- (4) The governing body of a municipality located within a county participating in the
 Hatfield-McCoy recreational trail project may regulate in any manner the use of unlicensed off-road
 motorcycles operated in compliance with legislative rules promulgated by the Hatfield-McCoy
 Regional Recreation Authority upon any street, road or avenue within the municipal corporate limits.

 (5) The county commission of a county participating in the Hatfield-McCoy recreational trail
 project may regulate in any manner the use of unlicensed off-road motorcycles operated in
 compliance with legislative rules promulgated by the Hatfield-McCoy Regional Recreation Authority
 when traveling to and from a Hatfield-McCoy trailhead to a place for fuel, service, food or lodging
 on any road in the county, except interstate highways: *Provided*, That any county which enacts any
 such ordinance shall notify the West Virginia State Police and all law-enforcement agencies in the
 county of its action in writing, together with a copy of the ordinance.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the regulation of unlicensed off road motorcycles upon public streets, roads and highways by municipalities and counties within the Hatfield-McCoy recreation area. The current code allows cities and counties to permit and regulate all-terrain vehicles upon public streets, roads and highways, but not unlicensed off-road motorcycles. The amendment would allow municipalities and counties within the Hatfield McCoy recreation area to permit and regulate unlicensed off-road motorcycles upon public streets, roads and highways, but only if they are properly permitted by the Hatfield-McCoy Regional Recreation Authority.
