Posthumous high school diplomas for parents of certain students. 17 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, but subject to subsection (b) 18 of this section, on the request of the parent or parents of a deceased student who died while enrolled 19 in the school district at grade level twelve, the state board shall provide for the awarding of a 20 posthumous high school diploma: *Provided*, That the student was academically eligible, at the time 21 of death, to receive a diploma at the end of the school year in which the student died. For the

- 1 purposes of this section, "school year" includes any summer session following the spring semester.
- 2 (b) A school district is not required to issue a high school diploma to a student described in
- 3 subsection (a) if the student was, at any time before the death of the student, convicted of a criminal
- 4 offense or adjudicated as having engaged in conduct constituting a felony offense.
- 5 (c) This section shall be known as "Todd's Law".
