner after consultation with the authorized health care practitioner by audio, televideo, or
- 13 other similar means of electronic communication. Consultation with an authorized health care
- 14 practitioner for this purpose is not considered the practice of telemedicine or otherwise construed
- 15 as violating any law or rule regulating the authorized health care practitioner's professional practice.

16 §16-46-5. Not practice of medicine; limits on liability.

- 17 (a) The administration of an epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with this section is not
- 18 the practice of medicine.
- 19 (b) Any authorized health care practitioner who prescribes epinephrine auto-injectors to an
- 0 authorized entity or to an individual that holds a certificate issued pursuant to section three of this
- 21 article; any authorized entity that possesses and makes available epinephrine auto-injectors; any
- 22 individual who holds a certificate issued pursuant to section three of this article; any noncertified

- 1 individual under subsection (d), section four of this article; and any person that conducts the training
- 2 under section three of this article is not liable for civil damages that result from the administration
- 3 or self-administration of an epinephrine auto-injector, the failure to administer an epinephrine auto-
- 4 <u>injector</u>, or any other act or omission committed, in good faith, pursuant to this section or section
- 5 three of this article.
- 6 (c) An authorized entity doing business in this state is not liable for injuries or related
- 7 damages that result from the provision or administration of an epinephrine auto-injector by its
- 8 employees or agents outside this state if the entity or its employees or agents would not have been
- 9 liable for such injuries or related damages had the provision or administration occurred within this
- 10 state, or would not have been liable under the law of the state in which such provision or
- 11 administration occurred.
- 12 (d) An individual employed by an authorized entity who administers an epinephrine auto-
- 13 injection to a person as provided in this section is immune from liability for any civil action arising
- 14 out of an act or omission resulting from the administration of the epinephrine auto-injection unless
- 15 the act or omission was the result of the individual's gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- 16 (e) This section does not eliminate, limit, or reduce any other immunity or defense that may
- 17 be available under state law, including the immunity provided under section fifteen, article seven
- 18 chapter fifty-five of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to allow authorized entities to maintain a stock of epinephrine auto-injectors to be used for emergency treatment during anaphylactic reactions.

This article is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
